Registration of Births, Marriages and Deaths.

BIRTHS.

Within three days of the birth it is necessary to make a declaration to the person in charge of register, who will go to the house of the new-born to ascertain its existence and will extend on paper the necessary formal information.

MARRIAGES.

Art. 17. — Those who are about to contract matrimony will present themselves to the public official in charge of the civil register, and will inform him verbally of their intention, and the same will be noted and signed by the contracting parties and two witnesses. If the contracting parties cannot sign, same will be done by another person on their behalf.

Art. 18. — This Act will contain: 1, Names and surnames of the contracting parties. 2, Age. 3, Nationality, domicile and place of birth. 4, Profession. 5, Names and surnames of their parents, nationalities, profession and domiciles. 6, If they have been previously married, the name and surname of the previous spouses will be noted as well as the place in which they contracted matrimony and the cause of the dissolution.

Art. 19. — The future spouses must present at the same time: 1. Legalized copy of the sentence declaring annulled the previous marriage of one or both parties as the case may be. 2. Authentic declaration

of persons admitted by the law, and fathers, tutors, or guardians will express their consent to the public official and will sign the Act referred to in Art. 17. Should they not be able to sign, any of the witnesses may do so on their behalf. 3. Two witnesses known to both parties will declare that the contracting parties are in a condition to marry.

Art. 37.—The marriages will be celebrated in the presence of the official of the Register in his office and publicly, and the contracting parties as well as tutors and parents and witnesses will sign the necessary documents required by law.

DEATHS.

The next of kin, the nearest relative, or in the absence of these any person over age who may have witnessed the death, can declare in the presence of the officer in charge of the register. The limit for registering deaths is 24 hours after the death has taken place.

BURIALS.

These cannot take place for twelve hours after death, nor exceed thirty-six, excepting cases at the disposition of the Municipality and Police.

CONFIDENTIAL URGENT DESPATCHES—Tariff 6 times that of a simple telegram of equal length.

DESPATCHES WITH ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF RECEIPT in addition to the cost of the Telegram, 50 cents will be charged for advice of delivery.

TELEGRAMS DUPLICATES—20 cents m|n. for each copy of 100 words or fraction.

COPIES OF TELEGRAMS—A fixed charge of \$1 m|n.

CONVENTIONAL OR ABRÉVIATED ADDRESSES—A fixed charge of \$10 m|n. for 6 months for each separate address.

FOR TELEGRAMS IN LANGUAGE agreed upon, in letters or secret cypher, and which are admissible according to the Law of 7th Oct., 1875, will pay 4 times the simple tariff.

The charge for a TELEGRAPHIC CONFERENCE is \$20 m|n. for the first 15 minutes and \$5 for each subsequent five minutes. Passing one hour the charge is \$10 m|n. for each five minutes in excess. No conference can last more than TWO HOURS.

TELEGRAMS DICTATED IN FOREIGN languages can only be transmitted in French, Italian, English, German, Latin and Portuguese, and will pay double.

No TELEGRAMS can exceed 100 words.

ALL WORDS UNDERLINED, whether in plain or secret language, will be charged double tariff.

TELEGRAMS to the PRESS or STOCK EXCHANGE are allowed a rebate of 50 o|o on the ordinary tariff.

RAILWAY COMPANIES are obliged to establish public service in all points in which they have stations where no other Telegraph Company has a line or office to do it.

Scale of Promissory Notes or Stamped Paper and their application.

Art. I.—Documents must be extended on stamped paper, subject to the rules and regulations of the Law. Acts, contracts, or obligations relating to anything subject exclusively to the National Jurisdiction by reason of place or nature of the act.

Art. II.—Acts, contracts and drafts not exceeding 90 days require a stamp corresponding to the following scale.

Art. III.—Drafts at sight or not exceeding 30 days require a stamp equivalent to half of that given in the undermentioned Scale.
