1.	In Galatians 5:1, Paul once again states the major point of this letter to the church in Galatia What does he encourage the Galatians to do?
	In your own words, describe what it means to you to be set free by Jesus.
2.	Read Galatians 5:2-6. Salvation is by grace through faith in Christ alone. Yet, it is easy to live legalistically and add requirements to our salvation. What requirement were the false teachers adding to salvation by faith? What are some elements Christians might add to salvation today?
	Why do you think it is so easy to become entangled in legalism?
	How do you see legalism creating attitudes of arrogance, criticism, dissension and envy among Christians today?
3.	Read Galatians 5:2-6 again. "Falling away from grace" in verse 4 does not mean losing your salvation. What does Paul mean?
	Our own efforts cannot accomplish what faith can accomplish through the Holy Spirit. According to verse 6, what is the expression of our freedom in Christ that counts?
	How does Jesus explain the importance of love in Matthew 22:36-40 and John 13:34-35?

4. Paul gives two illustrations in Galatians 5:7-10. Read these verses and explain how running a race is a good illustration of the Christian life.

Review Galatians 5:1-10 and make a list of the ways the false teachers (Jewish Christians) have hindered the Galatians' race.

5. What does yeast or leaven often represent in the Bible? See 1 Corinthians 5:6-8 and Matthew 16:11-12.

How would Paul's illustration in Galatians 5:7-10 be a warning to the Galatians against the false teachers?

6. Read Galatians 5:11-15. In what two opposing ways can we use our freedom?

Which way does Jesus say is better? Read Luke 10:27-28.

7. Count and record the number of times you read the word "Spirit" in Galatians 5:16-26.

What is the best way to combat squandering our freedom in Christ according to verse 16?



•	You are saved by grace. Don't let the law take you away from  We are justified by in Jesus. We are no longer slaves to the Law.  It is not the external but the internal that counts fulfils the whole law
	Avoid the slavery of legalism.
	By the Holy Spirit 5:16-26
•	Walk by the Spirit. He enables us to overcome our sinful human nature day by day. Be led by the Spirit. He enables us to produce the fruit of the Spirit. Live by the Spirit. Keep in step with the Spirit by relying on Him in all circumstances.  Avoid license. Do not squander your freedom.
	By Caring for Others 6:1-10
•	Restore with the sister who has sinned. Do not become self righteous Carry one another's burdens. Others will know we are Christ followers by our Be generous. The selfish will reap very little. The generous will reap fulfillment. Do good. Do not grow weary and give up for in time you will have a spiritual harvest.  Avoid a lifestyle of self centered activity.
	For God's Glory 6:11-18
•	The false teachers were motivated by religious pride andinterest.  Paul was motivated by the cross. Christ died for our sins and set us free.  Not circumcision or personal glory, but the scars of following Jesus define Paul.  Paul closes with tender words for the Galatians. "Grace be with you, brothers."
