## First Baptist Church Names Oates To Staff

The Rev. Robert Franklin Oates will become the associate minister of the First Baptist Church of Durham on Sept. 1.

The members of the church, in a congregational meeting last week, approved the recommendation of the Board of Deacons that Oates be employed.

He will fill a position which has been vacant for several months. The church has conducted a search for someone to call as associate minister for sev-

eral weeks.

Oates is a 27-year-old native of Cleveland County. He was reared in York, S.C., where he received his high school diploma in 1959. He then attended Gardner-Webb Junior College and Carson-Newman College of Tennessee, from which he received his undergraduate degree in

1963. In January, 1968, he received the master of divinity degree from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary at Wake Forest.

Oates was ordained to the Baptist ministry at the First Baptist Church of York, in 1961. He served as pastor of the Del Rio Baptist Church, Del Rio, Tenn., from 1962-64, and as pastor of Warren Plains Baptist Church, near Warrenton, from 1964-67. He presently is serving as minister of education at the First Baptist Church of Henderson.

Mrs. Oates is the former Miss Janet Lee Newton of Shelby. The couple has one child, a son, who is four months old.

The speaker for the 11 a.m. and 8 p.m. worship services to-morrow at the First Baptist Church of Durham will be the Rev. John C. Grant of Durham. Grant and his family attend the church. He was for several years pastor of the Lakewood Baptist Church of Durham and later was an associate chaplain of North Carolina Memorial Hospital at Chapel Hill.

Grant currently is serving as a field consultant for the North Carolina Heart Association.

He is a graduate of Wofford College and Southeastern Seminary.
