State Champions On the Green



On Thursday 5th May, Tyler Newcombe, Jacob Brown, Isaac Winsall and Kona Kerr travelled to Melbourne to compete in the State Championship Senior Division of Lawn Bowls. The preliminary rounds were closely contested against McKinnon Secondary College and Broadford Secondary College with the boys getting the win by the narrowest of margins 8-7 & 9-8 respectively.

This rewarded them with a top of the table finish to take on Doncaster Secondary College who had a large and very vocal following in the semi final. The boys started well with Tyler Newcombe as Skip bowling exceptionally well drawing in each end to win 7 out of 10 ends with the score line being 8-6.

The boys had achieved their daily goal of making the final and were now quietly confident of going the next step to become State Champions.

They again met Broadford Secondary College and got off to a ripping start claiming 4 shots in the first end. This had Broadford on the back foot with Isaac rolling a consistent kitty for longer ends and Jacob keeping his poise to always have one bowl in the count. They confidently took the early lead of 11-1 after 6 ends. Broadford hit their straps and won the next 3 ends to peg back the score to 11-8 going into the last end. When Tyler went to the mat to bowl his last 2 bowls of the game, we were 3 shots down and scrambling until Tyler used his experience to sit his 2nd last bowl on 2 of theirs to cut back and take out the win 11 shots to 9.

All the boys should be super proud of their efforts. Taking on older opponents all day, they represented themselves and Camperdown College superbly with great poise, persistence and wonderful sportsmanship.

Well done boys on etching Camperdown College's name in the history books as State School Victoria's 2022 Senior Secondary Lawn Bowling Champions and a big thank you to Camperdown Bowling Club for allowing us to practise on their green in the lead up.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK...



May has been an extremely busy time across the school with Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 NAPLAN testing, and the subsequent catch-up tests for absent students, occurring against a backdrop of busy classrooms, incursions, sporting events, transition activities and more! We are very pleased with the way our teachers and students approached NAPLAN and the school did not experience any significant technical issues during the testing period. NAPLAN data complements numerous other data sets that are used by teachers every day, but is the only common measure used across all Victorian and Australian schools. Participation levels were very high, consistent with the school's messaging that NAPLAN is a welcome opportunity for students to show what they know and can do.

Our seven Year 9 School for Student Leadership students are sharing very favourable reports of their time so far at the new Don Valley (Yarra Valley) campus. Camperdown College will apply for a 2023 team to attend SSL as this has become a much anticipated rite of passage. Our current Year 8 students may wish to revisit our School for Student Leadership Policy on our school website or learn more about the SSL experience through [SSL \(alpinesschool.vic.edu.au\)](https://alpinesschool.vic.edu.au).

Attendance was strong at our recent Year 7 Information Night, which was held slightly earlier than usual, on Wednesday 4th May. Feedback from those in attendance has been positive and all families have been given the option of a return visit and/or meeting should this be required. A series of orientation visits to the Senior Campus will commence shortly to expose students to the various curriculum areas while building

confidence and connections to support a positive transition. Families have been asked to confirm enrolments for Year 7 2023 by the end of this term to ensure our future planning is well informed and indicative numbers for budgeting purposes are sound.

We are looking forward to hosting prospective 2023 Prep children and their parents/carers in our Prep classrooms on Monday and Tuesday morning, as the first steps in an extended transition program. Visitors will be able to observe the Prep students in action during the literacy block and enjoy a tour of the Junior Campus with myself or Assistant Principal Jacinta Tolland.

Feedback from TheirCare and participating families about the new OSHC program has been very positive. TheirCare is pleased with the uptake already, which compares favourably with other services in similar locations. A June/July school holiday program has been confirmed as a trial, with students aged 5 – 12 from all schools able to participate.

Education Week commencing next Monday 23rd May gives us a wonderful opportunity to celebrate 150 years of public education, along with our own school's rich history of primary and secondary schooling on our current sites. Education has been provided on our Junior Campus site for well over 150 years but 1872 marks the formal commencement of free, secular and compulsory education across the state. Our Senior Campus will of course celebrate 100 years of higher education in October this year and we look forward to students, staff and families past and present joining in the various celebrations. Happy Education Week to you all!

