Fellow Flower Lovers,

As promised, this catalog issue features the Year of the Peony. While the startling news suggested in our last issue is more academic than tangible, it nonetheless projects a whole new field of development in the widening of Peony cultivation and enjoyment.

Introduced last year were four Peonies resulting from a cross of an unspecified *Lactiflora* (vegetative) peony type with the Tree Peony Alice Harding. This mating produced a group of seedlings essentially vegetative in growth habit, but introducing a new type of yellow into the growing range of color in Peonies. Developed in Japan, this accomplishment stimulated American breeders to parallel efforts, and today there are several hybridizers in the United States at work on similar breeding lines.

Fairly early in the American work was the discovery that several other hybrids of *P. lutea* were also fertile to *P. lactiflora*, so that the possible range of variety in both color and growth habit has been considerably enhanced. As yet, because of the painfully slow rate of propagation of Peonies, none of the Western varieties are available, but it is safe to say that within five years there will be many new varieties of the type being offered.

Meanwhile, work on the vegetative hybrids goes on, with new color breaks becoming almost routine. There will also, for several years to come, continue to be improved varieties of *lactiflora* Peonies offered, of which the three we present this year are an example. Encouragingly, Peony breeders are considering parentage more carefully, and the time is not too distant when, as with the Iris, few Peonies will be registered without pedigree.

As with Iris, too, more use is being made of previously obscure species, and offerings of F2 and F3 generations involving as many as four or five species are even now available. Some care, I think, need be given to Hybrid adaptability to local climatic conditions, and it would be well to proceed with some caution in selecting Hybrids which will perform well in your particular locality. The best answer here is to visit a Peony specialist, commercial or amateur, in your own area and observe how the various Hybrid varieties perform.

Because propagation is so much quicker and easier with Iris than with Peonies there are literally hundreds of times the number of breeders. Because of this mass effort, a great many more "off-beat" combinations can be and have been attempted, so that a breakthrough comparable to the Peony story is continually less likely. However, it is not improbable that new races of Iris will yet be developed. The advent of the "Arl-med" is a current example, and this area is far from being exhausted. So far, we haven't acquired a representative planting of these new hybrids, but it is certain that we will do so in the next few years.

Iris breeding in all lines continues to increase, with registrations and introductions jumping each year. Comparison of quality and evaluation of new things against proven varieties becomes ever more difficult. Therefore, we are most gratified that our two 1971 introductions have already received the approval of a great number of Judges and Iris fanciers over a wide geographic area, so that you need not be hesitant in selecting them for good performance and as probable further award winning varieties.

We cannot conclude this introduction without a sincere tender of thanks to all of you who thru your orders made the past year a fantastic one in sales. We had no idea that our decision to return to national distribution would so greatly multiply our response, and we were literally overwhelmed in trying to fill your needs. To those of you who experienced delays, lack of communication, shortages or substitutions we offer our sincere apologies. We are making a sincere effort to see that these shortcomings are not duplicated in the coming year, and we do appreciate no end the forbearance that most of you showed toward our past transgressions. Please, if ANY of you feel that you have in any way been "short-changed", write us early and we will make adjustment to your entire satisfaction this season.

In Iris, we have added some 50 or 60 new varieties in all types but mostly in Medians and Spurias, as we think there is more room here for novelty. With Tall Bearded there is increasingly a narrower area of selection, but

perfection has not yet been reached even here, and differences of individual preference will always provide room for new offerings.

On the other hand, we have dropped some 100 varieties from our listing, mostly of the older sorts, and a few newer varieties that just didn't prove adaptable to our growing conditions. Increasing costs—of labor, transportation and packing—have forced us to abandon all prepaid shipments. Our postage table on Page 30 will allow you to predetermine delivered prices, and we will try to include extras to compensate for the apparent increase in cost to you. So it's really with a great sigh of relief that we say goodbye to the 49c Iris and the 79c Peony—it just doesn't cost us any more per plant to grow and ship the \$1.00 to \$25.00 ones.

This year the National Iris and Peony meetings are about a month apart, so we hope to have time between them to catch our breath and be on hand to greet you here thru most of the blooming season. Details of both meetings follows, as well as directions to our garden. We do hope you can visit us this season.

Again, most heartfelt thanks for your orders and general words of encouragement. We wish you the happiest season of bloom in 1971.

