Growing Conditions: Prefers full sun, deep, moist, well-drained soils, moderate water requirements, pH adaptable.

Scientific Name: Ginkgo Biloba

Common Name: Maidenhair Tree

Current Size: 5 gallon root ball, 5 ft. tall

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 50-60 ft.
- Spread: 30-40 ft.
- Shape: Pyramidal

General: Large tree with medium texture and rather coarse in winter. Conical form when young, spreading lateral branches with age. Unique fan shaped leaves notched at the apex.

Fall Color: Excellent yellow color, leaves drop quickly, especially following a freeze.

Flowering: Not ornamental, dioecious: male – 1” long catkin in April; female – green, naked ovules. Trees may not flower until 20 years old. Seed produced on female tree only – flesh covering seed has foul smell often described as rancid butter.

Growing Conditions: Full sun, prefers deep sandy soils and moderate moisture; is pH adaptable and of almost any other condition. Tolerant of pollution, salt, air, and heat.

Scientific Name: *Gymnocladus dioica*

Common Name: Kentucky Coffeetree

Current Size: 5 gallon root ball, 5 ft. tall

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 50 ft.
- Spread: 35 ft.
- Shape: Irregular

General: Unique habit, picturesque quality, upright to irregular branching. Somewhat clumsy looking in winter but has interesting textured bark – gray, ridged, and furrowed with rough look.

Fall Color: Inconsistent – sometimes a good yellow, but often not good. Fallen leaves are somewhat of a litter problem due to the large rachis.

Flowering: Dioecious, fragrant, not highly ornamental but interesting. Fruit is a chunky, dark reddish brown pod ripening in October.

Growing Conditions: Full sun or perhaps part shade, prefers deep, moist, rich soil for best growth. Drought resistant, pH and soil adaptable, urban tolerant. Adaptable to wide range of soil conditions.

Scientific Name: *Liriodendron tulipifera*

Common Name: Tulip Tree

Current Size: 5 gallon root ball, 5 ft. tall

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 60 ft.
- Spread: 40-60 ft.
- Shape: Irregular

General: Extremely large size. Somewhat pyramidal in youth maturing to oval-rounded or irregular, long-fruiting season. Trunks are massive. Fall

Color: Can be very showy. Golden yellow to clear yellow.

Flowering: Has 2-3" tulip shaped upright blossoms borne singly at branch ends. Blooms late May through mid-June. Petals are yellow-green.

Growing Conditions: Full sun, prefers a deep, moist, fertile soil, slightly acidic is best, pH adaptable. Avoid very dry, hot sites. Has a fleshy, poorly branched root system.

Scientific Name: *Pinus aristata*

Common Name: Rocky Mountain Bristlecone Pine

Current Size: 5 gallon root ball, 5 ft. tall

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 25 ft.
- Spread: 20 ft.
- Shape: Irregular

General: Attractive slow-growing small tree suitable for small gardens in colder climates.

Fall Color: Needles stay same as summer – deep green to blue-green needles, cones are ovoid cylindrical

Flowering: Not ornamentally important.

Growing Conditions: The trees grow in soils that are shallow lithosols, usually derived from dolomite and sometimes limestone, and occasionally sandstone or quartzite soils. Dolomite soils are alkaline, high in calcium and magnesium, and low in phosphorus.

Scientific Name: *Platanus x acerifolia* 'Bloodgood'

Common Name: Bloodgood London Planetree

Current Size: 5 gallon root ball, 5 ft. tall

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 60 ft.
- Spread: 50 ft
- Shape: Rounded

General: Large rounded tree that is pyramidal in youth developing with age to a large, open, wide-spreading outline with massive branches.

Fall Color: Poor yellow.

Flowering: Not ornamentally important.

Growing Conditions: Full sun to part shade, pH adaptable, urban tolerant. Easily transplanted, will grow in about anything, withstands high pH conditions and pollutants; withstands smoke and grime of cities.

Scientific Name: *Quercus macrocarpa*

Common Name: Bur Oak

Current Size: 5 gallon root ball, 5 ft. tall

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 60 ft.
- Spread: 40 ft.
- Shape: Irregular

General: Weakly pyramidal to oval in youth, gradually developing a massive trunk and a broad crown of stout branches; impressive as an open-grown specimen of the prairie.

Fall Color: Yellowish-brown.

Flowering: Brown catkins, not ornamentally important. Fruit is an acorn.

Growing Conditions: Full sun, drought resistant, pH adaptable, urban tolerant. Difficult to transplant; very adaptable to various soils and is found on sandy plains to alluvial bottoms. More tolerant of city conditions than most oaks.

