## KEY TO THE HOLOTHUROIDS OF POINT LOMA

	Key characters include presence/absence of tubefeet, body shape, spicule type, and, in some cases, coloration.
1a	Tube feet obvious; body tappering at each end, decidedly curved
1b.	Tube feet absent
2a.	Specimen large, well developed, usually dark in color (see voucher sheets)
	Pentamera psuedopopulifera
2b.	Specimen white (see voucher sheet)
3a.	Body elongate (vermiform), "fleshy" 4
3b.	Body plump, tapered posteriorly into a "tail" 5
4a.	Body wall thin, generally colorless to pink; spicules are tables with anchors visible through body wall along its entire length Leptosynapta sp. A SCAMIT
4b.	Body wall thickened, usually mottled red; spicules are "wheels" concentrated in isolated "blisters" along body wall
5a.	Body stout with short "tail;" mottled reddish-brown coloration; spicules are anchors with supporting rods
5b.	Body white to cream colored with long "tail"; body wall appears papillated, in part, due to dense table-type spicules protruding through body wall
