#### FIRST SESSION

At BIRMINGHAM and within the Central Hall, on Monday, the 2nd day of May 1977 at 3 o'clock p.m.

Thanks to the Retiring Moderator On the motion of the Revd Jeffrey Yates the Assembly resolved to record its thanks to the Revd R.J.Hall for the service he had rendered to the United Reformed Church as Moderator. He handed to Mrs Hall a token of the Assembly's recognition of the part she had played throughout the year. This expression of thanks was received with acclamation as was Mr. Hall's reply.

The Assembly then adjourned to meet again in the same place at 9.45 am for ordinary business and the session was closed with the singing of a hymn and the Benediction.

TUESDAY, 3rd MAY, 1977

#### SECOND SESSION

The General Assembly again convened and was led in worship by the Revd David Jenkins, Moderator's Chaplain.

Order of Business The Chairman, the Revd H. Stanley Ross, presented the report of the Business Committee, setting out its recommendations as to the order of business. On his motion the proposed Order was approved.

The Revd Boris Anderson, on behalf of the World Church and Mission Department, introduced representatives of Overseas Churches, namely

They were received by the Moderator on behalf of all the representatives, the Revd Theodor Herzer expressed the greetings of the Overseas Churches

#### EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The report of the Executive Committee was submitted by the Revd R.J.Hall who paid tribute to the service of two retiring Provincial Moderators, the Revd C.A. Haig and the Revd W.J. Samuel, to the memory of several ex-Moderators and Presidents who had died during the year and to the special service of the late Sir Sydney Caffyn and Mr Kenneth Thorndyke.

On his motion the Report was received and the following resolutions were agreed:

- The Assembly appoints the Revd Michael Fortescue Hubbard as Moderator of the South West Province for a period of seven years from September 1st 1977.
- 2. The Assembly re-appoints the Revd Ronald Ernest Taylor as Moderator of the Eastern Province for a period of one year from September 1977.
- The Assembly appoints the Revd Dr John Ivor Morgans as Moderator of the Province of Wales for a period of seven years from September 1st 1977.
- The Assembly thanks the Revd W.J. Samuel and the Revd C.A. Haig for their service to the Church as Moderators of the Welsh and South-West Provinces respectively.

The Revds C.A.Haig and W.J.Samuel were received by the Moderator and each addressed the Assembly.

- 5. The Assembly, noting that the following proposed revisions of the Basis of Union have been considered by Synods and Districts and approved by the Assembly of 1976 resolves that the Basis be now revised as follows:
  - 1. Add the following new paragraph to Functions of the District Councils at p.24 of the Manual:
    - 9(3) (xix) to make recommendations to the Synod for appointment to service on District Council of
    - (i) URC ministers/laymen serving as
      - (a) Full-time Chaplains to Universities, Colleges, Hospitals, Factories, where their work is seen to be an extension of the ministry of the District concerned;
      - (b) Secretaries and other full-time officials of ecumenical bodies with which the URC is in relationship.
    - (ii) URC ministers giving significant oversight to local churches, under the general direction of the Council concerned.
    - (iii) Ministers of other Churches appointed to serve on behalf of the URC in charge of a UR Church or in an ecumenical group including URC interests.
      - (iv) Ministers not in pastoral charge who perform duties within the District in respect of which the Council has some direct responsibility.
  - Add the following new paragraph to the Functions of Synods at the bottom of page 26 of the Manual:
    - 9(4) (xvii) To appoint at its discretion additional members to serve on District Councils in accordance with recommendations made by such Councils under the provisions of paragraph 9(3) (xix) above.

This and the following resolution received the required two-thirds vote.

6. The Assembly noting that proposals to increase the local church representation on Districts and Synod by changing paragraphs 9(3)c and 9(4)c in the Basis of Union to read as follows:

201-400 members	2 representatives
401-600 members	3 representatives
601-800 members	4 representatives
over 800 members	5 representatives

have been discussed in Districts and Synods, resolves subject to confirmation by the Assembly of 1978 to amend the Basis of Union accordingly.

On the motion of the Revd R.J.Hall, seconded by the Revd A.L.Macarthur, a further reclution was then moved and adopted by the Assembly.

7. The Assembly takes note of proposals emanating from an ecumenical group called together by the Archbishop of Canterbury concerning a national initiative in Evangelism and encourages the Executive Committee to consider these proposals and to make such positive response as it deems appropriate.

#### NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE

The first report of the Nominations Committee was presented by the Revd A.J.Walker.

Mr Walker referred to the service rendered in past years by Mr T.S.Byatt as Chairman of Tellers. Mrs P.Evans was appointed Chairman for this Assembly. On the motion of Mr Walker, Tellers for the election of the Moderator for 1978 were appointed as follows: Mr Martin Ballard, Dr Clyde Binfield, Mrs Jeanne Jones.

- 1. The appointment of the Revd Iorwerth Thomas as Personnel Secretary in the World Church and Mission Department was welcomed, to take effect from June 1st 1977.
- Mr Norman Hart was nominated as Editor of Reform to take up office on September 15th, 1977 and on the decision of Assembly he was appointed for a period of five years.
- Miss Janet E. Booth was nominated and elected to take up work as Secretary for Communication in the World Church and Mission Department as from 1st September 1977, to serve in the first instance until August 31st, 1982.
- The Revd A.G.Burnham was nominated and appointed to serve as Chairman of the Deployment Committee until the Assembly of 1983 in succession to the Revd P.McCall.
- The Assembly re-appointed the Revd E.W. Todd as Secretary of the Finance and Administration Department 'for a period of one year from September 1st , 1977.

The Assembly asked the Central Committee of the Finance and Administration Department to bring to the Executive Committee not later than November 1977 proposals for the staffing of that Department from the summer of 1978, and authorised the Executive Committee to make such arrangements in the light of that report as it deems right.

