VALE BWMCA HONORARY LIFE MEMBER

ROBYN EDWARDS

This spirit of community, for which Buderim is so well known, and indeed what draws new residents to live in this area, does not happen without those individuals who have a firm belief in, and love of their community. Without their leadership and their vision for the growth of this community and its spirit, this would be just a growing suburb on the Sunshine Coast.

Dear Robyn Edwards who passed away on the 6th May following a long battle with cancer was one of those leaders who possessed a vision for the future and had a total commitment to the Buderim community in so many areas.

Originally from South Australia, Robyn and George, daughter Sue and son Robert moved to Buderim in the 1970s and bought Buderim Electricals. During this time, Robyn became involved in the Friends of the Buderim Hall, a group established by Coral Goodsir, to raise funds to renovate the original School of Arts. It would be no surprise to anyone who knew Robyn to learn that she had worked for some years for a major pharmaceutical company leading a team of "her girls" in the cosmetic field. Robyn was always immaculately dressed, and perfectly groomed no matter the occasion or meeting.

In 1999, Robyn retired and joined the Friends of Buderim, taking over the reins of Treasurer from Marilyn Harch. Her bookkeeping skills were always accurate, with even the smallest detail recorded very precisely. The Friends raised a substantial amount of funds for the BWMCA holding a large number of events. Apart from raising money, Robyn worked hard for Australia Day events funded by the Council, Anzac Days, jumble sales for bushfires and floods, and a variety of social functions which all contributed to the Buderim community spirit. Two cookbooks alone raised in excess of \$200,000 and seeing these proceeds grow in her account books, gave her as treasurer, much pleasure.

When Bart's Land (now the Buderim Village Park), was put up for sale and purchased by an English development company, Robyn was the BWMCA's representative working with the Council to achieve the best possible outcome for public space within the development. This all folded, but subsequently the Council did purchase most of the original Bart's Land and developed the beautiful parkland space we all enjoy today.

Robyn became Vice Chair of the BWMCA and was an outstanding manager of the OPO always setting her high standards. This was always appreciated by those who worked beside her. Robyn's involvement with the Buderim War Memorial Hall committee was extraordinary as she set in motion great improvements for this building. With funds raised by the Friends, Robyn was very pleased to oversee installation of a new kitchen, toilets, air conditioning and the roof reinforced. Under Robyn's supervision, a Programme was organised, not only for the hall, but also other BWMCA assets.

In 2004, the BWMCA established the Buderim Foundation to provide grants to organisations which assisted the Buderim Community. Robyn was one of the six local identities appointed as Members to oversee the running of the Foundation. She served diligently in this capacity for 14 years.

The Buderim Historical Society was also fortunate to have Robyn as their Treasurer and committee member. This was another group which gave Robyn a great deal of pleasure.

Robyn's failing eye sight and poor health led to her reluctant retirement from her various community positions. Few people have contributed so much as she did, to this community for which she held such a passion.

Our beloved Grace passed away near her family on Friday, May 5 2023, aged 98 years.

Grace was a daily part of the Buderim scene walking from Millgrove Place, Mill Road area most mornings, fulfilling so many roles mostly for the betterment of 'The Village' as it was fondly known and still is.

Hopefully, her list of achievements, which I will try to briefly list, will prompt newer residents to see how we are benefitting. We all owe a debt to those far-sighted people who have given of themselves for you and your futures.

Grace acted as Secretary of the BWMCA Committee for many years, handwriting voluminous records. Future historians researching will have solid signed documents and stories to peruse, shake their heads, and say "Wow!"

It would be easier to say what Grace did not assist with in her part of the organisations.

Her contribution to the Historical Society was always solid.

The Library had assistance to meet their 'High' performance criteria.

Her exploits with the Friends of Buderim won her an international accolade as World Champion Fudge Maker. As well as providing heavily laden tables of pickles, preserves, and homemade treats. Of course, most of the fundraising went to the BWMCA over the years.

Prior to forming the local Ambulance Committee, her devotion was unquestioned, when we worked with Nambour Ambulance Station to receive procedure approvals. All this was done with typewriters and hand written documentation which was in our Station in Forest Glen.

Her home garden was always flowering or displaying something for sale at the Easter Fair and other fund raising opportunities.

We all missed Grace deeply but wished her "Well" when she accepted family urgings, moving to Yeppoon being close to them..

Assisting her first husband Mervyn during his terms as Maroochy Shire Councillor as his Real Estate Office Manager, she was always aware of the situations, and handled the issues smoothly.

