

Degree of comparison exampleIncorrect: Reena is smarter than any student in her category. Correct: Reena is smarter than any other student in her category. Use 'any' if a comparison of things/person is outside the group. Incorrect: Delhi is cleaner than the other town in Bangla Desh. Correct: any other is cleaner than any town in Bangla Desh. To indicate whether or not the distinction between the compared thing/person is little or huge, we tend to use quantifiers for the comparative degree of an adjective like (A bit, a little, a lot, far, much, an excellent deal, considerably, etc). Example: My hostel is only marginally larger than yours. She could be a very little more standard than her sister in their college. Australia is slightly smaller than the continent. We don't use quantifiers with superlative degrees of comparison. Degree of Comparison Example In developed cities, metros are by far the cheapest mode of transportation.
