## Our Learning

Our topic this half term is 'The Great Outdoors', each week we are learning about the outside world, we started with the theme of weather, the children conducted an experiment to see if we could create rain in a bag and learned about condensation, we check our window to see if the sun has created a rain cloud! Our role play has been transformed in to a garden centre where the children have the opportunity to talk about things they might see on sale or use in the garden. Last week World Book Day saw us dressing in the theme of belonging and teaching each other about the things we love, parents came for a visit to read with their children, it was such a lovely experience and one we hope to make a more frequent occurrence. Last week we were learning about hibernating animals and reading Goldilocks and the three bears, the children discussed who hibernates and why, they then created an environment for one of the animals discussed in group learning. Our theme this week is all about plants the supporting story is Rapunzel, we talked about what herbs might be used for different purposes and started a herb garden on our windowsill. We will be watching them grow and hope to move them outside in the nicer weather so we have a sensory sensation for potions and playdough.