- The Assembly re-appointed the Revd J.P. Reardon as Secretary of the Church and Society Department for a period of five years from September 1st 1977.
- 7. The Assembly re-appointed the Revd M.J.Davies as Youth Secretary in the Church Life Department for a period of five years from September 1st, 1977.
- 8. The Assembly appointed Chairmen and Secretaries of Committees as set out in paragraphs 2 and 3 of the Report.

#### DEPLOYMENT COMMITTEE

The report of the Deployment Committee was presented by the Revd P.McCall, Chairman, and on his motion the report was received.

Questions were asked, and answered by the Chairman, and on his motion the following resolution was moved with the deletion from the printed notice of the words 'and Special Ministries'. After discussion the resolution was then passed as follows:

 The Assembly accepts the quotas of full-time pastorates allocated to each of the Provinces as set forth in the Table shown in the Addendum and calls upon Provinces to work towards these target quotas during the next two years.

The following resolution was then approved:

The Assembly charges the Committee to take cognisance of any alterations or developments within the life of each Province, and to adapt its quota system to such changes as they occur. It also directs that such revisions be made at all times in consultation with the Provinces concerned.

The Moderators' Report was presented by the Revd R.E.Taylor. On his motion and after discussion the Assembly took note of the Report.

Synod Resolution The Revd R.W. : lugh Jones seconded by Mr R.A. Heritage and on behalf of the West Midlands Province, moved:

The Assembly receives the recommendation of the West Midlands Province that initial nominations for Moderator of General Assembly should be made by Synods and forwarded to the General Secretary. That voting on the final list of nominees be by District Councils, each having one vote which would be returned to the General Secretary, the final result to be announced at the General Assembly.

The Assembly authorises the Executive Committee to make the appropriate alterations to the Rules of Procedure with effect for the election of the Moderator of the Assembly of 1979.

On being put to the vote this resolution was lost.

The Clerk read the request of the Eastern Province for the transfer of Thaxted URC from the Cambridge to the Chelmsford District, and on his formal motion this was agreed.

#### APPLICATIONS COMMITTEE

The report of the Applications Committee was submitted by the Revd H.M. Springbett, Chairman, and was received. On his motion the following resolutions were agreed:

- The Assembly receives the churches of Ebenezer Pontnewynydd; Keystone and Nolton Haven in Pembrokeshire and the Ecumenical Church of Woughton and Milton Keynes as local churches of the United Reformed Church.
- The Assembly remits the application to leave the United Reformed Church by the Church at Bursleden, received through the Wessex Province, to the Applications Committee upon whose report the Executive Committee is authorised to take action.

The session was adjourned at 12.45 p.m.

The Assembly resumed its business at 3 p.m.

Minutes The Clerk submitted the minutes of the first session which were approved.

#### CHURCH LIFE DEPARTMENT

The report of the Church Life Department was introduced by the Revd Dr Kenneth Slack, and on his motion the Report was received and discussed in relation to its various sections. The Assembly proceeded to the consideration of the resolutions submitted by the Department and the following, which was introduced by Miss Sue Stevenson and the Revd J.E. Mather, was adopted:

 The Assembly welcomes the FURY project <u>fending for fife</u> and urges District Councils and local churches to give young people every help and encouragement to participate.

On the following resolution being moved, an amendment in the name of Mr.Philip Woods and the Revd C.K. Meachin for the inclusion of the words 'and surpass' and 'this year' was accepted, and in its amended form the resolution was adopted:

The Assembly notes the concern of FURY at the effect of cuts in sterling grants to overseas churches through CWM and urges all local churches to make every effort to meet and surpass their Unified Appeal target this year.

The following was then agreed:

3. The Assembly welcomes the initiative of FURY in planning a celebration of 5th Anniversary of the Union, October 7th-9th, 1977 and asks Districts and local churches to co-operate in making this a meaningful event in the life of the Church and to encourage groups of young people to attend.

The section of the report concerning the Children's Committee was introduced by the Revd Donald Hilton and the following resolutions were then adopted:

 The Assembly draws attention to the discussion paper Ministry to Children - 2: Worshipping Together as a guide to those seeking to integrate children and adults more fully in worship.

- 5. This Assembly draws the attention of Provinces and Districts to the paper Christian Education a Checklist and invites Councils and Synods to use it as a basis for their work in this field.
- 6. The Assembly, accepting that responsibility for the nurture of children in the Christian Faith is primarily that of the Church, draws the attention of local churches to the discussion paper: Ministry to Children 3: Nurturing in the Faith.

Attention was then given to the report regarding the Ministerial Training Committee and the following resolutions adopted:

- 7. The Assembly approves of the setting up of a Central Training Grants Committee, and encourages the various Trust Funds, and the member churches through the Unified Appeal, to make available sufficient money to provide for the training of accepted candidates for the ministry of the URC.
- The Assembly reaffirms that a Synod, after receiving reports from the Districts and the Assessment Conference decides whether or not a candidate be accepted for the URC ministry.
- The Assembly agrees that the Assessment Conference be given the responsibility
  of recommending to the Provinces the type of course and the College most suitable for each candidate.
- 10. The Assembly agrees that each Assessment Conference be staffed by 8 assessors, at least two of whom should be members of the teaching staffs of the recognised Colleges who, in addition to the normal assessment interviews, would interview each of the candidates and make recommendations concerning their training, should the candidates be accepted by the Provinces.
- 11. The Assembly agrees that the list of Assessors be revised to include members of the teaching staffs of the Colleges, and also some persons with expert knowledge of personnel selection.
- 12. The Assembly grants the request of the Cheshunt Governors that the Revd Dr Stephen Mayor be recognised by the Assembly as the Cheshunt Professor of Pastoral Studies in Westminster College, and that the guarantee of his salary and allowances for an initial period of five years be accepted with thanks to Cheshunt Governors.
- 13. The Assembly records the outstanding contribution made by New College, London, its staff and students over many generations, dating back to 1673, and in particular at this time receives with appreciation and thanks the retiring members of staff:

The Principal Revd Dr Charles Duthie (appointed 1964)

The Revd Dr Geoffrey Nuttall (Lecturer in Church History) (appointed 1945)

The Secretary, Miss Margaret Canning (appointed 1949)

and notes that the New College Trust which is being set up is intended to provide financial assistance for Ministerial and Lay Training.

