McDONALD, JOHN, businessman, justice of the peace, office holder, and politician.

In 1815, he settled in Gananoque and gradually built up a prosperous lumbering business. He was owner of the Gananoque Mills producing 160 barrels of flour a day. As his business grew, McDonald became interested in the various schemes for canal improvements, he was involved in navigation projects and the construction of a series of locks and dams on the Gananoque River to make it navigable for commercial shipping.

He received his first commission as a justice of the peace in 1828 when, as well, he was appointed postmaster for Gananoque, a position which carried with it the free mailing privileges of value to his business. During the general election of 1836 he was a deputy returning officer for Leeds County. In 1838 he became commissioner of the Court of Requests. In 1839, McDonald received his first political appointment, to the Legislative Council under Lieutenant Governor Sir George Arthur.

Item 560-01 – **Hon. John McDonald Gananoque UC** – 1844, Honorable John McDonald letter signed, Gananoque Postmaster and businessmen, paid 4½ to Brockville. The letter is of legal and account nature addressed to Sir William Buell Richards. McDonald was businessman, justice of the peace, Postmaster and politician. Interestingly, McDonald did not use the free franking privilege that he had. \$200.00 **SOLD**

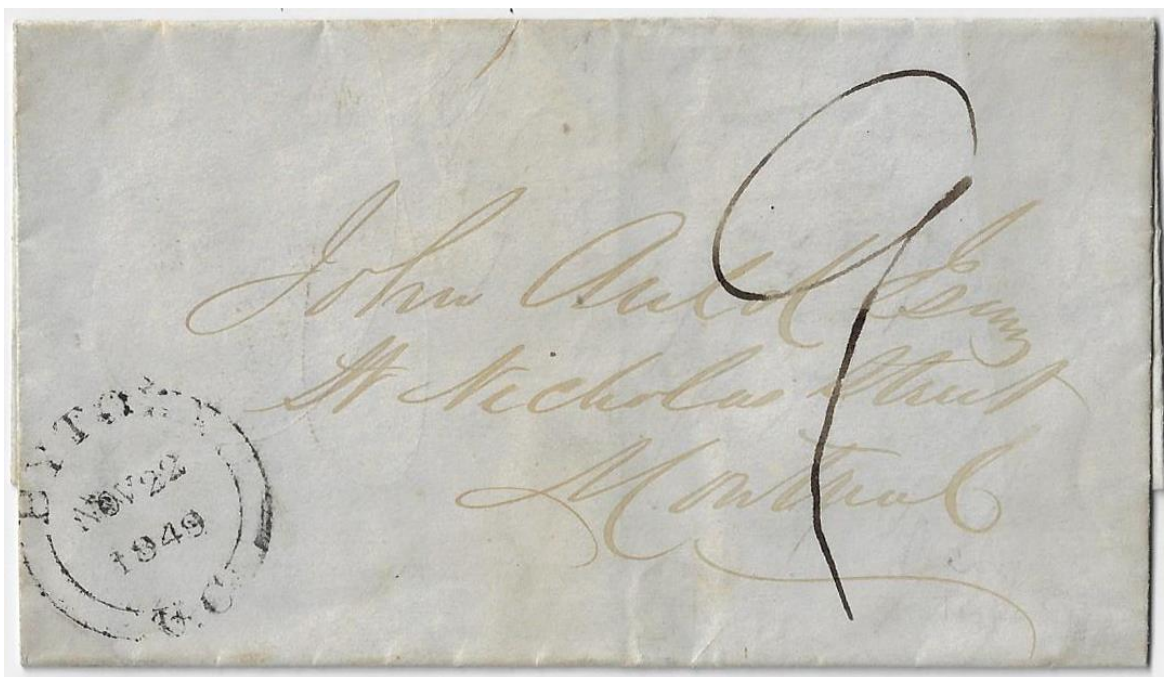

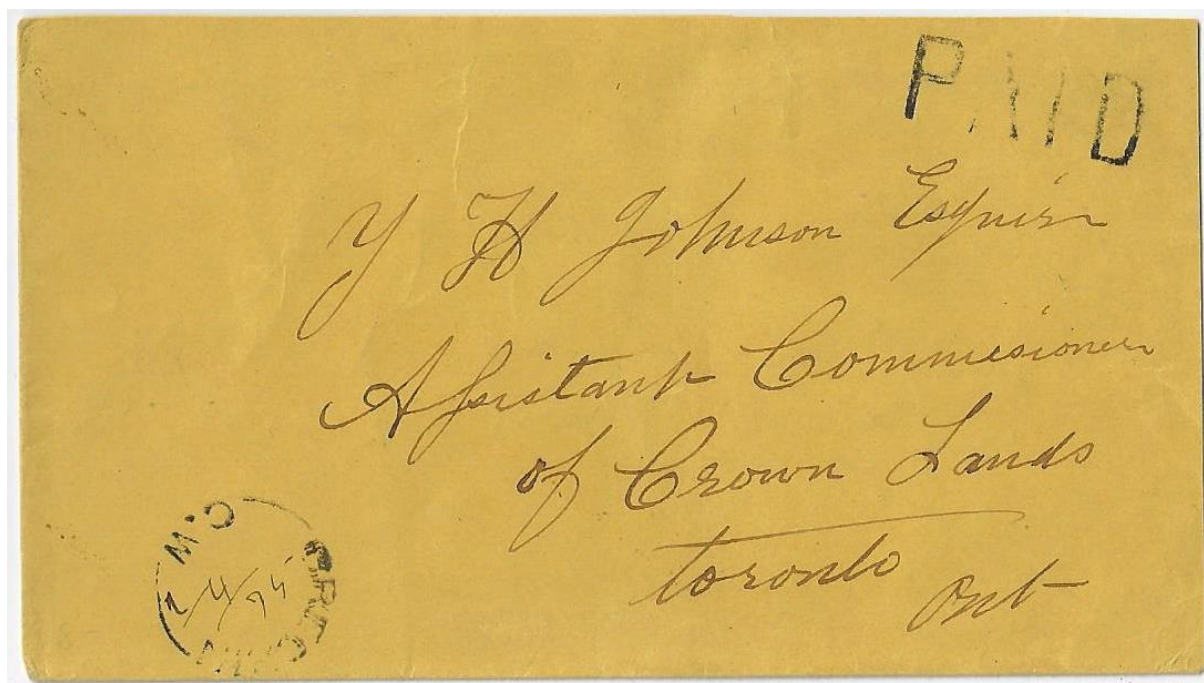

Item 560-05 – **Bond Head UC (forged signature)** – 1845, folded letter from Bond Head UC, datelined Innisfil SE 18 45, William Coleman signed, rated 4½d collect to Toronto (City of Toronto b/s). The letter is of legal nature and reads in part: *I never authorized any person to sign my name to a promissory note without putting my mark there to in the presence of witness and that a note to be mine in your hands is a forgery.* This Bond Head UC with ms date is one of the nicest strikes I have seen, is the current latest recorded date by 2 years and its content is somewhat interesting and unusual. Dennis to Sir William Buell Richards and relates to going to jail, a suit, bail and borrow money. This Beverley UC postmark with ms date, spelling with E, is the 2nd recorded example and LRD of the two. OC 31 46 to 14 NO 43. A rare Leeds County office, closed in 1856. \$350.00

