Dr William Morris

Dr Morris received an Honorary Doctorate in Law from the University of Bolton in 2017 in recognition of his outstanding contribution to foreign policy, international dialogue and peace. He is the Secretary General of the Next Century Foundation, an independent think-tank that seeks to promote conflict resolution through open and inclusive dialogue. The foundation's work is based on the principles of freedom of speech, freedom of worship, freedom from want and freedom from fear; it works primarily, but not exclusively, to support and host peace initiatives concerning the Middle East, North Africa and South Asia.

Dr Morris is a broadcaster, journalist and former publisher, who founded a number of publications including the now defunct London Law Quarterly. He was Chairman of the International Council for Press and Broadcasting, and continues to be a prolific international public broadcaster, appearing on Channel 4, PBS, Arab News Network and London's Arabic peace radio channel, Hala London; in his capacity as an expert on Arab affairs and an advocate for peace. He has published a book of verse and a novel, Springfield.