Those named in this resolution were received by the Moderator and with warm acclamation, and at his invitation the Revd Dr Charles Duthie responded and spoke to the Assembly of the important contribution New College has made to the Churches throughout its long history.

14. The Assembly receives, and expresses its thanks for their significant services to the Church in the training of our ministers:

The Principal Revd Dr George Caird

The Principal Revd Dr Edgar Jones

The Revd J.E. Newport, ex President of Cheshunt College

This was also passed with acclamation and those named were received and thanked by the Moderator.

15. The Assembly receives and recognises as teachers of our ministry the newly appointed Principals and Lecturers of our recognised Colleges:

The Revd Eric Hull, Principal-elect of Manchester College
Dr Donald Sykes, Principal-elect of Mansfield College, Oxford
The Revd Dr Stephen Mayor, Cheshunt Professor of Pastoral Studies at
Westminster College, Cambridge

The Revd Dr Stanley Russell, Lecturer in Theology, Manchester
The Revd Roger Tomes, Lecturer-elect in Old Testament, Manchester College.

Amidst applause the Moderator received those newly appointed Principals and Teachers and wished them well in their work.

The following resolution was moved by the Revd R.O. Latham formally and seconded by the Revd A.L. Macarthur:

That having considered the request from District and Province that Miss P.M. Cordon be ordained, and Assembly authorises the Gloucester District Council to arrange for her ordination and further asks the Ministerial Training Committee to investigate the conditions under which ordination may be offered to local pastors on the official register and to report.

The Revd C.A. Haig moved as an amendment the deletion of all the words after 'her ordination'. This was seconded by the Revd N. Birnie.

At this point the Assembly adjourned.

The Assembly resumed its business at 6 p.m.

On the suggestion of the Moderator and with the agreement of the movers of the motion and the amendment, it was agreed that this matter be dealt with in two parts. The movers of the motion asked, and the Assembly agreed, that the first part should include the words 'to the ministry of Word and Sacrament'. It was then put in the following form and was carried:

16. That having considered the request from District and Province that Miss P.M. Cordon be ordained, the Assembly authorises the Gloucester District Council to arrange for her ordination to the ministry of Word and Sacraments.

The second half of the resolution was then put and agreed as follows:

17. The Assembly asks the Ministerial Training Committee to investigate the conditions under which ordination may be offered to local pastors on the official register and to report.

The sections of the report dealing with the Ministry of Healing and of the Working Party on Chaplains and Students were introduced by the Revd C.K. Meachin and the Chairman of the Department and were received.

The section of the report on Doctrine and Worship was introduced by Dr J. Huxtable.

Attention was drawn to a misprint in paragraph 48 where 'or' should be 'nor' and further that the punctuation in paragraph 52 should be altered in line 3 and the semi-colon after 'God wills' be altered into a comma.

The following resolution was then moved:

18. The Assembly receives the Statement on Ordination prepared by the Doctrine and Worship Committee as a valuable contribution to our understanding of Ordination. An amendment moved by Professor Buick Knox, seconded by the Revd Kate Chegwin, to substitute 'an interim' for 'a valuable' on being put to the vote was lost. After further discussion the resolution was carried. Two further resolutions were then moved and passed:

- 19. The Assembly instructs the Doctrine and Worship Committee to consider Schedule 'C' with a view to its revision to avoid unnecessary repetition.
- The Assembly commends to ministers and churches the orders of worship published by its Church Life Department.

#### WORKING PARTY ON STRUCTURES

The report of the Working Party on Structures of the URC was moved by the Revd Ronald Bocking, supported by the Revd Malcolm Hanson, and was received.

The following resolutions were then moved and adopted:

- 1. The Assembly receives the Report.
- 2. The Assembly urges all Councils and Committees of the Church to keep in mind the need for full consultation with all concerned before decisions are taken, in the terms of paragraph 10 of the Scheme of Union, which reads:

'Decisions on the part of any Council shall be reached only after the fullest attempt has been made to discover the mind of the other Councils or of local churches likely to be affected by the decision'.

- The Assembly encourages Synods and District Councils to make full use of the flexibility implicit in the Scheme of Union so that structures may be adapted to local needs.
- 4. The Assembly asks Synods to keep their committee structures under review so as to ensure that Assembly reports and District Council business can be dealt with quickly and efficiently.
- 5. The Assembly encourages Synods to maintain a Synod Office which can provide assistance both to the Provincial Moderator and to the Synod Clerk. The appointment of a Personal or Administrative Assistant is desirable, but where such an appointment is made Synods should clarify the Assistant's responsibilities in relation to the Moderator and the Synod Clerk.
- 6. The Assembly instructs its Committees wherever possible to keep in close touch with their corresponding Synod Committees and to provide them with information and stimulus as well as seeking their help.
- The Assembly instructs the Business Committee to consider the question of corresponding members to the Assembly and the possibility of inviting observers from other major Churches in England and Wales.
- 8. The Assembly instructs its officers to pursue the propositions in the Report on Organisation at Church House, and particularly to consider the co-ordination of material from Church House, Assembly Committees, etc. for Synods and local churches, with a view to
  - a) determining priorities in the context of an overall policy,
  - b) ensuring that sufficient material is provided to enable the realistic implementation of proposals, but in such order and quantity as the Church can reasonably be expected to deal with in a responsible manner.

