And the Word was with God,

 Proverbs 8:12 I <u>wisdom</u>, dwell with prudence, and I find knowledge and discretion... 22 "<u>The Lord possessed me</u> <u>at the beginning of his work</u>, the first of his acts of old.
 23 Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. 24 When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs -

 abounding with water. 25 Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth, 26 before he had made the earth with its fields, or the first of the dust of the world. 27 When he established the heavens, I was there; when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, 28 when he made firm the skies above, -

- Colossians 1:16-17 For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities — <u>all</u> <u>things were created through him and for him.</u> 17 And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together.

- Hebrews 1:1-2 Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, 2 but in these last days he has spoken to us <u>by his Son</u>, whom he appointed the heir of all things, <u>through whom also he</u> <u>created the world</u>.

  A. Jesus is a descendant of Adam.
- Luke 3:23, 38 Jesus, when he began his ministry, was about thirty years of age, being the son (as was supposed) of Joseph... 38 the son of Enos, the son of Seth, the son of Adam, the son of God.

- B. Jesus is a descendant of Abraham, <u>Isaac</u> and <u>Jacob</u>.
- Abraham Genesis 12:2 And <u>I will make of you a great</u> <u>nation</u>, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing.
- Isaac Genesis 17:19 God said, "No, but <u>Sarah your wife</u> <u>shall bear you a son</u>, and you shall call his name Isaac. I will establish my covenant with him as an everlasting covenant for his offspring after him.

B. Jesus is a descendant of Abraham, <u>Isaac</u> and <u>Jacob</u>.

• Jacob - Genesis 26:4 <u>I will multiply your offspring</u> as the stars of heaven and will give to your offspring all these lands. And in your offspring all the nations of the earth shall be blessed,

B. Jesus is a descendant of Abraham, <u>Isaac</u> and <u>Jacob</u>.

 Matthew 1:1-2 The book of the genealogy of <u>Jesus</u> <u>Christ</u>, the son of David, the son of <u>Abraham</u>.2 Abraham was the father of <u>Isaac</u>, and Isaac the father of <u>Jacob</u>, and Jacob the father of Judah and his brothers,

- C. Jesus is from the tribe of <u>Judah</u>.
- Psalm 78:67-68 He rejected the tent of Joseph; he did not choose the tribe of Ephraim, 68 <u>but he chose the</u> <u>tribe of Judah</u>, Mount Zion, which he loves.
- Genesis 49:10 <u>The scepter shall not depart from Judah</u>, nor the ruler's staff from between his feet, until tribute comes to him; and to him shall be the obedience of the peoples.

- Luke 3:33 the son of Amminadab, the son of Admin, the son of Arni, the son of Hezron, the son of Perez, <u>the son</u> <u>of Judah</u>, 34 the son of Jacob, the son of Isaac, the son of Abraham, the son of Terah, the son of Nahor,

- C. Jesus is from the tribe of <u>Judah</u>.
- Revelation 5:5 And one of the elders said to me, "Weep no more; behold, <u>the Lion of the tribe of Judah</u>, the Root of David, has conquered, so that he can open the scroll and its seven seals."





- II. Christ is the <u>Promised One</u>?D. Jesus is the heir to the throne of David.
- Isaiah 9:6-7 For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; ightarrowand the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. 7 Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness...

- D. Jesus is the <u>heir</u> to the throne of <u>David</u>.
- Luke 1:32 He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him <u>the</u> <u>throne of his father David</u>...

- E. Jesus was <u>born</u> just like us.
- Genesis 3:15 I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring <u>and her offspring</u>; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel."
- Galatians 4:4 But when the fullness of time had come, God <u>sent forth his Son</u>, <u>born of woman</u>, born under the law,



- III. Christ is <u>received</u> by <u>faith</u>.
- 12 But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, 13 who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.
- A. Receiving Him entails <u>believing</u> in His name.
- **B.** Receiving Him includes a <u>change</u> in status.
- **C.** Receiving Him involves being <u>born</u> of God.



#### III. Christ is <u>received</u> by <u>faith</u>.

Matthew 18:1-4 At that time the disciples came to Jesus, saying, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" 2 And calling to him a child, he put him in the midst of them 3 and said, "Truly, I say to you, <u>unless</u> you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. 4 Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.

14 And the <u>Word became flesh and dwelt among us</u>, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

 Isaac - Genesis 26:3 Sojourn in this land, and <u>I will be</u> <u>with you</u> and will bless you, for to you and to your offspring I will give all these lands, and I will establish the oath that I swore to Abraham your father.



#### IV. Christ is <u>God</u> with us.

- Jacob Genesis 31:3 Then the Lord said to Jacob, "Return to the land of your fathers and to your kindred, and <u>I will be with you</u>."
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- Moses Exodus 3:12 He said, "But <u>I will be with you</u>, and this shall be the sign for you, that I have sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall serve God on this mountain."



#### IV. Christ is <u>God</u> with us.

 Joshua - Joshua 1:5 No man shall be able to stand before you all the days of your life. Just as I was with Moses, so I will be with you. I will not leave you or forsake you.









He is the Promised One from of old, who preexists all of creation and yet was born into this world just like us. It is He that we need to receive with the faith of a child.







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
