
Westerland Climbing Rose

Rosa 'Westerland'

- <u>Use</u>: Create a warm, welcoming look in your garden with this beloved climbing rose. Its light apricot-orange, semi-double flowers have a pleasant spicy, rose fragrance—and they attract butterflies and pollinators. Growing 10-12 ft. tall with a similar spread, it looks impressive when climbing a trellis, wall or fence. Like other climbing roses, Westerland is a good choice for adding height and dramatic interest to landscapes. A vigorous rose, it'll quickly transform unsightly fences and walls in spectacular garden focal points. Blooms from late spring to fall.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full to part sun. They must have well-drained soils, so if you have red clay you must amend it. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Keep water off the leaves (no sprinklers/ don't water leaves.)
- <u>Growth</u>: It can be grown as a climber; trained against a wall, up a pillar or through an obelisk; or even grown as a tall hedge. Left alone, it grows to about 8 -12 feet high by 8 feet wide.
- *Hardiness: Zone* 5-9 Climber or tall hedge.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Her reputation is based on terrific fragrance, glossy green highly disease-resistant foliage.
- <u>Flower:</u> Magnificent, large, fragrant, well formed 5" blooms (petals 20-25) of apricot, copper-orange on a bushy, vigorous, upright continual blooming plant with bronze-green foliage. A truly outstanding shrub rose! Marvelous fragrance. Repeat blooming.
