21 PEMBROKESHIRE CARREGWASTAD POINT

Distance: 5¾ miles/9.3km Time: 2 hours Grade: Moderate

CHOSEN BY... ALISON GASTER This walk starts high

above the small market town of Fishquard and offers a coastal walk with spectacular scenery. It's easy walking to begin with, along the heather and bracken-clad. grassy clifftops. Enjoy the uninterrupted seascape views and look out for seals bobbing up and down in the shallows of the many rocky coves that you pass. The path becomes more undulating and rugged as you head round to Carregwastad Point, where a memorial commemorates the last invasion of Britain (a tapestry depicting the event can be viewed in Fishguard Town Hall), Heading inland, the

route takes you to the top of the rocky outcrop of Garnwnda, the site of a Neolithic burial mound. Take time after the walk to explore Fishguard itself. Lower Fishguard was the setting for the 1972 film adaption of Dylan Thomas' Under Milk Wood and the quaint Old Harbour is a lovely place to while away the time.

Start

From the parking area, join the coastal path heading north. The route is well signposted and defined.

2½ miles/4 km The path drops steeply into the wooded valley of Cwm Felin and climbs again to reach



Carregwastad Point. Pause here to enjoy the coastal views before retracing your steps back down and up Cwm Felin.

Turn R through a small gate and follow the path away from the coast through pleasant open scrub to a further gate. Cross the open area of grassland leading onto a hedge-lined track. Go through small gate at end and straight across the field to a metal gate to the L of a large rocky outcrop.

Go through gate at end and continue on a stony track which curves round to join a lane. Walk up the lane with the rocky outcrop of Garnwnda in view ahead of you. Turn R along a tarmac track signed to Garn Gron and Garn Fach. Pass to the L of the second cottage.

Go through a wooden gateway and turn L to climb to the top of the Garnwnda between high gorse bushes, passing the massive slabs of the ancient burial chamber just shy of the top. The climb is well worth it for the spectacular panoramic view. Look along to the Pen Caer Lighthouse on the coast, bevond Carreqwastad Point in one direction, and across to the Preselli Hills in the other. At the top, bear R to a second rocky outcrop. Continue over it and bend L. looking for a gate and undefined path to take you off the outcrop. Descend down a narrow path to a lane.

4¼ miles/6.8 km Walk down the lane and bear R at the end to join the main lane. At T- junction continue ahead onto a stony bridle track

[•] 4³/₄ miles/7.6km

Just beyond stables, turn L at a T-junction of paths. The track widens into a stony bridle track. Go through farmvard and continue ahead on lane. At end, turn L onto Harbour Village Road back to the start.