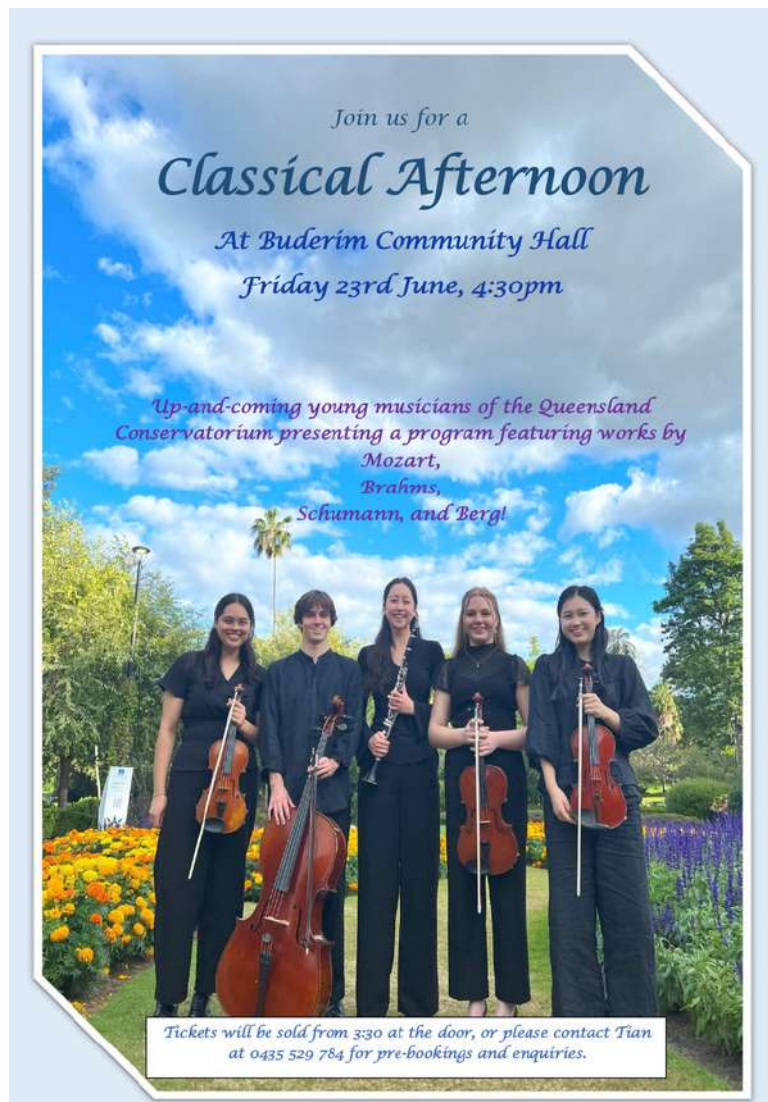
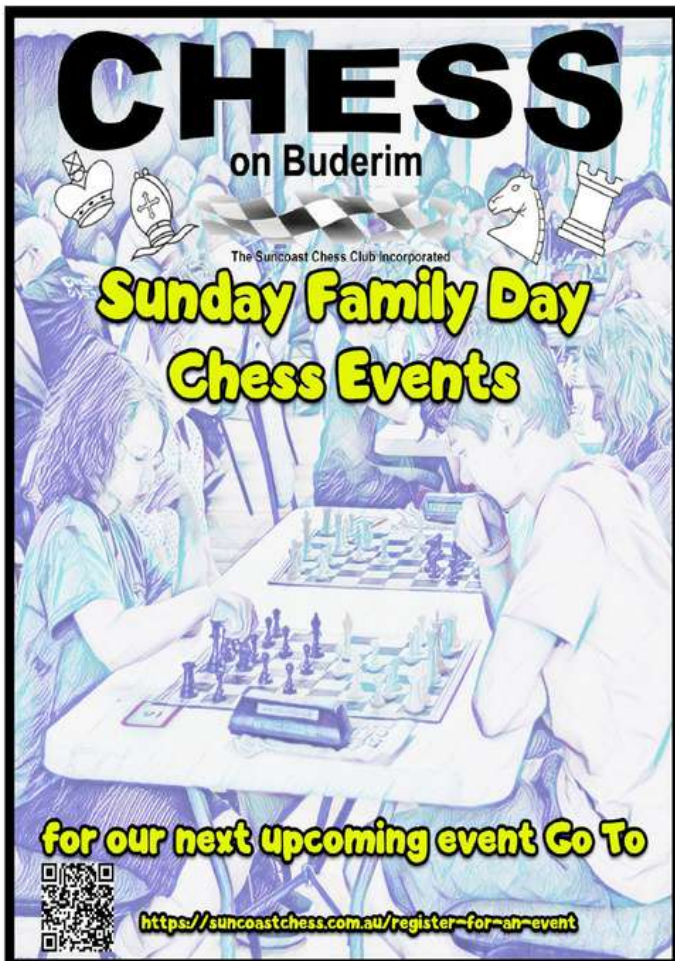

