Make Way for MONARCHS

lanning on buying some butterfly weed? Already have some? The genus Asclepias plays a vital role in migratory monarch life cycles. Milkweeds, like butterfly weed (Asclepias tuberosa) and swamp milkweed (Asclepias incarnata) are host plants for monarchs, their foliage being an excellent place to lay eggs, while the flowers provide nectar to many native pollinators. Within the urban communites of Coastal Virginia, monarchs heavily rely on milkweed planted in backyard gardens to support the next generation of butterflies. Meghan



Britton is a current PhD student at Old Dominion University, studying urban ecology and milkweed populations. If you have milkweed in your yard and are interested in helping to protect monarchs, consider reaching out to Meghan at mbrit010@odu.edu.

What can you do?

Plant Milkweed

Although it has the word "weed" in it's name, milkweed is not considered a noxious weed.

Create a butterfly-friendly garden with milkweed and native plants that are great nectar sources.



Don't Spray Me!

Don't mistake hungry "worms" devouring your plants as pests. Instead, recognize them as baby butterflies in a different stage of their lifecycle. Caterpillars may consume all of the leaves on a milkweed plant—but this does not destroy the plants, it actually initiates re-growth.



Reduce Turf

Reduce the amount of turf in favor of habitatfriendly garden beds. Less turf leads to less dependence on chemicals. Less turf also reduces the need for fueled equipment, thus reducing your carbon footprint.

Common Yarrow — is one of the most widely spread perennials, having naturalized in much of North America. Its beautifully textured foliage is very aromatic and is reason enough to grow this plant, but its flat clusters of ivory white flowers are great for attracting butterflies and other beneficial pollinators to your garden. Flower arrangers love it too! It needs full sun in soil with excellent drainage. Once established it is tolerant of dry soils, salt, and deer. \$6.00













Achillea 'Sassy Summer Sangria' Walter's Gardens, Inc.

'Sassy Summer Sangria' Yarrow — is part of a series of yarrows noted for their profusion of flowers on strong tall stems that bloom late spring into summer. This selection has huge heads of dark red flowers with white eyes that are great for attracting butterflies and other beneficial pollinators to your garden. The aromatic foliage is very handsome as well. Flower arrangers love it too! It needs full sun in soil with excellent drainage. Once established it is tolerant of dry soils, salt, and deer. **\$12.00**

'Sassy Summer Sunset' Yarrow — is part of a series of yarrows noted for their profusion of flowers on strong tall stems that bloom late spring into summer. This selection has huge heads of bright orange flowers that are great for attracting butterflies and other beneficial pollinators to your garden. The aromatic foliage is very handsome as well. Flower arrangers love it too! It needs full sun in soil with excellent drainage. Once established it is tolerant of dry soils, salt, and deer. \$12.00

Hummingbird Mint —is a species native to Mexico, but is hardy here in Coastal Virginia. The plant is covered in apricot colored flowers from early summer into fall, and it is indeed a hummingbird magnet, but butterflies and other insect pollinators like it too. Like other Agastache species the foliage is very aromatic with a minty aroma that typically repels deer and rabbits. It prefers full sun in moist soil with good drainage; drought tolerant once established. Plant a piece of NBG in your own garden - this offering comes from our collections. \$8.00

'Blue Fortune' Giant Hyssop — is a pollinator magnet and a hybrid between an Asian and a North American native species. Spikes of small lavender-blue tubular flowers are attractive to hummingbirds, butterflies, bees, and other pollinators. Blooms heavily in early summer to early fall. Aromatic foliage has a peppermintlemon scent when brushed against or crushed. Exceptional massed in beds and borders. Prefers full sun in well drained soil, drought tolerant, deer and rabbit resistant. \$12.00

'Queen Nectarine' Anise Hyssop — is part of the MEANT TO BEE™ Collection whose plants were selected for their large, full habits, significant landscape presence, and hardiness. It has soft peachy flowers held in a contrasting mauve calyx and they bloom from early summer to early fall. In flower, 2/3rds of the plant is covered with blossoms attracting hummingbirds, butterflies, and other insect pollinators. Like other Agastache, it has strongly aromatic, minty foliage. Prefers full sun in well drained soil, drought tolerant, deer and rabbit resistant. \$12.00

Century Plant or Agave — will give your landscape a touch of the exotic Southwest, and while many species and varieties are not hardy here, this one has proven to be exceptionally hardy for Coastal Virginia. It has handsome bluegreen foliage with the same spiky nature of other Agave. All Agave species are monocarpic, meaning that after they flower, the mother plant will die, but not before creating several litters of "pups". Fortunately, it can take 10-20 years for them to flower, and what a dramatic flower it is, attracting insect pollinators and hummingbirds. This selection has proven very winter hardy, just make sure it has very good drainage and full sun; drought, salt and heat tolerant; deer resistant. Plant a piece of NBG in your own garden - this offering comes from our collections. \$10.00

