

How Bills Become Laws

The process of introducing legislation to be considered by the General Assembly and ultimately enacted into law is outlined in the Constitution of Virginia, Rules of the Senate, and the Rules of the Virginia House of Delegates

Bills may originate in either the Senate or the House of Delegates.




•A Senator or Delegate, as requested by constituents, prepares to introduce legislation by explaining the proposal he/she has in mind to a staff attorney in the <u>Division of Legislative Services</u>. A staff attorney checks existing law and the constitutionality of the proposed legislation.

General Assembly Session Convenes

Members do have bill limits.

In an even session year, House and Senate members can introduce unlimited numbers of prefiled bills. Members had to submit requests for prefiled bills to be drafted to the Division of Legislative Services by 5 p.m. on November 30.



All prefiled bills, House and Senate, must be submitted by 10 a.m. on the first day of session.

After session begins a House member can only introduce 5 bills.

After session begins a Senate member can only introduce 8 bills.

Prefiling Legislation for 2024

The 2024 session is the 1st year of a two year session cycle.

Bill numbers begin with House Bill 1 and Senate Bill 1.





Voter registration list maintenance; due date of annual report. Clarifies that the annual report made by the Department of Elections on its activities undertaken to maintain the Virginia voter registration system is due by October 1. The report is required to contain the methodology used in gathering and analyzing the report's data. The bill requires the Commissioner of Elections to certify that such data is accurate and reliable. The bill further clarifies that information regarding the Department's list maintenance activities arising comparisons with other states is to be included in this annual report.





Approved

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

- 1. That §§ 24.2-404 and 24.2-404.4 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: § 24.2-404. Duties of Department of Elections.
- A. The Department of Elections shall provide for the continuing operation and maintenance of a central recordkeeping system, the Virginia voter registration system, for all voters registered in the Commonwealth.

[H 28] Approved March 23, 2018

F. The Department shall report annually by August October 1 for the preceding 12 months ending June 30 August 31 to the Committees on Privileges and Elections on each of its activities undertaken to maintain the Virginia voter registration by the provisions of § 2.2-608 and shall encompass activities undertaken pursuant to subdivisions A 9 and 10 and subsection E and pursuant to §§ 24.2-404.3, 24.2-404.4, 24.2-409, 24.2-409.1, 24.2-410, 24.2-410.1, 24.2-427, and 24.2-428. This report shall contain the methodology used in gathering and analyzing the data. The Commissioner of Elections shall certify that the data included in the report is accurate and reliable.

§ 24.2-404.4. Exchange of registered voter lists with other states.

A. Pursuant to its authority under subsection A of § 24.2-405 and subsections B and C of § 24.2-406, the Department of Elections shall request voter registration information and lists of persons voting at primaries and elections, if available, from the states bordering the Commonwealth to identify duplicate registrations, voters who no longer reside in the Commonwealth, and other persons who are no longer entitled to be registered in order to maintain the overall accuracy of the voter registration system.

- B. Pursuant to its authority under subdivision A 10 of § 24.2-404, the Department of Elections shall utilize data regarding voter registration and lists of persons voting at primaries and elections received through list comparisons with other states to identify duplicate registrations, voters who no longer reside in the Commonwealth, and other persons who are no longer entitled to be registered in order to maintain the overall accuracy of the voter registration system.
- C. The Department shall compare the data received pursuant to subsections A and B with the state voter registration list and initiate list maintenance procedures under applicable state and federal law. The Department shall include in its report to the House and Senate Committees on Privileges and Elections annually on, required by subsection F of § 24.2-404, the progress of activities conducted under this section, including the number of duplicate registrations found to exist and the procedures that the Department and general registrars are following to eliminate duplicate registrations from the Virginia registered voter lists. All annual reports required to be filed by the Department shall be governed by the provisions of § 2.2-608.




Most state agencies have an Office of Policy or Regulatory Coordinators who submit reports that are mandated through legislation.










E-Mail Notification When The Bills in Your Profile Have ANY Status Change