The remainder of the business of the Working Party was deferred to a later session and this session was closed with the Benediction.

#### THIRD SESSION

The General Assembly again convened and was led in worship by the Revd David Jenkins.

#### CHURCHES OF CHRIST CONVERSATIONS

Dr Norman Goodall presented the report and made reference to the document, <u>Proposals</u> for <u>Unification</u>, drawing special attention to the sections on Baptism and <u>Ministry</u>. Dr Goodall moved the following resolutions:

- The Assembly approves the Proposals for Unification submitted by the Joint Committee for negotiations between the Churches of Christ and the United Reformed Church and agrees to proceed in accordance with them.
- The Assembly resolves to agree the scheduled amendments as defined in the Proposals for Unification as amendments to the Basis of Union and the Structure of the United Reformed Church to become effective on the date of unification as defined in the Proposals for Unification.

The Revd A.L.Macarthur then seconded these resolutions referring to the fact that he did this with sadness because it should have been done by the late Revd Brian Pratt.

The resolutions were then approved by overwhelming majorities. One vote was recorded against the first resolution, with two abstentions. The second was passed nem.con. with two abstentions.

The Revd J Waller then introduced the following resolution which was seconded by the Revd  $\,$  G. Hooper

The Assembly resolves that -

- a) each District Council and Synod be asked to vote for or against the proposals for union with the Churches of Christ and to send a report on its voting figures to the General Secretary by December 31st 1977 and
- b) the record of voting figures, together with a note of the number of local congregations of the Churches of Christ within the area of each District Council and Synod, should be made available with the papers for the General Assembly of 1978.

On being put to the vote the motion was lost.

#### FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT

The report of the Finance and Administration Department was presented by the Chairman, Mr L.R. Palmer, and on his motion it was received.

The Revd John White introduced the Maintenance of the Ministry Committee report. On his motion the following resolution was considered:

The Assembly resolves that with effect from July 1st 1977 the minimum rate of stipend payable to a minister in full charge shall be:

£2,030 per annum for the first ten years of service

£2,080 per annum for the next ten years

£2,130 per annum after twenty years.

A resolution in the name of the Eastern Province was moved as an amendment by Mr Philip Wade, seconded by Mr C. Raggett, viz:

The Assembly resolves that with effect from August 1st 1977

a) the minimum rate of stipend payable to a minister in full charge shall be

£2,500 per annum for the first ten years of service £2,550 per annum for the next ten years £2,600 per annum after twenty years

b) the local church shall be responsible for the payment of all heating and lighting costs.

The Assembly further resolves that by careful review of all the resources available to the churches, it ensures that funds are made available for this purpose.

The Honorary Treasurer gave notice of a further amendment which he would move should the present amendment be defeated.

The mover of the amendment was allowed right of reply since this was a Synod resolution. He asked and was given consent to add 'after 1977' the words: 'subject to compliance with Government pay policy'.

On being put to the vote the amendment was defeated, and further consideration of the original resolution was deferred to the next session. The following resolution was then moved and carried:

 The Assembly resolves that the Scope OV maximum shall be £1,450 per annum from 1st July 1977.

A resolution standing in the names of Mr. L. Palmer and the Revd. J. White was then moved:

The Assembly resolves that in the event of a minister being off duty through illness the amount of any sickness benefit received shall be deducted from the remuneration paid by the central office and the local church concerned shall be entitled to a refund from the assessment of the cost of pulpit supply (on the agreed scale) and any necessary travelling expenses incurred.

On being put to the vote the motion was lost.

The Session was adjourned at I p.m.

The Assembly resumed its business at 3 p.m.

Minutes The Clerk submitted the Minutes of the second session which were approved.

## FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT (CONTINUED)

The Chairman of the Maintenance of the Ministry Committee gave notice of a further resolution that he would move later with regard to future stipends, and on this assurance the following resolutions were moved and passed:

- 2. The Assembly resolves that with effect from July 1st, 1977 the minimum rate of stipend payable to a minister in full charge shall be:
  - £2,030 per annum for the first ten years of service
  - £2,080 per annum for the next ten years
  - £2,130 per annum after twenty years
- The Assembly resolves that with effect from July 1st, 1977 the salary scale for Deaconesses shall be:
  - £1,930 per annum for the first ten years of service
  - £1,980 per annum for the next ten years
  - £2,030 per annum after twenty years

(Note: Of these sums the local church provides  $\pounds 150$  per annum towards heating and lighting costs).

- 4. The Assembly resolves that grants from the fund of the former Congregational Church to retired List 'B' Evangelists shall be paid at the same rates which apply to grants from the Pastors' Superannuation Fund, and gifts from the Maintenance of the Ministry Fund of the former Congregational Church to widows of List 'B' Evangelists shall be paid at the rates which apply to grants from the Pastors' Widows' Fund.
- 5. The Assembly resolves that the total annual rate of contribution to the Congregational Ministers' Pension Fund and the Presbyterian Ministers and Widows and Orphans Pension Fund shall be 15 per cent of the appropriate basic stipend, the ministers to pay 5 per cent and the Church to pay 10 per cent; the Church contribution to be raised through the Assessment.

On behalf of the Southern Synod Mrs. R. Goodfellow, seconded by the Revd J. White, moved as follows:

The Assembly expresses its concern for ministers in retirement and those who
will retire before becoming entitled to the full benefits of the Pension Fund,
and urges the Maintenance of the Ministry Committee to look again at every
means of increasing their income.

The resolution was adopted.