Bronze Bugleweed — is an attractive groundcover with glossy, bronzy purple to green, scalloped leaves and a dense habit. From mid to late spring, short spikes of violet-blue flowers stand upright above the very low, spreading foliage. The flowers attract butterflies, bees, and other pollinators. This evergreen groundcover can grow in the shade of large trees where grass is hard to establish. Given adequate moisture, this plant will grow in full sun, but partial shade is probably more suitable. It needs moist well drained soil. If happy, this plant can spread vigorously. Plant a piece of NBG in your own garden - this offering comes from our collections. \$8.00

6"Tx8-10"W Zones 3-9 Pot Size: 2 qt.



BLACK SCALLOP Bugleweed — is an attractive groundcover with glossy, nearblack, scalloped leaves and a dense habit. From mid to late spring, short (4-6") spikes of deep blue flowers stand upright above the very low, spreading foliage. The effect is stunning when planted en masse. The flowers attract butterflies, bees, and other pollinators. 'Black Scallop' tends to spread more slowly and stay naturally compact compared to other bugleweed. It is reported to be resistant to powdery mildew. This evergreen groundcover can grow in the shade of large trees where grass is hard to establish, but the best foliage color is brought out in more sun. It needs moist well drained soil. \$10.00



'Lavender Bubbles' Ornamental Onion — is a beautiful perennial that near the end of summer brings dusty purple, bubble-shaped flowers to the garden attracting butterflies and other insect pollinators. It also has attractive glaucous blue-green foliage whose blades twist and curl to provide additional interest. When bruised or crushed, the foliage has an onion aroma that deters deer and rabbits. Unlike other ornamental onions, this one is a late bloomer. Prefers full to partial sun in moist well drained soil; drought tolerant once established. \$12.00

Amsonia hubrichtii

Arkansas Blue Star — is an American native perennial that sports clusters of small, star-shaped light blue flowers above fern-like foliage in late spring. This tall clumping grower has a rugged constitution, tolerating full sun to partial shade, and once established, it is considerably drought tolerant and deer resistant. After blooming, the finely textured foliage remains light green all summer, finally turning a stunning golden yellow in the fall. In fact, it is one of the best-known perennials for fall foliage color, and it contrasts well with fall blooming asters. It needs well drained soil. in 2011, Arkansas blue star was named the Perennial Plant of the Year[™] by the Perennial Plant Association. **\$10.00**

'String Theory' Blue Star — is a newer hybrid *Amsonia* with finely textured foliage similar to Arkansas blue star, but on a smaller plant. In late spring beautiful starlike blue flower clusters bloom at the end of each stem. After flowering, the plant will add beautiful soft texture with its fern-like foliage, and in fall the foliage turns a rich golden orange. It prefers full sun in moist well drained soil; drought tolerant

and easy to grow thriving in heat and humidity. \$10.00









Thimbleweed — is a Virginia native with handsome white flowers that bloom in mid to late spring on tall stalks that rise gracefully above the foliage. The flowers will attract native pollinators, but the foliage contains toxins that make the plant distasteful to browsing deer and rabbits. Once it is done flowering, the thimblelike seed structures will add interest through the summer. It will grow in full sun to shade, preferring moist well drained soil, but it is drought tolerant once established. \$6.00

Swamp Milkweed — is a Coastal Virginia native that prefers moist soil making it a good choice for rain gardens or to plant near water, but it does well in regular soil as well. Beautiful, fragrant, pink flowers are a nectar source for many butterfly species, but other insect pollinators are drawn to the flowers as well. Like all milkweeds, the leaves are the only food source for monarch butterfly caterpillars. It prefers full sun in moist to wet soils; deer and rabbit resistant. SAVE THE **MONARCHS! \$12.00**

'Cinderella' Swamp Milkweed — is a Coastal Virginia native that prefers moist soil making it a good choice for rain gardens or to plant near water, but it does well in regular soil as well. 'Cinderella' produces larger and denser flowers than the straight species. Like all milkweeds, the leaves are the only food source for monarch butterfly caterpillars. It prefers full sun in moist to wet soils; deer and rabbit resistant. SAVE THE **MONARCHS! \$12.00**

Butterfly Weed — is a Coastal Virginia native with striking orange flowers that bloom in summer attracting numerous butterfly species and other beneficial pollinators. It starts to bloom in early summer, and deadheading will produce blooms into August. Like all milkweeds, this is one of the only host foods for monarch butterfly caterpillars. This species is always one of the last to emerge late in the spring. It prefers full sun in well drained soil, and it is quite tolerant of poor soils, heat, drought, deer, rabbits, and salt. 'Jindai' Tartarian Aster — is dramatic fall bloomer with lavender-blue, daisylike petals surrounding golden centers on 4-5' dramatically tall stalks. Despite being an Asian native, Tartarian asters attract local butterflies and other insect pollinators, plus birds will eat its seeds. Prefers full sun in moist well drained soil; deer resistant. Given plenty of water and rich soil, this plant can be very vigorous, but not invasive. Plant a piece of NBG in your own garden - this offering comes from our collections. \$12.00

