## Record of three marine snails from the Singapore Strait

**Subjects**: Pointed-rib whelk, *Nassarius acuticostus* (Mollusca: Gastropoda: Buccinoidea: Nassariidae); Ceylon drill, *Tenguella ceylonica* (Mollusca: Gastropoda: Muricoidea: Muricidae); Granulated drill, *Tenguella granulata* (Mollusca: Gastropoda: Muricoidea: Muricidae).

Subjects identified by: Chan Sow-Yan.

Location, date and time: Singapore Strait, Pulau Salu and Pulau Sudong; 1984 to 1986; late afternoons.

Habitat: Marine. Intertidal shores. On sand flats and under coral rubble and rocks.

Observer: Ng Hiong Eng.

Observations: The following were sorted from sample collections obtained at Pulau Sudong and Pulau Salu -

- 1. One example of *Nassarius acuticostus* of 18.0 mm shell height (Fig. 1) from Pulau Salu in April 1984. The shell was collected at low tide on a patch of sand, with the animal and operculum dried inside.
- 2. One example of *Tenguella granulata* of 13.2 mm shell height (Fig. 2) from Pulau Salu in 1985. The shell was found under a rock at low tide, with the animal and operculum dried inside.
- 3. One example of *Tenguella ceylonica* of 21.2 mm shell height (Fig. 3) from Pulau Sudong in September 1985. The shell was found under a rock at low tide.

**Remarks**: The three small species of gastropods featured here are of interest because they are not commonly observed on Singapore shores (see for example Chuang, 1961; Chuang, 1973; personal observations). As they were not listed by Tan & Woo (2010), it seems that the present records are new for Singapore. The identification of the nassarid is based on Cernohorsky (1984).
