## Rev. Webb Goes To Reepsville

The Rev. Ralph F. Webb Jr., for the past 11 years pastor of the Victory Baptist Church, has resigned to become pastor of the Reepsville Baptist Church of

Lincoln county. Under his ministry in the local church there were many evidences of progress, among these being the increase in annual mission gifts from \$1,805 to 1958 to \$14,625 in 1969. Total annual gifts increased from \$28,943 in 1958 to \$60,412 in 1969. There were 228 baptisms and 318 other