'American Goldfinch' Baptisia (False Indigo) — is a hybrid of the native species featuring golden yellow flower spikes that rise over 3' above the blue-green foliage. After blooming it produces attractive round seed pods in the fall. This plant is perfect for mass plantings and will be sure to attract both butterflies and





bees to your garden. Prefers full to partial sun in well drained lean soil, drought and salt tolerant, deer resistant. \$20.00 3-3.5' T x 4.5-5' W Zones 4-9

'Blue Bubbly' Baptisia (False Indigo) — is a is a hybrid of the native species that features long, 16" lavender-blue spikes that appear above attractive blue-green foliage. Baptisia in the DECADENCE® DELUXE series grow taller than other selections. Attractive to bees and butterflies. Plant in full to partial sun with well drained lean soil, drought and salt tolerant, deer resistant. \$20.00

Plant in full to partial sun with lean well drained soil, drought and salt tolerant, deer resistant. \$20.00

Berlandiera lyrata

Chocolate Flower — is native to Mexico and the American Southwest. It has showy, yellow, daisy-like flowers that will bloom all summer if deadheaded. The interesting name comes from the flowers scent which is reminiscent of chocolate. Butterflies and other insect pollinators are attracted to the flowers, and birds will enjoy the seeds. This plant thrives in heat and full to part sun. It prefers moist, but very well drained soil; drought tolerant; deer resistant. Plant a piece of NBG in your own garden - this offering comes from our collections. \$8.00

BEYOND PINK'D® Bluebeard — is one of the prettiest pink *Caryopteris* that has yet been created! It boasts large, glossy, spearmint-green foliage and spires of pure-pink flowers, stacked in neat layers along the stem. It blooms throughout the summer into early fall attracting a variety of butterflies and other insect pollinators. Like other bluebeards, it can be considered a woody perennial or a sub-shrub, and it prefers full sun in well drained soil. Once established it is drought resistant, heat and humidity tolerant, and deer avoid it. \$20.00











'DCARBEYBAR' BEYOND PINK'D®

Bluemist Flower — is a Coastal Virginia native perennial that offers months of color from late July into mid-fall. Clouds of purply blue flowers attract a wide variety of butterflies and insect pollinators, and birds will enjoy the seeds. The plant has a wild nature and can be on the vigorous to aggressive side, so it should be planted where it will have plenty of room. It prefers full to partial sun in moist soil, but it tolerates wet soil; deer resistant. \$10.00

'Moonbeam' Threadleaf Coreopsis (Tickseed) — is a reliable bloomer and a favorite with gardeners. The flowers are a glowing, lemon-yellow color and sit on top of tall, erect, lacey, somewhat mound forming, delicate looking green foliage that has an airy appearance. The flowers are plentiful and bloom continuously throughout the entire summer with deadheading, attracting butterflies and other insect pollinators, but late in the season leave the seedheads so that they become food for birds. Threadleaf coreopsis is a Coastal Virginia native that likes full sun in moist well drained soil, but it is drought tolerant once established; deer resistant. \$12.00

'Zesty Zinger' Threadleaf Coreopsis (Tickseed) — is a cultivar of a Coastal Virginia native Coreopsis that forms a spreading clump of very delicate, ferny foliage. This selection, part of the SIZZLE AND SPICE® series, bears loads of 11/2", light ivory flowers with dark magenta centers which spread toward the edge of the petals, blooming early summer into fall. Butterflies and other insect pollinators are attracted to the flowers. Deadheading faded flowers will encourage buds to form all season, but late in the season leave the dried seedheads as bird food. Prefers full sun in moist well drained soil, but it is tolerant of hot, dry sites, and it is deer resistant. \$12.00



Flowers appear in early summer, and a quick shearing after flowering will encourage them to rebloom in early fall. 'Sweetie Pie' has true pink flowers with darker pink eyes. The flowers attract butterflies and other insect pollinators. Prefers full to part sun in moist well drained soil, but it is tolerant of the occasional dry spell and it is slightly salt tolerant as well. \$10.00

Twin Flower — is a hard-to-find plant, native from Georgia to Florida (though some sources list it in Virginia as well). Its beautiful lavender flowers attract many pollinators, and it is a host plant for common buckeye butterflies. It's spreading habit and ease of growth make it an excellent groundcover. It prefers full to partial sun in moist well drained soil, and it does show a degree of tolerance for drought. Plant a piece of NBG in your own garden - this offering comes from our collections. \$10.00