Mr. L.R. Palmer, seconded by the Revd J. White, then moved the following resolution which was agreed:

7. The Assembly resolves that in view of the preference expressed by ministers to be brought under Class I for Social Security contributions and the decisions already taken by other Churches, the United Reformed Church will support any such proposed change in the status of ministers.

The Revd J. White then introduced and moved the further resolution, seconded by  ${\sf Mr}$  L.R. Palmer, as follows:

8. The Assembly, while not able to accept the resolution of the Eastern Synod to increase the basic stipend as from August 1st, 1977 by £600 per annum, recognises the urgent need to achieve this result as soon as possible and in any case not later than July 1st, 1978, and instructs the Maintenance of the Ministry Committee to initiate consultation with Provinces, District Councils and local churches with a view to ensuring an increase in the basic stipend from July 1st 1978 to £2630; £2680; £2730 per annum according to seniority and that the necessary financial resources are available.

This was agreed.

The Revd David Skidmore on behalf of the Thames North Synod moved, and Mr R.S.Martin seconded, that

9. The Assembly resolves that all stipend supplements paid by local churches to a minister up to the amount to which that minister is entitled as children's allowances, unless such allowances are payable out of central funds, shall in future be deductible from the total income of the local church for the purpose of calculating the net assessable income for the Scheme of Ministerial Remuneration.

This was carried.

On behalf of the Wessex Synod Mr David Page then moved, seconded by the Revd G. Long, the following resolution which on being put to the vote was narrowly defeated:

The Assembly instructs the Maintenance of the Ministry Committee to arrange that future assessments for the Maintenance of the Ministry Scheme be based more truly on income and not as at present on expenditure, and further that transfers from reserve funds and any balance brought forward should not be treated as income, while transfers to reserve funds and any balance carried forward should not be allowable deductions.

A resolution of Thames North Synod was accepted on behalf of the Committee and agreed without a vote as follows:

- 10. The Assembly notes the concern expressed by many churches and District Councils about the complexity of the basis of assessment for the Scheme of Ministerial Remuneration, the way in which the scheme has been implemented, and the short time for consultation after the assessments were issued, and instructs the Maintenance of the Ministry Committee to:
  - a) provide a clear definition of 'net assessable income' with a detailed statement of items of income and expenditure, both falling within the definition and falling outside it:
  - b) give careful re-consideration to the rule regarding transfers to and from reserves, since this gives rise to anomalies:
  - c) give advice on re-budgetting to those churches where the assessment has resulted in substantially increased expenditure on the ministry:
  - d) consider the possibility of giving some relief in cases where a church's expenditure is inflated because of such matters as the cost of heating large buildings and the involvement of the church in special mission, and
  - e) submit the proposed basis of assessment for future years, taking account of amendments to District Councils at the earliest possible date so that there can be full consultation and comment before implementation.

The following resolution was moved on behalf of the Committee:

11. The Assembly resolves that the Executive Committee be given authority to determine the rate of assessment for the calendar year 1978.

The Revd Dr W.J.Houston, seconded by the Revd P.W. Beaman, moved as an addendum:

'provided that that part of the assessment which is a charge on income shall not exceed 25p in the pound'.

On being put to the vote the addendum was lost.

The resolution was then agreed as moved, but in answer to an enquiry the Revd E.W. Todd gave assurance that the rate of assessment would in future be submitted for Assembly decision.

The Revd A. Duncan moved, and the Revd W.G. Hughes Edwards seconded, a resolution in the name of the Wessex Province, namely:

The Assembly resolves that stipends and salaries of Provincial Moderators, full-time Officers at Church House and the academic staff of Westminister College shall in future be subject to the debate and decision of the Assembly and instructs the Finance and Administration Department to arrange accordingly. After the Hon. Treasurer had given assurance that information on this matter would be made known, the resolution was put and lost.

#### UNIFIED APPEAL COMMITTEE

Mr G. Vaughan Davies introduced the Unified Appeal Committee Report.

At this point the Assembly adjourned.

The Assembly resumed at 6 p.m. and took up the business of the Church and Society Department.

#### CHURCH AND SOCIETY DEPARTMENT

The report was introduced by the Chairman, the Revd J. Johansen-Berg, and on his motion the Report was received.

Questions concerning the Annan Committee on the future of Broadcasting, the remarriage of divorced people and Job Creation Schemes were addressed to and answered by the Chairman.

The Chairman then moved a resolution concerning a Fund for Ireland, and the Rt Revd A.J.Weir, Moderator of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland addressed the Assembly on the invitation of the Moderator.

The Revd Michael Hubbard outlined the purposes of the Fund.

The resolution with the agreed deletion of the word 'Northern' was carried in the following form:

1. The Assembly commends to all congregations the British Council of Churches Appeal Fund for projects in Ireland and urges continued prayerful support for all those who work for justice, peace and reconciliation in Ireland.

The following resolutions were then presented to the Assembly by the Chairman and on his motion they were adopted.

- The Assembly draws to the attention of elders meetings and church meetings, the Report of the Sexual Ethics Working Party and urges them to initiate discussions of these important topics and to consider the pastoral responsibilities which arise.
- 3. The Assembly commends the discussion paper on Abortion to Districts and church meetings and urges them to send reports on such discussions to the Church and Society Department so that the Department may be able to speak more effectively for the Church in any submission on future legislation.
- 4. The Assembly alerts congregations in areas where there is nuclear plant to the current debate about the potential danger involved in the development of such plant, and recommends that such congregations seek a meeting with their local Member of Parliament to discuss the issues.
- 5. The Assembly WELCOMES the current diplomatic intitiative of the Foreign Secretary on Rhodesia as outlined to the House of Commons on April 19th, 1977, and EXPRESSES the hope that his discussions on the possibility of the United Kingdom and the United States co-sponsoring a conference to develop a clear timetable for achieving majority rule in 1978 will speedily lead to a just and peaceful settlement.