Scientific Name: Quercus robur x Q. bicolor 'Regal Prince'

Common Name: Regal Prince Oak

Current Size: 5 gallon root ball, 5 ft. tall

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 50 ft.
- Spread: 40 ft.
- Shape: Rounded

General: Large, massive, broadly rounded, open-headed tree with a short trunk; too large for the average landscape; in youth pyramidal to rounded.

Fall Color: Leaves remain green late into autumn.

Flowering: Monoecious, male flowers are yellow-green catkins. Fruit is small elongated acorn.

Growing Conditions: Full sun to part shade; pH adaptable

Scientific Name: *Cornus controversa* 'June Snow –JFS'

Common Name: June Snow Dogwood

Current Size: 7 gallon root ball, 6 ft. tall

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 35 ft.
- Spread: 40 ft.
- Shape: Irregular

Growth Rate: Fast

General: Displays attractive horizontal branches clothed in large, five to eight-inch-long leaves, dark green above and silver/green beneath. The branching pattern is more upright in youth, spreading as it grows.

Fall Color: Red.

Flowering: White clusters of bloom in dense cymes up to five inches across

Growing Conditions: Full sun, partial sun or partial shade. Will tolerate clay, sandy, loam and acidic with good drainage. Moderate drought tolerance.

Scientific Name: *Cornus x kousa*
Common Name: Venus Dogwood
Current Size: 5 gallon root ball,
Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 20-25 ft.
- Spread: 20-25 ft.
- Shape: Rounded

General: Vase shaped in youth, becoming rounded with age with horizontally stratified branching. Ornamental appeal in form, bark, flowering, fruiting and fall foliage color.
Fall Color: Leaves turn red or red-purple.
Flowering: Flowers are small and greenish-yellow and are surrounded by four large, showy, pointed bracts – which are white, but age to pink. Bloom time is early June but bracts last for about 6 weeks, making for a very long effective bloom time.
Growing Conditions: Full sun to partial shade; prefers a moist, fertile, acidic, well-drained soil high in organic matter.

Scientific Name: *Fraxinus pennsylvanica* ‘Patmore’
Common Name: Patmore Green Ash
Current Size: 5 gallon root ball, 5 ft. tall
Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 50-70 ft.
- Spread: 35-45 ft.
- Shape: Pyramidal

General: Flowering in spring, lovely shade tree, easily transplanted.

Fall Color: Yellow to deep purple and maroon.

Flowering: Small flowers that are green, purple and black, not ornamentally important.

Growing Conditions: Easily grown in average, medium moisture, well-drained soils in full sun. Prefers consistently moist, humusy loams, but established trees demonstrate adaptability to a wide range of soils and growing conditions.

Scientific Name: Ginkgo Biloba 'Autumn Gold'

Common Name: Autumn Gold Ginkgo

Current Size: 5 gallon root ball, 5 ft. tall

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 50-60 ft.
- Spread: 30-40 ft.
- Shape: Pyramidal

General: Large tree with medium texture and rather coarse in winter. Conical form when young, spreading lateral branches with age. Unique fan shaped leaves notched at the apex.

Fall Color: Excellent yellow color, leaves drop quickly, especially following a freeze.

Flowering: Not ornamental, dioecious: male – 1" long catkin in April; female – green, naked ovules. Trees may not flower until 20 years old. Seed produced on female tree only – flesh covering seed has foul smell often described as rancid butter.

Growing Conditions: Full sun, prefers deep sandy soils and moderate moisture; is pH adaptable and of almost any other condition. Tolerant of pollution, salt, air, and heat.

Scientific Name: Magnolia x loebneri 'Ballerina'

Common Name: Ballerina Magnolia

Current Size: 7 gallon root ball, 5 ft. tall

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 20-30 ft.
- Spread: 6-10 ft.
- Shape: Rounded

General: This medium sized shrub is valued for the masses of white flowers, tinged with pink in the centers. Flowering from late winter into spring. Perfect for use as a specimen or as a companion to other trees and shrubs such as Camellias, Maples and Cherries. A multi stemmed shrub, forming a small tree under favorable conditions.

Fall Color: Excellent yellow color.

Flowering: Large white flowers that are blushed with pink. It produces its fragrant, star-like white flowers (4-6 inches wide) in early spring before the foliage.

Growing Conditions: Part sun to partial shade.

Scientific Name: Quercus Imbricaria

Common Name: Shingle Oak

Current Size: 5 gallon root ball, 5 ft. tall

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 50 ft.
- Spread: 40 ft.
- Shape: Rounded

General: Pyramidal to upright-oval in youth then assuming a haystack-shaped to broad-rounded outline in old age.