'Hula Dancer' Pale Purple Coneflower — is a cultivar of a Midwest native coneflower. Surrounding its central cone are pale, blush pink, nearly white petals that sway in the breeze. The color is lighter than the species, and the blooms are slightly larger. The early summer flowers attract butterflies, and other beneficial pollinators. Once the seeds are ripe, they will attract seed-eating birds. It prefers full to part sun in moist well drained soil. Once established, it is drought tolerant, but will not thrive in wet soils; deer resistant. \$10.00

Echinacea purpurea 'Magnus'

'Magnus' Purple Coneflower — is an older variety of the North American native purple coneflower, but it is one of the best, a time-tested, superior cultivar. It has tall upright stems topped with attractive cones surrounded by broad spreading pink petals. Like other coneflowers, the blooms will attract butterflies and other insect pollinators. The flowers begin in late spring and last into early fall if deadheaded. However, late in the season, leave the seedheads for birds to enjoy. It prefers full to part sun in moist well drained soil. Once established, it can survive the occasional drought; deer resistant. \$8.00






'White Swan' Coneflower — is a reliable selection of the North American native purple coneflower, and it is one of the better white flowered selections. It has tall upright stems topped with attractive cones surrounded by broad spreading ivory petals. Like other coneflowers, the blooms will attract butterflies and other insect pollinators. The flowers begin in late spring and last into early fall if deadheaded. However, late in the season, leave the seedheads for birds to enjoy. It prefers full to part sun in moist well drained soil. Once established, it can survive the occasional drought; deer resistant. \$12.00













Eryngium aquaticum

Marsh Rattlesnake Master — is a Coastal Virginia native that grows naturally in bogs, marshes, and other wet areas. The horticulture team works hard to take care of our beautiful 175 acres of Garden spaces—and at the same time, provide great plants for sale to the community. A portion of the plants we sell every year come straight from the Garden, usually from what we refer to as a Dig and Divide. Plants that spread rapidly in optimal growing conditions often need to be thinned-out or contained to an area to avoid competing with other plants in a bed. 

Ray's Raspberry Cake Recipe

"In my opinion, everything is better as a cake! I love the way green tea wakes me up, and adding fruity flavors to it enriches the bright flavors. I took inspiration from matcha and chamomile tea cakes to try to turn my favorite tea into my favorite dessert- cake!" — Ray Volkin, NBG Plant Recorder

For (1) 9 inch loaf:

11/2 cups AP flour

Bonus Information:

Cake:

½ cup unsalted butter 6-8 bags of your favorite green tea 1 cup milk of choice, room temp 1 cup sugar ½ tsp salt 2 large eggs, room temp 1 lemon 1 tsp vanilla 2 tsp baking powder

Icing:

1 cup powdered sugar ½ cup raspberries, fresh or frozen

Vegan substitutes:

For 2 large eggs: 1 can's worth of aquafaba from unsalted

garbanzo beans

For butter: 6 tbsp canola oil





- Add butter to saucepan on medium heat. Once melted, stir in milk until simmering. Remove from heat, add tea bags, and let steep 1 hour or until cool.
- Preheat oven to 350. Line the bread pan with parchment paper.
- Add sugar to butter/milk/tea and mix thoroughly. Add vanilla.
- In a separate bowl, whisk eggs vigourously, until fluffed
- In a separate bowl, add sifted flour, sugar, the zest of 1 lemon, baking powder, salt, and stir until homogenized. Save the lemon.
- Add about 1/3 of liquid mixture to dry ingredients. Then stir. Repeat until all ingredients are combined. Carefully fold in egg mixture.
- Transfer the batter to the pan and bake 40-45 minutes on the middle rack. Let cool
- Put raspberries into a fine mesh sieve or cheese cloth bundle. Muddle into a container and discard seeds/flesh. Add the juice from the saved lemon and the confectioners sugar until a smooth, thick texture is obtained.
- Once the cake is cooled to room temp, use a butter knife to break the seal between the edge of the cake and the pan. Slowly pour the icing over the cake while in the pan until thoroughly covered. Let cool 1+ hours in the fridge before enjoying.





Aristolochia tomentosa

Wooly Dutchman's Pipe — is a woody, twining vine native to the southern and central United States. It is covered in large, heart-shaped leaves, parts of which are covered in wooly hairs. This vine is dense and relatively fast growing providing welcome shade to patios and porches in the summer, but being deciduous, it will allow warm sun through during the winter. It has oddly shaped flowers that bloom in mid to late spring that are yellow-green with purple to brown accents. They need an arbor or some other structure to grow on, and are a welcome addition to butterfly gardens as they are a host plant for pipevine swallowtail butterflies. It prefers full to partial sun in moist soil with good drainage. \$12.00