## WORKING PARTY ON STRUCTURES (CONTINUED)

The Chairman of the Working Party on Structures moved the following resolution:

9. The Assembly sends the Report of the Working Party on Structures of the United Reformed Church, and the following draft resolutions, to Synods, District Councils and local churches for discussion and comment. (Comments to be sent to the Secretary of the Working Party, the Revd M.G.Hanson, 5 Towers Avenue, Jesmond, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE2 3QE by December 20th, 1977. In the light of these comments resolutions will be brought before the next meeting of the General Assembly for ratification the following year).

The Revd Dr. K. Slack, seconded by the Revd J. Johansen-Berg, moved the following as an amendment:

The Assembly, while warmly thanking the Working Party for the thoroughness of its work and the stimulus of its thinking, resolves:

- a) That the maintenance of a strong General Assembly of adequate size is essential for the national identity of the Church:
- b) That further consideration be given by the Executive Committee, or such body as it shall appoint:
  - to means whereby a greater continuity can be secured in membership of the Assembly;
  - ii) to the capacity of Synods, of necessity able to meet but rarely, to discharge the functions assigned to them.

On being put to the vote the amendment was narrowly defeated.

The resolution as submitted was then put to the vote and carried.

The Session closed with the Benediction.

#### THURSDAY, 5th MAY, 1977

#### FOURTH SESSION

The General Assembly again convened and was led in worship by the Revd David Jenkins. In the course of this act of worship the Moderator in the name of the Assembly commissioned the Revds M.J.Davies, J.Reardon, R.E.Taylor and E.W.Todd to further periods of service in their espective offices.

Order of Business The Chairman of the Business Committee submitted a draft order of business for the day which, on his motion, was accepted.

Report of the Tellers Mr Martin Ballard, Chairman of the Tellers for the election of a Moderator for the Assembly for 1978, reported that 514 ballot papers had been received and that the Revd J.E.Lesslie Newbigin had been elected. The Moderator received Dr Newbigin amidst warm acclamation and expressed to him the congratulations and good wishes of the Assembly. The Moderator-elect, in accepting the call to serve in this way, expressed his sense of gratitude for the trust the Church had placed in one who was attending his first URC Assembly.

#### STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

The report of the Stewardship Committee was submitted by the Chairman, Mr R.S.Martin and on his motion, supported by the Revd C.K.Meachin, the report was received.

After discussion the following resolution was moved and adopted:

The Assembly calls upon Synods and District Councils to promote and sponsor Membership Enrichment Training Programmes for ministers, elders and members.

#### WORLD CHURCH AND MISSION DEPARTMENT

Owing to the death of the Chairman, the Revd B.M. Pratt, the report of the World Church and Mission Department was introduced by the Revd A.L. Macarthur who paid tribute to the ministry of Brian Pratt and to his leadership both as Chairman of the Department and earlier as Clerk of the Presbyterian Church of England Assembly for sixteen years.

The report having been received the Revd M.H.Cressey spoke to the section dealing with the work of the At Home Committee and moved the following resolution which had been amended by consent of the Assembly:

1. The Assembly resolves that at this time closer relations with the Methodist Church be pursued not through bilateral conversation on union but through common participation in the Churches' Unity Commission and other ecumenical bodies and by the development of local co-operation, and to these ends instructs the World Church and Mission Department to foster closer liaison with the appropriate agencies of the Methodist Church, particularly,through a liaison group including representatives of the Departments, of the Provincial Moderator and of local joint churches.

An amendment was moved by the Revd E.F.Cattermole, seconded by the Revd M.Hanson, as follows:

The Assembly resolves that at this time closer relations with the Methodist Church be pursued through common participation in the Churches' Unity Commission and other ecumenical bodies and by the development of local co-operation, and to these ends instructs the World Church and Mission Department to foster closer liaison with the appropriate agencies of the Methodist Church, particularly through a liaison group including representatives of Department, of the Provincial Moderators and of local joint churches.

By agreement this was withdrawn and a further amendment, proposed by the Revd D. Hannen and seconded by the Revd E.F.Cattermole, was then discussed: namely, delete in line 2 'not through bilateral conversations' and add to the end of the resolution 'and to inform the Conference of the Methodist Church that the United Reformed Church would welcome an invitation to consider beginning bilateral conversations with a view to union if and when the Conference shall consider the time right for such conversations'.

The amendment was put to the vote and defeated.

The original resolution was then adopted.

TEN PROPOSITIONS OF THE CHURCHES" UNITY COMMISSION In relation to the section of the report dealing with the Ten Propositions of the Churches' Unity Commission Professor Cressey undertook to amend the words 'even some dishonesty' to read 'costly 'tension' in, the third line of paragraph 5.31 of the draft further response. The following resolutions were then moved and adopted.

 The Assembly receives the further response to the Ten Propositions of the Churches' Unity Commission prepared by the Missionary and Ecumenical Work at Home Committee and authorises its transmission to the Churches' Unity Commission as continued interim guidance in its work.

- 3. The Assembly sends the further response to Synods, District Councils and local churches for discussion, particularly of the two possible ways forward in relation to Proposition VI, and authorises the Missionary and Ecumenical Work at Home Committee to issue a pamphlet of questions to assist the discussion and the collection of opinion answers to be submitted to the Committee through the General Secretary by January 31st, 1978.
- 4. The Assembly instructs the Missionary and Ecumenical Work at Home Committee to draw up a draft definitive response of the United Reformed Church to the Ten Propositions to be voted upon at the Assembly of 1978.

