
Nuculana spp. of Point Loma

Mollusca (Nuculanidae) K. Barwick September, 1995



Nuculana taphira (Dall, 1896)

Shell short, inflated (juveniles more compressed).
Sculpture of sharp-heavy-concentric ribs that

become obsolete on the posterior-dorsal slope.

Posterior produced, slightly pointed, recurved.
Periostracum shiny, iridescent.

Nuculana hamata (Carpenter, 1864)

I. Moderately compressed.

2. Strong concentric ribs.

3. Squarely truncated posterior produced into long "rostrum."

Nuculana elenensis (G.B. Sowerby I in Broderip & Sowerby, 1833)

 Moderately inflated.
Heavy concentric ribs end abrubtly at the posterior-dorsal slope.
Posterior produced into sharp point, acute.
At deeper stations, 300+ ft.
Voucher M-283

Nuculana penderi (Dall & Bartsch, 1910)

1. Shell very short, very inflated (juveniles also inflated).

2. Sculpture of numerous concentric ribs that continue over the posterior slope.

3. Posterior short.

4. Esutcheon broad, depressed, demarcated by heavy radial ridge.

5. More inflated than N. taphira, rare.
