What a season! During pre-season we ran several courses in ART, Spinal and First Aid in conjunction with Jan Juc. It was great to work together with the team at Juc to mutually benefit and I hope that these relationships can continue into the future. I would like to thank Davina Jackson, Daryl Moss and Aaron Green for making our collaborations so successful. 15 members took up these opportunities to upskill and top up our patrol standard for the upcoming season.

We also had 5 members attend the LSV Advanced Lifesaving Camp (Will Popovic, Ben Harris, Jaime Patterson, Stephen Christofi, Jacob Morgan) with 3 of these members attaining their Gold Medallion as part of the Camp. We are hoping to continue the good record of members attending this camp, and I encourage anyone interested to get in touch with myself or any other former participant.

Our U14 SRC Course had 17 participants, who were extremely engaged and hard working in their pursuit to become fully fledged lifesavers. They were a pleasure to instruct and I look forward to sustained growth in this area of the club. Special thanks to Tahl Collinson, Abbey Harman and Remony Reid for their hard work with this group.

Our annual Bronze Camp was a huge success, with 26 candidates qualifying. All candidates have attended patrols and should be congratulated for their efforts. We also ran our concurrent Silver Camp which helps some of our emerging members achieve their Advanced Awards in IRB Crew, ART and Spinal. Hopefully we will see some of those members step up into roles with the Australian Lifeguard Service and leadership roles in our patrols. A huge vote of thanks goes to Martin Crellin and Emma Viney for co-ordinating what I will confidently say was the best ever Bronze Camp. Our instructors must also be given an enormous vote of thanks for their patience and persistence to keep alive the tradition of what I believe is the best Bronze Camp in the state. You are what makes the week so great, and are the ones who the candidates aspire to become like, and you should be really proud of that.

Highlights from the week included a panel discussion with the Victorian Lifesaver of the Year, Heath Armstrong; LSV Building Leaders Scholar, Grace Lightfoot; and Molokai to Oahu competitor Ollie Butler, the ever popular Amazing Race around Torquay, the infamous morning PT sessions ("did someone say Jan Juc stairs?") and the lifelong friendships made and strengthened each year amongst Bronzies, Silvers and Instructors alike.

We also ran our second year of the St. Kevin's College Bronze Medallion Program in March, which was superbly coordinated by Miles Ranogajec and Holly Mashford. They battled challenging weather to produce a great week which was well regarded by participants and the school alike. 30 Year 11 students from the school joined the club, completed their Bronze and several have started patrolling.

I would like to thank all of the staff at LSV Volunteer Training for all of their help, and everyone within the Training and Assessment Group who have assisted with courses this year. You are all doing amazing things.

2019 JIM WALL *with Terry Wall*

The Jim Wall Ironman was held at Torquay surf beach on Sunday January 13th, and is the longest running ironman event in the world. The event started as the Jim Wall "Surfathon" in 1962, and was conceived by the Torquay Surf Club to test all round surf and water ability, with an endurance format including swimming, board and ski paddling and beach running – all uniquely without a break. It is believed to be the first continuous ironman event ever staged, in the format that has now become standard.

The Surf Coast Times 2019 event had fields of 25 men and nine women raced over an M-shaped layout drawn for a ski-board-run-swim sequence, Torquay SLSC featuring on the podium in both the men's and women's events..

Matt Gillings (Northcliffe) won the ironman event ahead of Jesse Coulson (Ocean Grove) and Archie Vernon (Torquay). In the ironwoman event, Manly's Naomi Scott defended her 2018 title, taking the win ahead of Sophie Thomas (now Warrnambool, but possibly still claimed by Torquay!) and Grace Harris (Torquay). Both winners have local links, Gillings was at Ocean Grove but moved to the Gold Coast and currently leads the Ocean 6 swim category, Scott's grandmother lives in Torquay and proudly watched.

Last year the event was part of the Ocean6 Series, this year it was good to see a lot of Victorians who normally wouldn't have otherwise entered. Locals included our Archie Vernon, as a 17-year-old, taking on Matt Gillings. The women's event had changing leaders, Sophie Thomas making up almost a minute in the swim, and Grace Harris' superb board leg could have stolen the race.

This year the club ran the ironman and also separate swim and paddling events in the afternoon following an LSV carnival completed in the morning. It showed the club at its best at all levels- offering interest events, cheering on competing members, those who officiated and helped did a great job on the beach, the old guys manned the BBQ, and life members mingled with sponsors in the club.

The event honours the late Jim Wall who was the 2nd Club President from 1950 to 1963. During this time he was on the organising committee when the Torquay club hosted the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships and Olympic Carnival in 1956. With Torquay local David Strahan winning this prestigious event 14 times, Jim Wall's son Terry was victorious in 1964 and 1965.

A huge thank you to Ian Burch who has retired as honorary architect, after 50 years. He was responsible for the design of the existing club house and is now passing the baton to Geoff Croker (architect) who has joined the building subcommittee along with Dennis Hogan (surveyor) and Noel Dubberley (builder) to address renovations and extensions.



I also commend Ken Godfrey on his outstanding work over the past 20 years. He has done a remarkable job in maintaining the building and attending to compliance requirements of local and state authorities, along with Damien Horan.