The Revd P. Chesney, seconded by Mr. John Eatwell, then moved and it was agreed that

5. In the light of the need for Synods and District Councils to give a response regarding the Ten Propositions by January 31st, 1978, a previous decision requiring the response to the proposals about the Structures of the URC to be made by December 20th, 1977 should be altered by postponing the date for that response to Easter Day 1978.

The Session was adjourned and business resumed at 3 p.m.

The Revd Boris Anderson introduced the further business of the Department and at his request the Moderator received

The Revd Dr Ching-fen Hsiao - Presbyterian Church in Taiwan Miss Edith Maxfield - Ellice Islands, Central Pacific Miss J. Degenhardt - Rajshahi Hospital, Bangladesh.

It had been hoped that Bishop J. Thangamuthu of the Church of South India would be present and address the Assembly, but as the result of an accident during the lunch adjournment he was in hospital with a fractured arm. The Assembly asked that its sympathy be conveyed to the Bishop, and the Moderator-Elect undertook to do this on behalf of the Assembly.

The following resolutions were then adopted:

- 6. The Assembly welcomes the news that the plan to reorganise the Council for World Mission on a basis of full equal partnership has been accepted by all its member bodies and will now be implemented. It sends its good wishes to the new Council for the success of its inaugural meetings and pledges its willing co-operation with the other member churches in the development of new policies and ways of working together in world mission.
- The Assembly approves the establishment of annual consultations between the UK
  member bodies of CWM and welcomes the opportunity this affords for sharing ideas
  and experience particularly in the spheres of publicity and missionary training.
- 8. The General Assembly of the United Reformed Church sends warmest greetings to the World Alliance of Reformed Churches on the occasion of its centenary, wishes all success to the centennial consultation at St. Andrews, and prays for God's blessing on the future work and witness of the Alliance.

Minutes The Assistant Clerk submitted the Minutes of the previous day's business, indicated certain corrections that would be made and, on his motion, they were approved.

#### PUBLICATIONS AND PUBLICITY COMMITTEE

The report of the Publications and Publicity Committee was moved by the Revd R.T. Brooks, Chairman, who, in speaking of the significance of  $\underline{\text{Reform}}$ , paid tribute to the work of the retiring Editor, the Revd Dr John Gregory. On the motion of the Chairman

the report was received and the following resolution agreed:

The Assembly endorses the following recommendations:

- a) That if possible Reform should continue as a self-supporting magazine.
- b) Should declining membership or circulation make this impossible, a subsidy from URC resources would be preferable to any of the following alternatives:
  - i) Changing the editorial policy from that which the Editor and Editorial Board believed best suited to the spiritual health of the Church:
  - ii) Reducing the size of the magazine:
  - iii) Taking its cover price above the equivalent of 15p at September 1976
  - iv) Increasing the advertising ratio above the present level of one-third of any edition and one quarter on average.

## FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT (CONTINUED)

The Assembly resumed consideration of the business of the Finance and Administration Department, and on the motion of the Hon. Treasurer, Mr L. Palmer the following resolution was passed:

12. The Assembly thanks Provinces, Districts and churches for their response to the 1976 Unified Appeal. It urges them to maintain every effort to reach or exceed their Unified Appeal targets in 1977. Assembly notes that 1977 provincial targets are partially based on Maintenance of the Ministry assessment ratios and requests the Unified Appeal Committee to consider whether the 1978 targets should be completely based on Maintenance of the Ministry assessment ratios.

The Chairman of the Treasurership Committee, Mr J.E. Hooper, presented the Accounts for 1976 which were adopted.

The Budget proposed for 1978 was also adopted and on the motion of Mr P. Woods, seconded by Miss Sue Stevenson, the following resolution was agreed:

13. The Assembly notes the concern of FURY at the effect of cuts in sterling grants to overseas churches through CWM and instructs the appropriate committee to take this into account in determining the budget of the Church in future years.

The Revd A.G. Burnham, seconded by the Revd D.G. Stewart, proposed that:

14. The Assembly receives the recommendation of the North Western Synod that there are strong arguments both for and against the ownership by ministers of their own houses and resolves to appoint a committee to reconsider the present practice of providing manses.

This was agreed.

A further resolution, having been amended by agreement, was moved by the Revd D.G. Stewart and seconded by the Revd A.G. Burnham, and passed in the following form:

15. The Assembly receives the recommendation of the North Western Synod that a further appeal be made for funds for the housing of retired ministers if this is found to be required, and instructs the United Reformed Church Retired Ministers' Housing Society to make such appropriate arrangements as may be necessary.

## NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE (CONTINUED)

On the motion of the Revd A.J.G. Walker, Chairman of the Nominations Committee, the further report of that Committee was received and the following resolutions were passed:

- The Assembly resolves that in cases where a URC member of the Council for World Mission is appointed in that capacity to serve on a Committee of the General Assembly, he shall be regarded as a member ex officio.
- 10. The Assembly appointed Committees and representatives of the Church for the year 1977-78 as set out in the Appendix to the Report.

The Assembly authorised the Nominations Committee to invite the annual submission of names of those qualified to serve the Church and to indicate the areas in which that service is required.

The appointment of the Revds Boris Anderson, D.McIlhagga and B. Thorogood to St. Andrew's Centennial Consultation of the W.A.R.C. was confirmed.

THANKS The Revd E.W.Todd moved and it was agreed that the Assembly records its thanks to all who had contributed to its work. It expressed its particular thanks to the Minister and the Trustees of the Central Hall, Birmingham for the use of their buildings, to the local Arrangements Committee, to those who had provided hospitality for members of Assembly, to Miss Freda Mole and all who had helped to cater for the Assembly's refreshment and comfort. The Assembly further thanked the office staff for the arrangements made to assist its work, the organist, the Moderator's Chaplain and the Moderator, the Clerk and the Assistant Clerk, the Chairman and Secretary of the Business Committee for the manner in which they had discharged their duties.