EMERITUS PROFESSOR IAN PLIMER

Public Lecture on 'Green Murder'

Ian Plimer is Emeritus Professor of Earth Sciences at the University of Melbourne. He served at the University of Newcastle (1985-1991) as Professor and Head of Geology. He was Professor of Mining Geology at The University of Adelaide (2006-2012) and in 1991 was also German Research Foundation Professor at the Ludwig Maximilians Universität, München (Germany). Green Murder is his 11th book written for the general public.

Professor Plimer is looking forward to presenting on **Green Murder** to our Sunshine Coast audience. Copies of this book and some of his other books will be available at the event.

Couple of interesting facts about Emeritus Professor Ian Plimer:

1. A new Broken Hill mineral, **Plimerite**, was named in recognition of his contribution to Broken Hill geology. Ironically, **Plimerite** is green and soft. It fractures unevenly, is brittle and insoluble in alcohol.
2. A ground-hunting rainforest spider **Austrotengella plimeri** from the Tweed Range (NSW) has been named in Professor Plimer's honour because of his "provocative contributions to issues of climate change".

Ian Plimer identifies as $ZnFe_4(PO_4)_3(OH)_5$ and demands the appropriate pronoun be used. 🧐🧐🧐

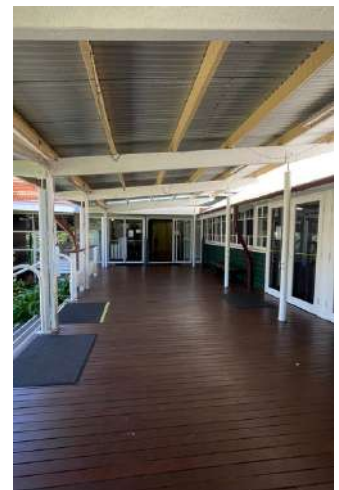

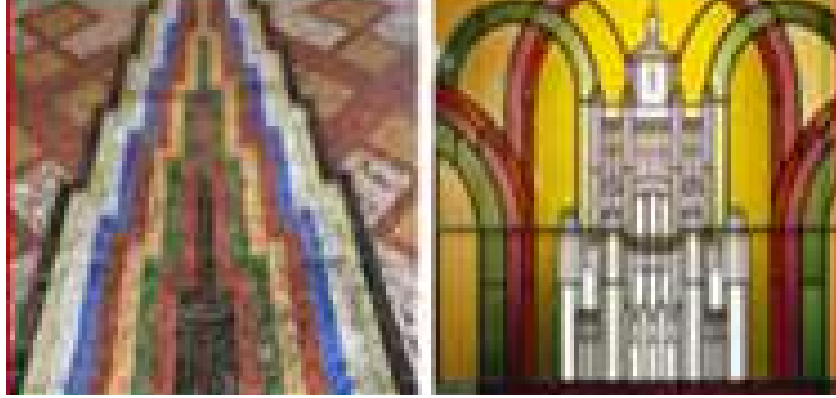

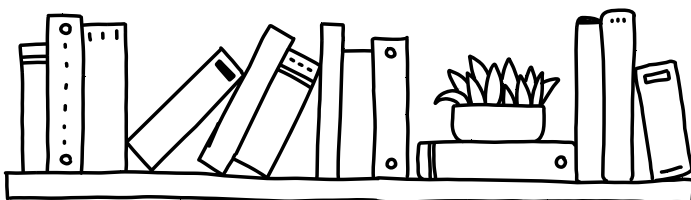

GRADUATE WOMEN QLD SUNSHINE COAST

At our bi-monthly breakfast meeting on 13th May, members and guests were engaged and challenged by our guest speaker and GWQ President, Dr the Honourable Mary Crawford OAM. Dr Crawford is in her 10th and final year as President of Graduate Women Queensland.

