



Congress has succeeded in removing all restraint upon the illicit whiskey distileries, and moonshiners of that section by failing to pass the bill appropriating money to pay the deputy marshals, whose duty it has been to arrest all such aggressors, and who have heretofore been in danger of losing their lives in doing so, as the moonshiners have not hesitated to use force of arms to defend their illicit works, against the government officers.

The various trades unions in this country have within the past few years shown themselves to be a worse curse to the laboring classes than any other one thing this country has known for several years. Where labor strikes have been had they have almost invariably been led by these unions or carried on by them entirely. A strike is now being made in Fall River, Mass, that is depriving over 1,500 laborers of. employment, and the effect will be as in nearly all previous similar cases, to supply the factories with non-union men.

The Fourth of July this year, as usual, was accompanied by numerous accidents in all parts of the country. At Quinsigmond, Mass. an excursion steamer was wrecked by too great a crowd going aboard, and a large number of the passengers were precipitated into the water. Seven were killed and five were injured and three are missing.

At Trenton, N. J., a large crowd ran onto the wharf as an excursion steamer was nearing, when the wharf gave way and 75 persons thrown into the river. Two were drowned and several injured.

At Columbus, Ohio, a cannon burst and dangerously injured two men. Two excursion trains, one empty and

the other crowded, collided in St. Louis, Mo., and two men badly injured. Engines and one car total wrecks. Miss Jennie Dunbar, of Poughkeepsie, N. Y., was burned to death by having her cloths ignited by some firecrackers in the hands of some boys, besides others of minor importance in all parts of the country.