MINUTES The Clerk submitted the Minutes of the day's business in accordance with Standing Orders and these were approved.

CLOSURE The Assembly having in the good providence of God brought its business to completion, the Moderator led the members in praise and prayer, and the Assembly closed to meet again in the Floral Hall, Southport, at 3 p.m. on Monday, May 8th 1978 or at such other time and place as may be duly agreed.

#### NOTES

1. On the 5th January 1977 The Charity Commissioners made an order following the provisions of the United Reformed Church Act 1972 in which the assets of the former Congregational Church were apportioned between the United Reformed Church and those former Congregational Churches that had not joined the United Reformed Church The consequences of this division were not anticipated in the accounts in previous years except for income received on the assets apportioned to Non Uniting Churches since the date of the union. since the order of the Charity Commissions is now known, full provision has been made in these Accounts for the assets passing to the Non Uniting Churches which consists of 18.2% of the assets of the former Congregational Church as at 5th October 1972 with the exception of assets held for the Congregational Ministers' Pension, Congregational Pastors' Superannuation and Congregational Pastors' Widows' Funds. The basis of valuation for apportionment purposes has been a valuation of freehold and leasehold property made at 31st December The Non Uniting Churches share of the properties has been purchased by the United Reformed Church for cash, and investments have been divided in specie.

The order of the Charity Commissioners brought into being a number of new capital funds and combined the funds of many Sundry Trusts administered by the Congregational Union of England and Wales Incorporated. The provisions of the order have been reflected in these accounts. In many cases the original cost of the assets of the Sundry Trusts have not been readily ascertainable and in such cases the cost of such assets has been taken as the valuation made at the 31st December 1975 in respect of freehold property and a valuation as at the 31st December 1976 in respect of investments.

- Except as stated above, all assets are included in the balance sheet at cost. Depreciation has been provided on the cost of fixed assets at various rates, so as to write off their cost over their expected useful life. No provision has been made for depreciation on property.
- Westminster College and buildings and contents are not included in the balance sheet on page 9, since the College was originally a gift to the Church and its value is not readily ascertainable.

## ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 1976

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At the time that these accounts were finalised for printing the audit was not complete. The Auditors do not believe that any substantial adjustments will be necessary.

The Chairman of the Treasurership Committee and the Chief Accountant will be available in Room 21 of the Central Hall between 1.30 and 3.00 p.m. on Wednesday May 4th to answer any questions about these accounts in an informal atmosphere.

#### ACCOUNTS FOR YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 1976

#### NOTES

1. On the 5th January 1977 The Charity Commissioners made an order following the provisions of the United Reformed Church Act 1972 in which the assets of the former Congregational Church were apportioned between the United Reformed Church and those former Congregational Churches that had not joined the United Reformed Church The consequences of this division were not anticipated in the accounts in previous years except for income received on the assets apportioned to Non Uniting Churches since the date of the union. However, since the order of the Charity Commissions is now known, full provision has been made in these Accounts for the assets passing to the Non Uniting Churches which consists of 18.2% of the assets of the former Congregational Church as at 5th October 1972 with the exception of assets held for the Congregational Ministers' Pension, Congregational Pastors' Superannuation and Congregational Pastors' Widows' Funds. The basis of valuation for apportionment purposes has been a valuation of freehold and leasehold property made at 31st December The Non Uniting Churches share of the properties has been purchased by the United Reformed Church for cash, and investments have been divided in specie.

The order of the Charity Commissioners brought into being a number of new capital funds and combined the funds of many Sundry Trusts administered by the Congregational Union of England and Wales Incorporated. The provisions of the order have been reflected in these accounts. In many cases the original cost of the assets of the Sundry Trusts have not been readily ascertainable and in such cases the cost of such assets has been taken as the valuation made at the 31st December 1975 in respect of freehold property and a valuation as at the 31st December 1976 in respect of investments.

- Except as stated above, all assets are included in the balance sheet at cost. Depreciation has been provided on the cost of fixed assets at various rates, so as to write off their cost over their expected useful life. No provision has been made for depreciation on property.
- Westminster College and buildings and contents are not included in the balance sheet on page 9, since the College was originally a gift to the Church and its value is not readily ascertainable.

#### "The Church in the Economic Crisis"

Nearly twelve months ago, a leaflet was prepared and circulated showing the total amount raised by the Churches and how it was spent. An estimate for 1976 based on these figures was also prepared. Since then, the 1975 accounts have been received and examined which show that the income raised to meet the normal costs of the churches totalled about £5,850,000. In the light of this further information we must assume that the previous estimate of expenditure for 1976 (£5.90m) was substantially exceeded. The amount of £3m. included for cost of ministry was probably right, but expenditure on buildings and other local costs must have increased.

The following table shows actual figures for 1975 (so far as information is available), a revised estimate for 1976 and new forecasts for 1977 and 1978. The estimates for 1978 are based on the assumption of a 10% increase in the basic stipend, a continued fall in the number of ministers in line with the recent trend, and some fall in the rate of inflation.

After allowing for income received from endowments and rents the average amount required per head of membership in 1975 was about £29. In 1976 this will have increased to £34, and if membership continues to decline in line with the recent trend £38.50 will be needed in 1977 and £42 in 1978.

These are the plain facts; and not only is the membership declining but the average age is increasing. The situation demands that giving to the Church must, at least, increase as the members' income increases: but even this is not enough. We need first of all a more definite personal commitment and sense of stewardship on the part of every member. This will show itself in;

- A more responsible approach to ministerial remuneration: under recent "pay policy" ministers are again among the lowest paid people in the country.
- ii) A new attitude to Church buildings. We are retaining more than we can afford or need, and the grounds for retention in many cases should be critically examined.