The maintenance program could not be addressed without the assistance of Rob McCallister, Ed Beacham, John Muhlebach and all those members who helped in the September working bee. Major works carried out were replacement of windows, new vinyl to the kiosk, a remote to the craft roller door, fridge and compressor audit/repairs, installation of a deep fryer, window replacement and roof repairs, sewer blockage and pump out, and numerous other maintenance items. The U23 Mens Pirates were very stiff in taking the Bronze Medal in red hot competition. 3rd in the world is a great result
- **Victorian Masters Titles Lorne Feb 2019**, in the Ladies Masters 140 Neil Heathcote's "All Form" took Gold and in the Ladies Masters 180 Scott Hastie's "Cosys" took Bronze, a great result for Torquay
- **Victorian State Titles Warrnambool March 2019**, what a great weekend we had down at Warrnambool, 5 Gold. 2 Silver. 2 Bronze, without a doubt the "Premier Surf Boat Club"
- **Australian SLSA Titles Sth Broadbeach April 2019**, we have our first Gold Medalists in the 140+ Women's Masters Division. Torquay "All Form", the girls were fantastic in the challenging surf and have done us all proud. We also captured a Bronze medal in the Open Woman's Division in another outstanding achievement. To make a final in any open division is amazing but for these girls its 2 years in a row this time with a Bronze Australian medal. Next year the Gold! Well done Lightning. You do us and your club proud. Not to be outdone the Pirates made the U23 Men's Final again but were smashed early and never really had a chance in challenging surf. The U19 Buoyo's were eliminated in the Semis by the smallest of margins after Jackson took a swim when they bounced over a monster on the way out. They both should be ever so proud of their Australian rankings Pirates 6th and Buoyo's 4th overall. Together with Lightning ranked 8th we have 3 crews in the top 10 in Australia.

The Nipper Camp at Lorne was again a huge success. It was attended by nearly 100 Nippers and their families on the weekend of 16-18 November. During February 2019, 25 life savers from around Australia and New Zealand were selected to take part in the 2019 Surf Life Saving Australia (SLSA) National Leadership College. Our backgrounds and experiences differed vastly, but we shared in common a passion for the surf life saving movement and a vision to see it remain a strong and viable community asset.

The high calibre of keynote speakers were crucial in building on the key leadership concepts. Mel Evans (ING Bank), Graeme Ford (President, SLSA) and Rob McNeil (NSW Fire and Rescue) spoke to daring to lead, leading organisations through change and extreme leadership. A highlight was the presentation on intra-personal leadership from Harriet Brown, who implored participants to “treat yourself like you treat your friends” and to understand that “nerves are a sign you are ready to achieve”. These words are especially pertinent to the key elements in which we are involved in volunteer surf life saving, where we face competing demands and desires from the organisation and our personal lives alongside many high pressure situations.

These sessions were the key foundation to further discussions where experiences were shared, goals discussed and future plans charted. Being surrounded by 24 highly motivated and capable individuals with varying perspectives was simultaneously humbling and infectious. It also challenged us all to re-consider our ways of perceiving and evaluating situations to become more balanced and mindful people. These strong relationships formed have continued to strengthen in the months since, with a large group reconvening at ‘The Aussies’ on the Gold Coast to share wins, losses, hopes and dreams.

I would particularly like to thank Kevin Larkins for encouraging me to apply, the club and the M&LD Department from Life Saving Victoria for their support of my application, as well as the team from SLSA who facilitated the experience. It truly was a life changing experience, the lessons from which I practice each and every day.

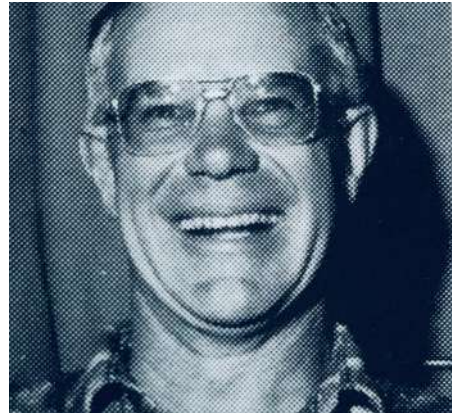


Tony Fraser

Tony was elected vice-captain in 1965-67, (Director Life Saving) Competitively, he rowed for seven seasons in A , B and C crews, was in the Beach relay team and Club Beach Sprint champion in 1965. He had 35 seasons patrolling our beach, creating a record doing our primary function. A superlative career in Life Saving culminated in Life Membership in 2013.

John joined Torquay in January 1977 having transferred from Jan Juc where he passed the Bronze Medallion in April 1965. He patrolled our beach for nine years being a Patrol Captain. John was an ideal partner for Bryan Hayden on the double ski. When Torquay was one of the strongest clubs in the country in the craft area he won the state single ski title on his home beach in 1978. Bobbie 'Dicko' Dickenson

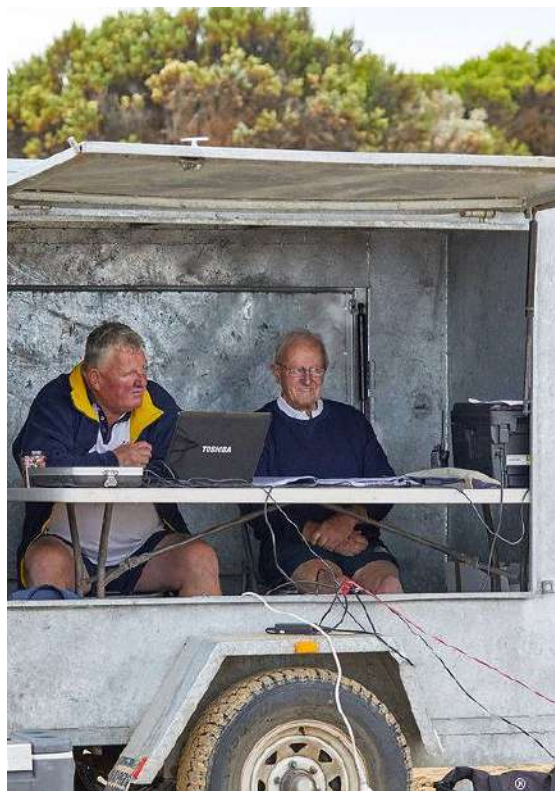
