## Introductions



# Background & Context

- Growth in the Port Hope area and stable enrolment in the French Immersion program has put an increased amount of pressure on the available space at Ganaraska Trail Public School (PS).
- In September 2022, the Grade 6 students from Ganaraska Trail PS transitioned to Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS to alleviate accommodation pressure being felt at Ganaraska Trail PS.
- North Hope Central PS is experiencing stable enrolment at or just above the school's capacity.
- Beatrice Strong PS is also experiencing stable enrolment below the school's capacity.
- The Board anticipates this to be a continuous trend over the next 5 to 10 years.
- A review of this Elementary Family of Schools (EFOS) is now being conducted to explore solutions to the ongoing accommodation pressures.

# Background & Context

- To respond to the increased accommodation pressures, several strategies should be considered:
  - the use of additional portables,
  - boundary adjustments,
  - change in grade cohorts/program delivery between available facilities, and
  - the establishment of holding areas.

## **Residential Development Pressures**


Population Growth in Northumberland County.:

- Provincial forecasts indicate that the population for Northumberland County will grow to 122,000 people by 2051. This represents an increase of approximately 34,400 persons.
- The Town of Cobourg and the Municipality of Port Hope are expected to account for more than half the County's overall population growth.
- The Study concluded that Port Hope will need to expand its urban boundary to accommodate the anticipated growth.
- It is anticipated that a large component of housing growth will include lowdensity housing, which tends to generate more students.

# **Residential Development Pressures**


**Proposed Settlement Area Boundary Expansion** 

- It has been determined that there is a need for an additional 131 hectares of community lands in Port Hope.
- Community lands encompasses residential lands and supporting commercial and institutional lands.
- Municipal Planning staff anticipate that the expansion would occur to the west of the existing built-up area and would support about 5,240 people and jobs.
- Board staff will continue to monitor the expansion plans and expect that potential school sites will be identified within the expansion area.




# **Residential Development Pressures**

- Ganaraska Trail PS Catchment
  - approved or planned residential developments are anticipated to generate approximately 72 elementary students and 37 secondary students over the next 5-10 years.
  - residential development in the pre-consultation stage may generate up to 158 elementary students and 83 secondary over the long term.
- Beatrice Strong PS Catchment
  - planned residential development is anticipated to generate 8 elementary students and 1 secondary student.
- North Hope Central PS Catchment
  - planned residential development is anticipated to generate 16 elementary students and 8 secondary students.



## Pupil Accommodation Review (PAR)

- A Pupil Accommodation Review (PAR) is a process required by the Ministry of Education where a school closure and/or consolidation is being considered to address changing demographics, enrolment, programming, and facility condition challenges.
- Pupil Accommodation Reviews are governed by prescribed Ministry timelines and follow a Board approved policy and process.
- Since June 2017, the Ministry of Education has put a 'pause' on such reviews.




## Pupil Accommodation Review (PAR)

- The Ministry of Education PAR Guidelines (April 2018) and Board Policy BA-1.2, Pupil Accommodation Review: School Closure/Consolidation indicate that a PAR would be required if the number of students relocated is greater than 50% of the school's enrolment.
  - Given this, an example of an option that the Board is unable to consider at this time would be the establishment of a single-track French Immersion program at one of the schools (i.e., Beatrice Strong PS).
- Considering the 'pause' of Pupil Accommodation Reviews as per the Ministry Guidelines, Board staff have identified several options which would not require a PAR but will assist in relieving accommodation pressures being felt in the Port Hope Elementary Family of Schools.



## **Option A: Remain Status Quo**



### **Beatrice Strong PS –**


- would remain a JK to grade 6 school
- enrolment is expected to remain steady
- will remain underutilized during the 10-year projection period



### North Hope Central PS -


- would remain a JK to 6 school
- is expected to maintain a steady enrolment slightly above the school's capacity
- accommodation pressures can be managed via portables at this site

## **Option A: Remain Status Quo**



### Ganaraska Trail PS –

- remains a dual track JK/SK to grade 5 school
- enrolment is expected to exceed the school's capacity
- accommodation pressure is enhanced due to the increase in kindergarten aged students and the French Immersion program
- accommodation pressures cannot be effectively managed via portables at this site.




### Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS -

- remains a dual track grade 6 to 8 school, situated within the physical building, Port Hope HS.
- Ganaraska Trail PS, Beatrice Strong PS and North Hope Central PS will continue to feed into Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS, with Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS feeding into Port Hope HS.
- additional classrooms have been dedicated to Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS which will increase the capacity



- in this option there is a stabilization of enrolment at Ganaraska Trail PS, and there would be residual capacity for students generated from the impending residential development within the Ganaraska Trail PS catchment.




### Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS –

- becomes a dual track grade 5 to 8 school
- the physical building, Port Hope HS, can accommodate additional classrooms dedicated to Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS.



- there would be residual capacity for students generated from the impending residential development within the catchment




### Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS –

- becomes dual track grade 4 to 8 school
- Further investigation would be required to determine is the physical building, Port Hope HS, is able to accommodate the additional classrooms required for the grade 4's



### Ganaraska Trail PS –


- becomes a dual track JK/SK to grade 4 school
- enrolment stabilizes
- there would be residual capacity for students generated from the residential development within the Ganaraska Trail PS catchment.



### North Hope Central PS -

- becomes JK to grade 4 school
- enrolment stabilizes below the school's capacity
- enrolment would be effectively managed without the use of portables


Option D: Change in grade cohorts between Ganaraska Trail PS, North Hope Central PS and Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS.



#### Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS –

- becomes dual track grade 5 to grade 8
- the physical building, Port Hope HS, may not be able to accommodate the additional classrooms required for Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS.

# Option E: Boundary Adjustment between Beatrice Strong PS, Ganaraska Trail PS and/or North Hope Central PS.




A boundary adjustment can be utilized to balance enrolment between the elementary schools. This figure illustrates study areas within the Ganaraska Trail PS boundary (GT) and the North Hope Central PS boundary (NH). Corresponding enrolment projections were completed for each study area and have been summarized on the following slide. Based on the analysis, staff have identified two possible options, E1 and E2.


