

What is a State Champion Tree?

Champion trees are determined by a point system based on three measurements. One point is given for each inch of the tree's circumference measured at a height of 4 ½ feet, one point is given for each foot of the tree's height, and a quarter point is given for each foot of crown spread. The largest known measured specimen of its genus and species gets to wear the crown of State Champion. For a current list of champions and other large trees in Pennsylvania, go to pabigtrees.com

Champion Trees on Campus

PINE

- 1 Japanese white pine, *Pinus parviflora*
7'6" circumference at 12", 74' high, 36' spread for 173 points

FIR

- 2 Shensi fir, *Abies chensiensis*
8' 3" circumference, 70' high, 30' spread for 178 points
- 3 Farges fir, *Abies fargesii*
4' 4" circumference, 57' high, 24' spread for 116 points

HEMLOCK

- 4 Northern Japanese hemlock, *Tsuga diversifolia*
3' 1" circumference, 30' high, 27' spread for 73 points

SPRUCE

- 5 Sakhalin spruce, *Picea glehnii*
6' circumference, 48' high, 36' spread for 129 points
- 6 Dragon spruce, *Picea asperata*
6' 1" circumference, 45' high, 39' spread for 127 points
- 7 Sitka spruce, *Picea sitchensis*
6' 9" circumference at 10", 38' high, 36' spread for 131 points
- 8 Black spruce, *Picea mariana*
5' 5" circumference at 10", 37' high, 30' spread for 116 points

SPRUCE (cont.)

- 9 Tiger-tail spruce, *Picea polita*
5' 8" circumference, 49' high, 36' spread for 130 points
- 10 Siberian spruce, *Picea obovata*
3' 9" circumference, 57' high, 21' spread for 110 points

OAK

- 11 Scarlet oak, *Quercus coccinea*
Front of Founders Hall
19' 6" circumference, 98' high, 110' spread for 360 points

FALSECYPRESS

- 12 Hinoki falsecypress, *Chamaecyparis obtusa*
Barclay Hall entrance facing Duck Pond
7' 3" circumference, 75' high, 46' spread for 175 points

HEMIPTOLEA

- 13 Hemiptelea, *Hemiptelea davidii*
Lower Duck Pond near Railroad Avenue
5' 5" circumference, 46' high, 42' spread for 122 points

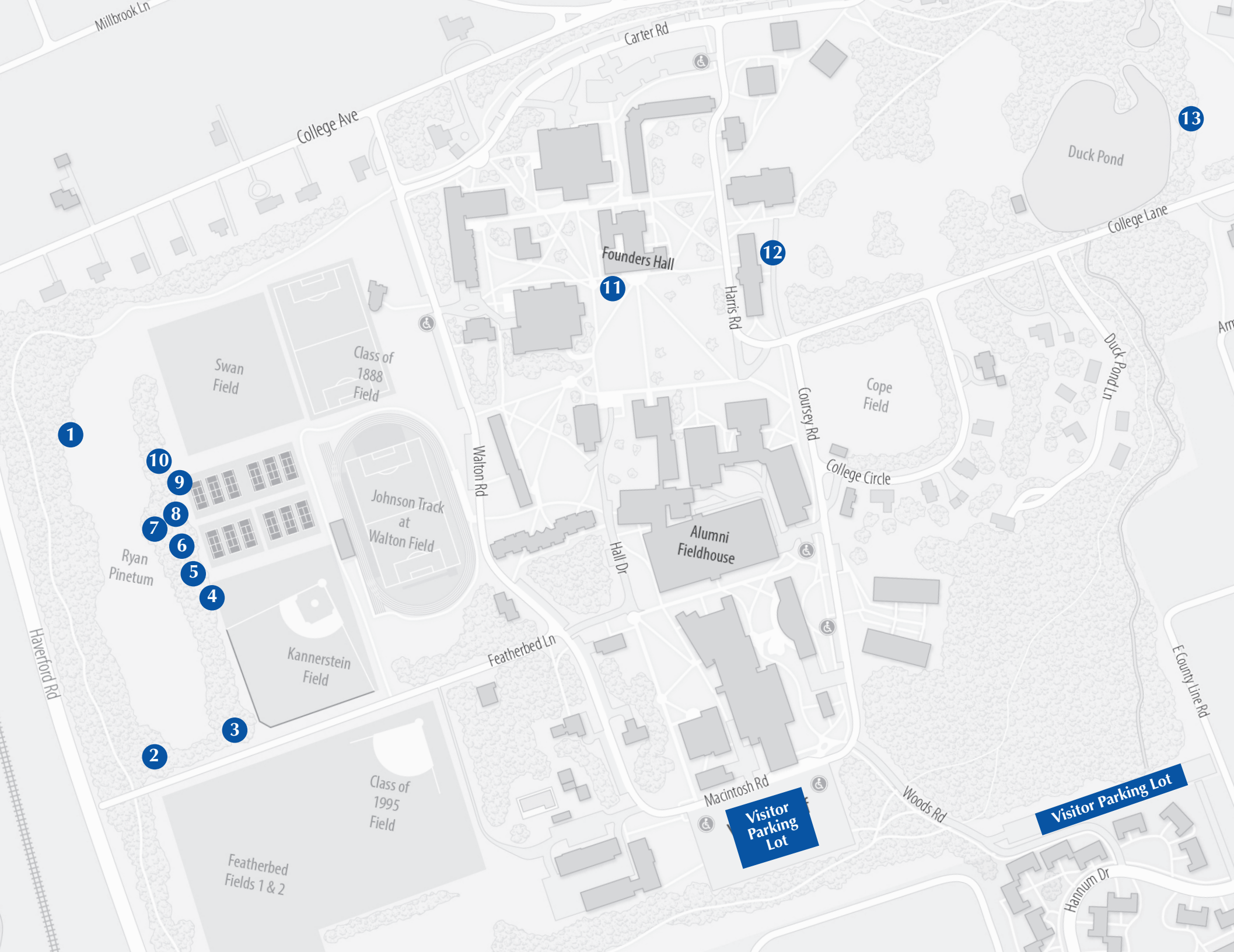
