Sir,
I have just received a letter from Miss Annie O'Conner teacher at Michipicoton saying that the School was burnt down on Monday the 8th instant. She says the fire caught between the Ceiling and the roof, and spread so rapidly that she was not able to save any of her personal effects that was up stairs, she saved most of the School furniture School material, Stove etc, part of the firewood is also burnt, and what wood is saved she is getting piled up in shape and will leave it in charge of Mr Grosjean, who is also storing the School's supplies which were saved, As there are no Trains running in there regularly at present it is almost impossible for me to go there, Should I find out that a special train makes a trip in. I may go in with Mr Bury the Timber Inspector when he goes there, Kindly let me know if this ~~will~~ School building was insured, and if so by whom, so that I can notify the Agent here, Awaiting your further instructions,

Requests have been sent, quite a few times asking for repairs to be attended to, but you know few things have remained. The pipes where the paper ran through the upper floor, and roof of the building has not been repaired and in the first place was not properly finished. The fire was discovered almost immediately and the alarm given, and as water had to be carried from adjacent houses, it did not having convenience such as ladders or pumps" the whole upper part of said building was one mass of flames and smoke. Mrs. Thomas entered into her apartment to try and save some personal effects, but was almost suffocated and had to retire, consequently all that was upstairs belonging to her, was burned. The only effects saved was those that she had downstairs.

Nearly all the Government property is saved, and is stored in one of Mr. Ferguson's buildings. Some of the winter wood, and three bundles of single feet of a job" which was near a barrel. What wood is left, is being corded and hauled over to the Indian Agent.

The School Mistress will bring or send an inventory of Govt. property saved, as she does not know how or when she will be able to get out of here, as there are no regular trains, running and one is not always informed when they do run. However she will take the first possible opportunity.

The Indian Agent has been advised and Mrs. Thomas would be pleased if she could see him here so that he can pick things as stable and be assured of facts in making his

In reply I beg to say that the Department is sorry to learn of Miss O'Connor's indisposition and the loss of some of her personal effects.

With regard to the government property which was saved I beg to say that an inventory should be taken of it and sent to Mr. McNabb, the Agent, and the articles should be stored for the present.

I may inform you that previous to the receipt of your letter it had been decided to close this school as soon as possible and Mr. Agent McNabb was so informed. Doubtless by the time this letter reaches you Miss O'Connor will have been advised accordingly.

In reply to your letter of the 12th instant No 16450/1 in reference to Board a/c for Miss O'Conner to M. J. Burke, I beg to say that at the time of the outbreak of Measles at Michipicoton River Miss O'Conner was away on her Holidays, she returned to the Sault about the last of March, before she came here I had made a trip to Michipicoton and by the Doctors orders had put the whole place under Quarantine and had given Mrs Hallett the Nurse permission to use Miss O'Conner's quarters for her to live in, When Miss O'Conner came here by the advice of Dr Mc Gaig I had her stop here till the epidemic was all over and her quarters were well fumigated, as soon as the Doctor in charge at Michipicoton notified me that every thing was all right Miss O'Conner went up Hoping that this is satisfactory,



You are authorized to transfer the desks lying idle at the Michipicoten Indian Day School, to the new Public School. The Indian children in the vicinity have been promised the same educational facilities offered to the white community, and they should be encouraged to attend.

Re Building a School at Michipicoten River, S.S.#4.

Dear Sir:-

I submit herewith a statement re attendance of Indian children at the Public School in S.S.#4 Michipicoten. Would you be good enough to forward same to the Department?

The store now in use as a school house is not suitable, and there is a probability that it will not be available after midsummer. You are familiar with the fact that no suitable building is available in this settlement, and that nearly all the children are Indian or half-breeds. I understand your Department assume no obligation re education of non-treaty Indians; so that once an Indian is paid off in one sum in lieu of annual payments some other means must be provided for ^{educating} the children of such an Indian.

Now the time has come apparently when a school house must be built. The cost will probably be somewhat over \$1200.00. I am prepared to recommend that the Ontario Department of Education make a special building grant of \$500.00 if there is any means of financing the whole. Debentures in this area should not, I think, be considered. Would your Department consider a special building grant of \$500.00? If so I shall advise the trustees to make immediate preparations for building.

Sir:

I have your letter of the 28th ultimo, enclosing a communication which you received from the Public School Inspector at Sault Ste. Marie, in which he requests that this Department provide a grant to assist the School Board of the Michipicoten River S. S. No. 4 to erect a new school building. It is noted that he requests this Department to provide a building grant of \$500.

It is not the policy of the Department to provide funds towards the cost of the erection of school buildings where the work is not under the complete control of this Department. The only assistance we could provide would be the continuance of the grant on the same terms as is at present paid for the tuition of the Indian children who attend. We regret that it will not be possible to provide the funds asked for towards the cost of the erection of a new school building, and you may inform the Public School Inspector accordingly.