Dr Crawford has served her country with distinction: as a secondary teacher, a Member of Federal Parliament, and on the academic staff at QUT. Between 1987 and 1996 she was the Labor member for Forde in Federal Parliament, including holding the position of Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Housing and Regional Development. In 2008 she completed a PhD on "Gender and the Australian Parliament". Dr Crawford was made a Member of the Order of Australia in the 2020 Australia Day Honours for "significant service to women, and to the people and Parliament of Australia."

Mary spoke about the origins of Graduate Women Queensland, formed in 1920 as an affiliate of an international organisation supporting women's education and advancement. Her interesting PowerPoint slides documented the progress (or otherwise) of women's education and advancement in Queensland over the past 100 years, and the current picture, with some pertinent statistics covering issues such as school retention rates, the pattern of male and female segregation into different educational paths and different industries, the gender pay gap by areas of study, and the percentage of women in parliaments and on boards.

Locally, the Sunshine Coast branch of Graduate Women Queensland supports the education and advancement of women through a number of bursary programs. Each year our bursaries support young women undergraduates at USC, a refugee tertiary student in Brisbane, refugee students at Milpera SHS, a local indigenous woman and a graduate of STEMM.

Our next function will be our Bursary Brunch on Saturday 15th July, where we will be presenting bursaries to three outstanding young women who are currently in their undergraduate courses at UniSC.

We welcome graduate women in all disciplines from any tertiary institution to join us. As well as supporting our bursary programs, our members enjoy friendship, fellowship and intellectual stimulation through regular breakfast speakers, occasional morning teas, book groups and informal social events. Buderim & Birtinya Ambulance Stations

Covid disrupted our very successful school children's CPRA training sessions. Illness and deaths of executive members forced us to pass our funds over as well as cease operations until we were allowed to regroup.

We are getting close to establishing our committee to oversee our possible many different options and functions.

We enlist Sunshine Coast University Paramedic Trainees for staffing many of our sessions. Our trainers have given sessions to all ages, to area residents, organisations, schools, clubs, and retirement villages at virtually NO charge.

Prior to lockdown, Buderim was closely co-operating with Cooroy & Distract LAC to obtain a CPRA specially modified "Retiring" Ambulance fully fitted for training purposes. The BWMCA has seen this in operation at Australia Day Festivities and wishes to support this acquisition I believe.

Buderim Pilot Committee has placed on the Agenda list for the first full meeting that we trial what is common overseas for putting AED equipment in public places. It would be available 24/7 to everyone.

We did a verbal survey prior to closure locating many of these units locally but at many times of the day or night access is limited.

The children's programs would have to be regenerated but with the enthusiasm shown from our previous efforts should be a matter of a phone call saying we are ready to repeat the very rewarding sessions all around.

This should also apply to Mooloolaba Lions Club who had arranged for us to have a monthly stand at their Fisherman's Road Sunday Market where average attendance is between 4 to 5 thousand people.

For groups or service clubs, visitations can be arranged to the Ambulance Station at Birtinya which is most informative to see what is behind the service you receive at a phone call. Buderim Station has a proud record and is great but modern facility has more to observe and contemplate.

We are seeking a Secretary and some Ordinary Members positions may also be available. It is optional if you wish do the CPRA Training course.

We have huge support from the QAS Special CPRA Section which has grown over the Years from the Nucleus, locally generated, now given credence across Queensland.

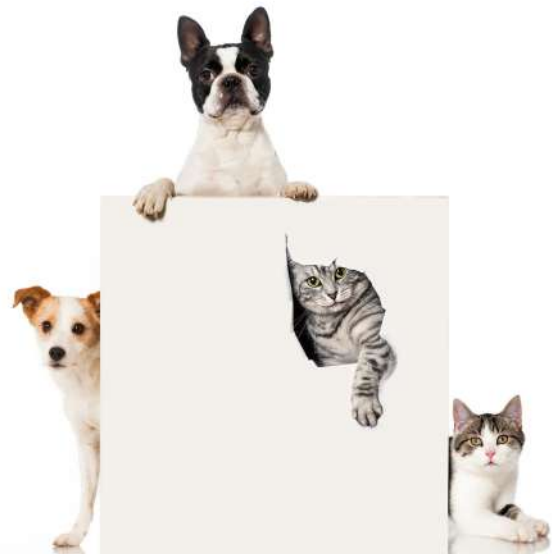
He does still need a little training so his perfect home would be with someone who can dedicate some time towards Jack growing to his full potential. How could you resist the cuteness overload?