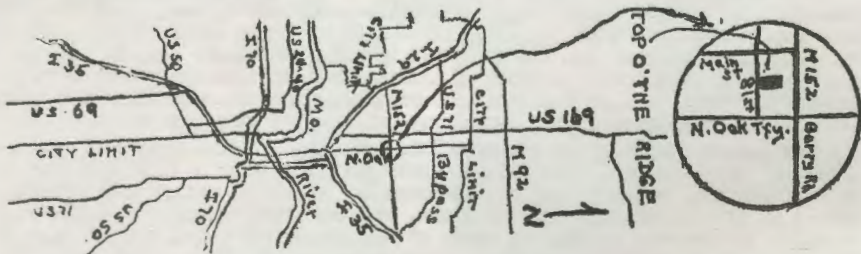

New Peonies For 1971

- BERTHA'S CHOICE** (Harper 1971) Nearest RHS 46A Currant Red, but darker. A Glistening deep red single, Mrs. Harper's selection from the 1958 seedling crop. Not large (5 to 5½ inches) but floriferous, providing a mass of brilliant bloom especially when not disbudded. Excellent for cutting and arranging. Increases well and blooms early midseason from young plants. Cover picture is a three year plant, disbudded. **\$10.00**
- HONSHU DAWN** (Harper 1971) Japanese type. RHS 61D Rose Bengal. A brilliant pink with two rows of guard petals and self colored crisp, narrow staminodes. 6 inch blooms on stiff stems are placed clear of foliage, providing a fine specimen plant. A distinct improvement in form and reliability over PRAIRIE AFIRE **\$15.00**
- OSAKA FLAME** (Harper 1971) Japanese type. Guards RHS 58C Neyron Rose, center 21D-20B Maize to Chinese Yellow. Light rose pink with three rows of petals, some shallowly notched. Soft yellow staminodes with red tipped carpels provide a pleasing color contrast. Good stem and plant habit. **\$15.00**

- FIREY FURNACE** (Niswonger 1971) TB 29" ML Y1F ASPENGLOW X CARIBOU TRAIL RTG 1968. A deep yellow that will not fade in sun. Very clean color, no dirty haze as in some deep yellows. Blooms have a ruffled, swirled effect giving mass impression of a "Flight of Butterflies". Fine breeder. Ample stock makes possible low introductory price of **\$15.00**
- LOVELY RIPPLES** (Niswonger 1971) TB M 34" VIL RIPPLING WATERS X LOVELY LETTY HC, EC 1970 Vigorous lilac self with red beard. Extremely well branched-four way with spur, producing 10-12 buds. Large rhizomes, fast increase. Fertile both ways. A sensation at the 1970 AIS convention. **\$15.00**

Knopf 1969) BB 24" ML O5DD CONGO SONG X (BANG X GLITTERING GOLD) Named by Mrs. Knopf for her late husband, this Border is an absolutely new color in Iris — a brown-black with green overlay. Well proportioned with pronounced fluting of both standards and falls. If you liked Jungle Shadows you'll love this one. **\$10.00**
- MEGHAN** (Buckles 1970) TB 32" M W1Ycm FULL DRESS X RAINBOW GOLD HC '69 Dave Niswonger, selecting for the late Gene Buckles, says this is the best of his 1970 introductions. An opulent warm white with falls bordered gold, it carries lots of lace on a fine stalk carrying plenty of buds. **\$20.00**
- ON TARGET** (M. Knopf 1970) TB 36" M-L Y1L RAINBOW GOLD X BEAUTY QUEEN. A distinctive lemon yellow, not as deep as WEST COAST but shimmering in its loveliness and most elegant in form, fluting and bud placement. Tops in substance, as are all Knopf creations **\$15.00**
- RASPBERRY RIPPLES** (Niswonger 1969) TB 36" M RV1F (PINK FULFILLMENT X ORCHID JEWEL) X RIPPLING WATERS HC '68, HM '70 Deep mulberry rose with striking red beard. Semi-flared with some lace and fine substance. Fine plant proportion with four way branching. Best in its color class, this could go all the way. **\$15.00**
- SUPREME BLISS** (Niswonger 1970) TB 34" M O1P Sib to RASPBERRY RIPPLES HC, EC '69. A blush pink with lots of lace. Better branched than most pinks and a superior show stalk. Fertile both ways, it has already produced some excellent seedlings. Still scarce at **\$25.00**
- TOUCHE** (Hamblen 1969) TB 36" E-L ORP4VB LILAC CHAMPAGNE X (Pink-blue line x (FASHION SHOW x MELODRAMA) HC '69. We didn't introduce this, but Mrs. Hamblen sent it to us the year of introduction. An exciting bicolor with pink standards flushed violet and violet falls with blue overlay. Strikingly different. **\$20.00**

- Single — One or two rows of guard petals, center composed of stamens with pollen.
- Japanese — Guard petals as in single, stamens converted to staminodes, petaloids or filaments, mostly without pollen.
- Semi-double — Most stamens converted to petals, some stamens visible in open bloom.
- Double — Entire flower appears to have petals; if regularly placed and entirely without stamens generally referred to as full double.
- Bomb — Guard petals prominent, center full and round.
- Anemone — Guard petals prominent, center small with narrow petals.

The new Hybrid Peonies are a special breed. Most of them are a week to ten days earlier than the *lactiflora* sorts, and for the most part have only one flower per stem, making them extremely desirable for cutting.

If your order totals \$10.00 or more, send us 1/3 of the net amount with your order, together with your account number with any national Credit Card service (Diner's Club, American Express, Bank Americard, major oil company, etc.) We will then bill you at shipping time, adding only actual postage and packing cost. You then pay half of the bill in 30 days and half in 60 days.

Guarantee
