This plant forms a vigorous, large bush, which throws out short runners, averaging eighteen inches. The flowers commence to come as soon as the plant nears complete development, and at the time it is in full bloom the entire plant, including the runners, is a blaze of color. The large, golden-yellow semi-double flowers average two and one-half to three inches across. They are borne on erect, stiff stems six inches in length. Consequently the flowers stand well above the foliage, an arrangement which adds immeasurably to the showy appearance of the plant.

When well grown these flowers have the appearance of a fully double flower, and are most attractive. An ordinary sized bouquet, when allowed to remain in a room for a short period of time will fill the room with musk-like fragrance. Heretofore Double Nasturtiums have been only propagated by cuttings. 50 seeds 60c; 100 seeds \$1.00,

ACROCLINIUM ROSEUM

Double Giant Mixture. These pretty graceful flowers are too little known in American gardens; they are attractive in bouquets and may also be dried like *Helichrysum* for winter decoration. This large-flowering type is twice the size of the old one, with long stiff stems; flowers are double and semi-double; white, chamois, flesh color and bright rose; about $\frac{3}{4}$ of the seed will bring the large-flowering type; the smaller older type is also attractive. Trade pkt., 50c; $\frac{1}{4}$ oz., \$1.00; oz., \$3.00.

AGERATUM

Mexicanum Nanum Compactum. Blue Ball. New deep, dark blue. The plant is dwarf and symmetrical in shape and when in full bloom is literally covered with small flowers giving the appearance of a closely formed blue ball. Trade pkt., 15c; oz., 80c.

Mexicanum Nanum Compactum. Blue Cap. The flowers are much larger than those of Little Blue Star and of a deeper and richer color. It also surpasses Blue Ball in dwarfness and compactness of habit and the regular form of its inflorescence. Surprise "Salmongold." An entirely new color and new form. When starting to flower the blossom is a pure salmon-yellow color. The fully developed blossom shows a radiating salmon-pink shade. The single blossom is $2\frac{3}{4}$ to $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter, of a noble, circular form. The blossoms resemble to a certain degree the Peony flowered type with the long-stems of the American Beauty. Coronaria Creagh Castle Strain. Of Irish origin. It belongs to the St. Brigid variety which is well known. The flowers are extremely large and the range color exceptional. Trade pkt., \$1.00.

CHRYSANTHEMUM

Maximum Conqueror. (Victor.) This new variety produces very large, pure white flowers, five inches in diameter, borne on long stiff stems, produced in profusion. The blooming takes place in about mid-season and it is one of the, if not the best variety for cutting on the market. Trade pkt., 25c; ¼ oz., 35c; oz., \$1.20.

COREOPSIS

Diadem (Grandiflora Auriculata Superba). Its large single flowers, several tones deeper than the well-known Grandiflora, measuring 3 inches across, are borne on long stiff stems. A serrated band of brownish-red encircles the golden disc. Trade pkt., 25c; ¼ oz., 50c; oz., \$1.60.

CAMPANULA

Fragilis. Is of prostrate trailing habit, and has large pale blue flowers. It likes a well-drained position with as little moisture as possible. Extremely free-blooming (not hardy). Trade pkt., 50c.

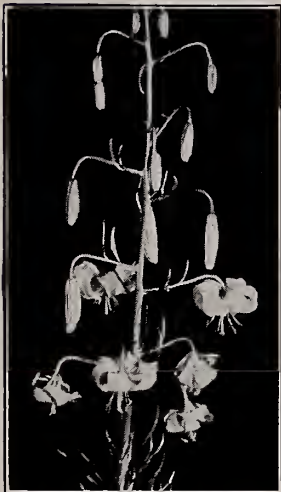

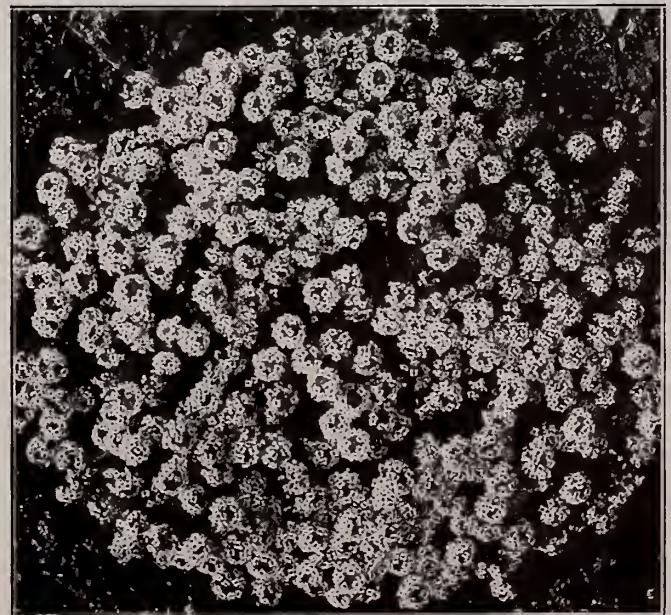

Ornamental grasses are valuable for mixing with flowers (like Gypsophila and Saponaria Vaccaria) or for drying for winter. They are easily grown from seeds. Sow thinly, where they are to remain, that allows the plants to branch and produce many sprays.