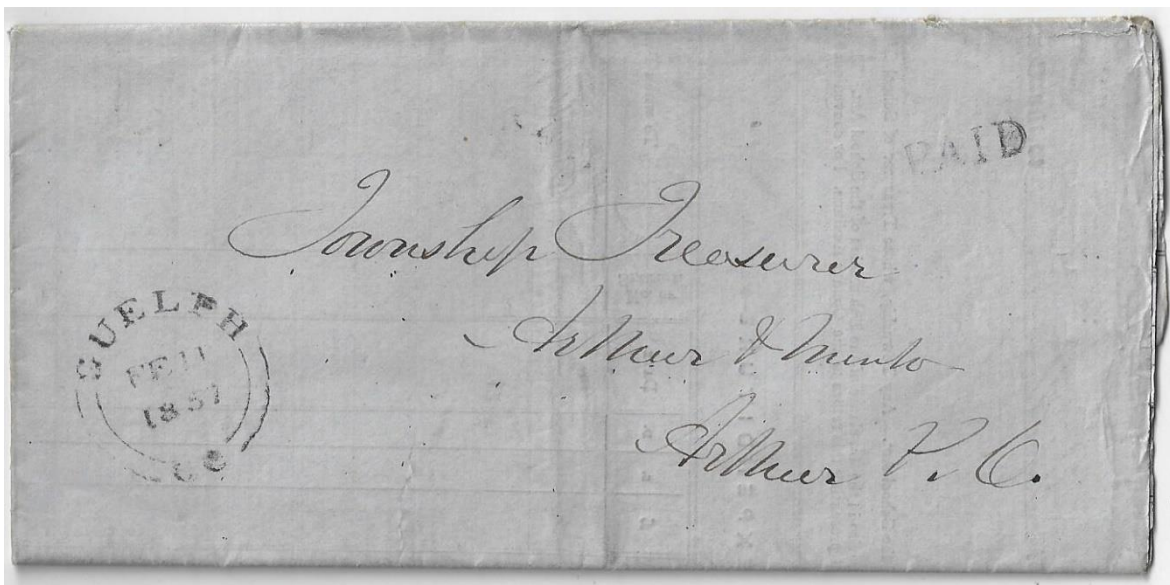

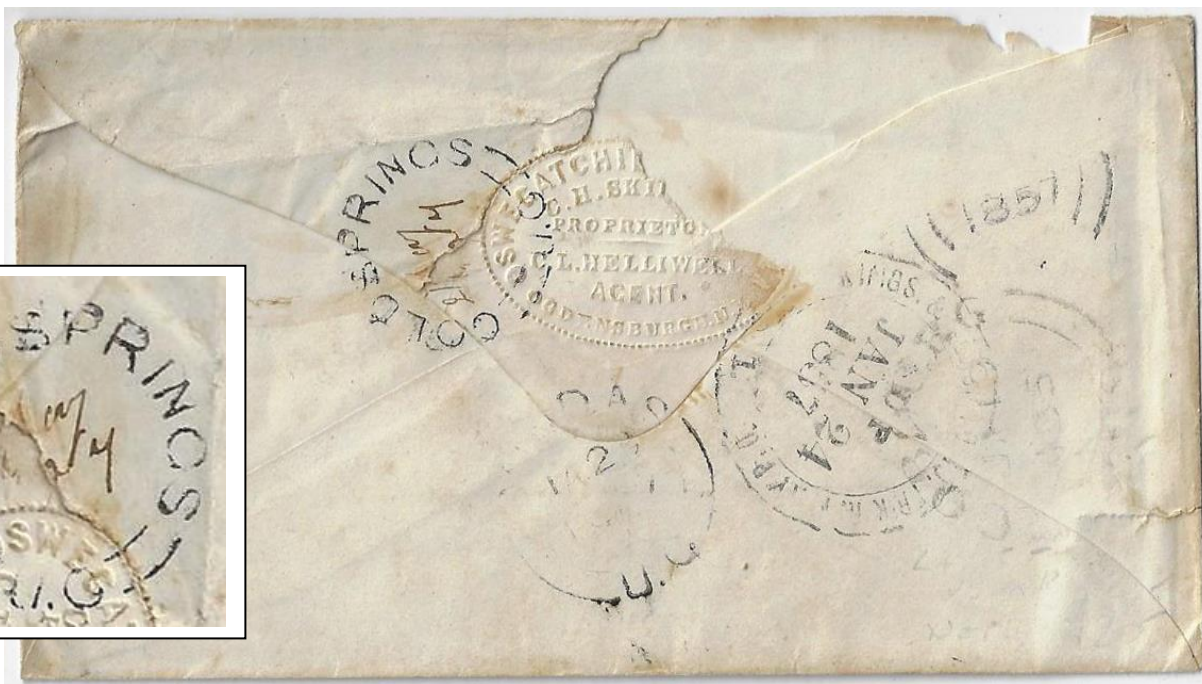

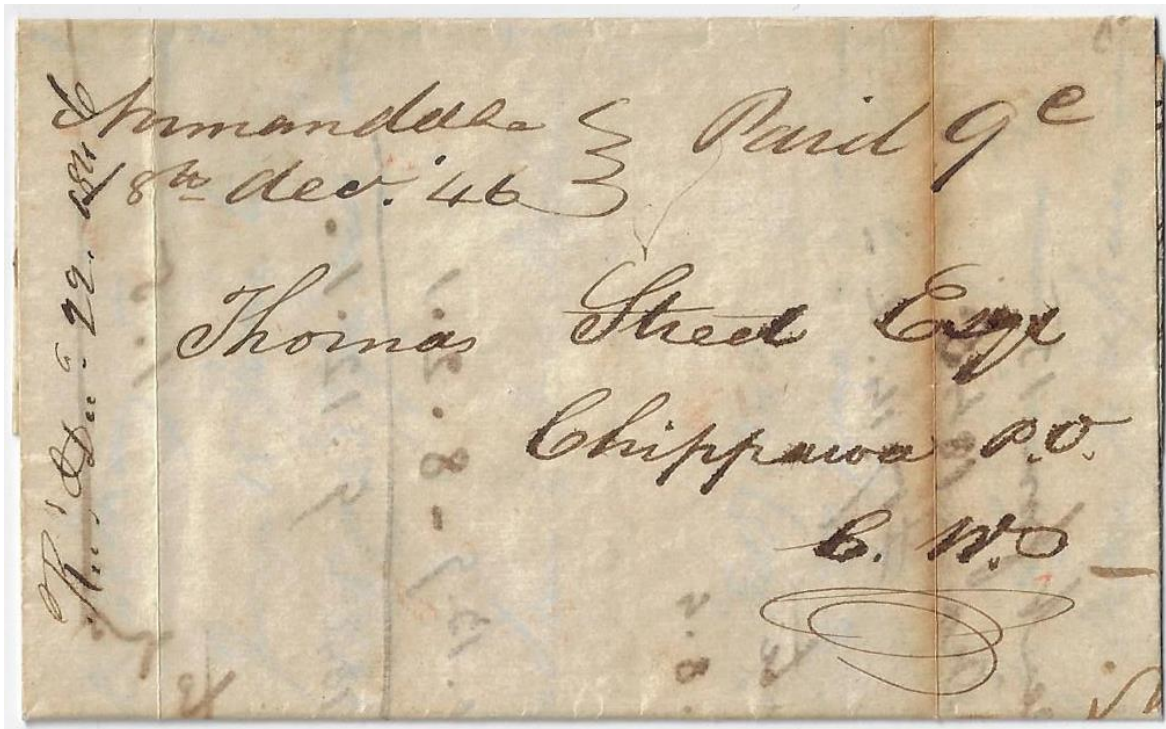
I received your favour of the 30th of October last and should have answered it immediately but having had some correspondence with Piquet as to his paying up the Mortgage which he appeared to be willing to do. I proposed writing until I knew what could be done with him. I have been over and paid Smith and called on Bond, he said he was willing and ready to settle up if I would give him \$1000 which I am unable to do. I offered it to Smith he was very willing to take it at a middle fair discount but was not prepared to pay ^{all} the money having paid \$1000 for a Mortgage the day before I saw him, he is to give me an answer in about a week or two. I called on Mr Bray the secretary and treasurer to the Building Society in Hamilton and find there is about \$60000 to be paid there the first Friday in December. I also called on Brown and enquired about the place they is on he told me he was going to describe the next day to see about the matter and as soon as he returned he would come down and see what could be done as to the sale of it. I think it would be well to write Fisher anything about it at the present. Sister Mary has sold about \$200 worth of goods I had to make a purchase of some fifty dollars worth of goods so as to get the custom of some who would otherwise go to St Catharines. Mr Partridge has been here and we have had a meeting