Fall Color: Yellow-brown; brown leaves persist on the tree into winter.

Flowering: Monoecious, male flowers are pendulous yellow-green catkins. Blooms in May, is messy. Fruit is a small acorn. **Growing Conditions:** Full sun to part shade. Prefers acid soil and is drought resistant. Transplants fairly well.

Scientific Name: *Quercus rubra*

Common Name: Red Oak

Current Size: 7 gallon root ball, 6 ft. tall

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 50 ft.
- Spread: 45 ft.
- Shape: Rounded

General: Rounded in youth, in old age often round-topped and symmetrical. Long-lived.

Fall Color: A mixture of russet-red, yellow and tan. Color develops late, can be quite good or disappointing.

Flowering: Pale yellow-green catkins (male) add slight seasonal interest in May. Fruits are acorns borne singly or in pairs, and have large saucer-like caps.

Growing Conditions: Full sun, prefers acid soil, salt and urban tolerant. Transplants readily because of negligible taproot; prefers sandy loam soils; withstands polluted air of cities.

Scientific Name: Pinus Ponderosa

Common Name: Ponderosa Pine

Current Size: 5 gallon root ball, 4 ft. tall

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 60-100 ft.
- Spread: 20-30 ft.
- Shape: Irregular

General: Evergreen tree with a narrow, upright, oval form in youth opening up into irregular crown. Needles in 3's, 8-10" long with a sharply pointed apex. Thick fire resistant bark that is vanilla scented when bruised. Good windbreaker, specimen, highway buffer, or for mass plantings.

Fall Color: Needles stay same as summer – light green in color.

Flowering: Not ornamentally important. Produces 4" long reddish, showy, oval cones.

Growing Conditions: Full sun is best, prefers well-drained, acidic, deep, moist soil. Ponderosa Pine is drought tolerant - preferred transplant is B&B, salt tolerant.

Scientific Name: Acer Hot Wings Maple

Common Name: Maple, *ornamental*

Current Size: 15 gallon root ball, 6-10 ft in height

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 15-18 ft.
- Spread: 15-18 ft.

- Shape:

General: Small ornamental tree. Best performance on garden loam.

Fall Color: Fall leaf color transforms from orange-red on the outside of the tree to yellow in the middle

Flowering: Spring blooms followed by brilliant red fruit

Growing Conditions: Full sun to partial sun. A spectacular new addition for smaller home landscapes, this is a smaller accent tree that features blazing red hot seeds in late summer and fiery fall colors; more tolerant of drought and alkaline conditions

General: This narrow, upright growing deciduous tree is highlighted by its bright red Fall Color display.

Fall Color: Bright Red

Flowering: n/a

Growing Conditions: Its smaller size and great autumn color make it a good selection for the home landscape. Produces a more upright growth than many of the maples.

Scientific Name: Acer Capillipes, Snake Bark Maple

Common Name: Red Snake Bark Maple

Current Size: 25 gallon root ball, 6-15 ft. in height

Maturity Size/Shape:

- Height: 30-35 ft.
- Spread: 30-35 ft.
- Shape: Upright columnar

General: Usually smaller and often with multiple trunks, and a spreading crown of long, slender branches. The bark is smooth, olive-green with regular narrow vertical white stripes and small horizontal brownish lenticels; it retains its pattern to the base even on old trees.

Fall Color: Red in the fall

Flowering: Green leaves, has separated male and female flowers on the same tree (monoecious).




Growing Conditions: Full sun to partial shade.

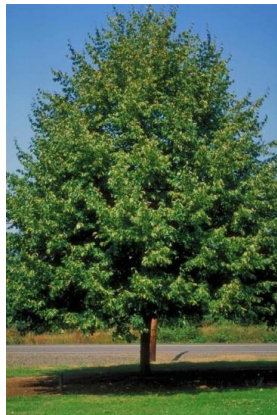

General: Small lateral branches arise from the straight, central trunk in an upswept curve and bend toward the ground as they grow older. Due to the radially produced, small diameter branches, this may be the least-maintenance cultivar. Multiple trunks and upright, large-diameter branches occasionally develop on the species and they may be poorly attached to the trunk, but this cultivar does not appear to have this problem.

Fall Color: Yellow leaves.



Flowering: Yellow flowers in June-July

Growing Conditions: The Greenspire Linden has a faster growth rate and a dense pyramidal to oval crown which casts deep shade. It is a prolific bloomer, the small fragrant flowers appearing in late June and into July. Many bees are attracted to the flowers, and the dried flowers persist on the tree for some time.