Working Together To Manage The Flu And Covid-19

With borders opening and the arrival of colder weather, cases of Influenza (the Flu) are increasing throughout Victoria. Our community is at risk of higher rates of students and staff affected by the flu or COVID-19 this season.

WHAT TO DO IF YOUR CHILD GETS SICK:

To help keep your child and our school community safe, please take the following steps if your child has any cold or flu-like symptoms:

- take a COVID-19 test and follow the current [Department of Health isolation requirements](#) if a positive result is shown
- keep your child at home until their symptoms pass
- common flu-like symptoms include a high fever, cough, runny nose, loss of appetite, body aches and feeling extremely weak and tired
- diagnosis of the flu can only be confirmed by a doctor after a nose or throat swab
- encourage your child to wash their hands regularly and ask them to cover their nose and mouth when sneezing and coughing.

COVID-19 VACCINATION:

COVID-19 vaccines are available free of charge to everyone aged 5 years and over in Australia.

It is important that children and young people have the best possible protection against the flu and COVID-19 by getting vaccinated.

Ensuring your children are protected against serious illness helps to protect everyone in our community, including older family members who may be at higher risk, along with younger children who can't receive vaccinations yet.

You can book COVID-19 vaccinations through the COVID-19 hotline on 1800 675 398 or at a participating GP, pharmacy, or community health service.

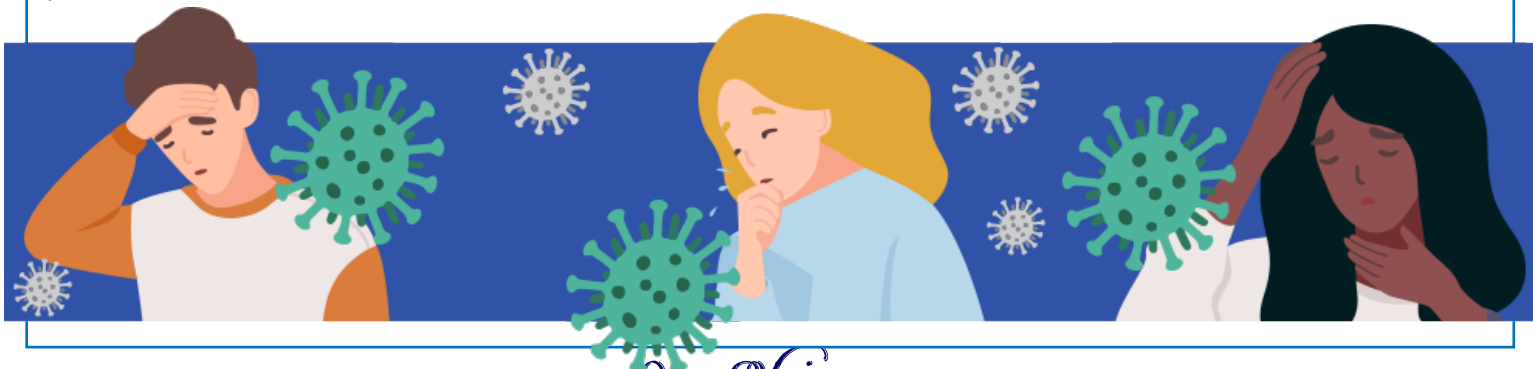
FLU VACCINATION:

Flu vaccination is recommended for everyone aged 6 months and over.

Some people are more at risk of complications from the flu and are eligible for free vaccination under the [National Immunisation Program](#) including:

- anyone aged 65 years and older
- pregnant women (at any stage of [pregnancy](#))
- all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged from 6 months and over
- people 6 months or older with:
 - [heart disease](#)
 - [chronic lung disease](#) (including people with severe [asthma](#) who require frequent hospital visits)
 - chronic neurological conditions
 - impaired immunity
 - haemoglobinopathies (blood disorders caused by genetic changes)
 - [diabetes](#)
 - [kidney disease](#)
- children on long-term aspirin therapy from 6 months to 10 years
- children aged from 6 months to under 5 years.

Flu vaccinations can be booked through GPs and pharmacies, many of which can also provide COVID-19 vaccinations. If you would like more information about the flu vaccination, visit the [Better Health Channel](#).
