Collection of Contributions.

MADE BY THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE JOINT COMMITTEE AND THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR, ACTING JOINTLY, UNDER THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1924, AND THE WIDOWS', ORPHANS' AND OLD AGE CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925.

1925: No: 156:

The National Health Insurance Joint Committee and the Ministry of Labour, acting jointly, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, and the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the National Health Insurance and Contributory Pensions (Collection of Contributions) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1925, and shall be read as one with the National Health Insurance (Collection of Contributions) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1924 (S.R. & O. of N.I., 1924, No. 87) (hereinafter called "the principal Regulations"), and these Regulations and the principal regulations

may be cited together as the National Health Insurance and Contributory Pensions (Collection of Contributions) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1924 and 1925.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on the 4th day of January, 1926.

2. In these Regulations—

“The Insurance Act” means the National Health Insurance Act, 1924 (14 & 15 Geo. 5, c. 38);

“The Pensions Act” means the Widows’, Orphans’ and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1925.

3. The provisions of the principal Regulations shall, subject to the provisions of these Regulations, apply for the purposes of the payment and collection of contributions in respect of persons insured under the Insurance Act and in respect of exempt persons payable under the Pensions Act as well as under the Insurance Act as if the contributions under both of those Acts were contributions under the Insurance Act.

4. In the principal Regulations (other than the provisions thereof with respect to arrears, record cards and benefit records) references to the Insurance Act or to provisions of the Insurance Act shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as including references to the Pensions Act or to the corresponding provisions of the Pensions Act.

5. For the purposes of proviso (a) to sub-section (1) and of sub-section (5) of Section 9 of the Insurance Act in relation to contributions both under the Insurance Act and under the Pensions Act, no account shall be taken of a weekly contribution paid under the Pensions Act in respect of employment in an excepted employment to which paragraph (iv) of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Pensions Act applies or of employment by an employer in such an excepted employment.

6. Article 12 of the principal Regulations shall have effect subject to the following amendments:—

(a) the following provision shall be inserted immediately after the first sub-paragraph of paragraph (1):—

“The time within which, under sub-section (4) of Section 38 of the Pensions Act, an employed contributor who had, on attaining the age of sixty in the case of a man or fifty-five in the case of a woman, been continuously insured for a period of ten years or since the 15th day of July,

“ 1912, whichever period is the shorter, may pay
 “ contributions in respect of any period of unem-
 “ ployment as if he were a voluntary contributor
 “ shall be the time to the end of the period of grace
 “ next after the contribution year in which the
 “ unemployment occurred, and the conditions subject
 “ to which he may pay such contributions shall be :—

“(i) that the number of contributions so paid
 “ together with the number of weeks of
 “ employment in respect of which contri-
 “ butions have been paid and weeks during
 “ which he was incapable of work due to
 “ some specific disease or bodily or mental
 “ disablement of which notice was given
 “ within the time prescribed under para-
 “ graph (a) of sub-section (3) of Section 15
 “ of the Insurance Act shall not in any
 “ contribution year exceed twenty-six ; and

“(ii) that in any contribution year for which he
 “ may have paid contributions as a volun-
 “ tary contributor, contributions shall not
 “ in his case for the purposes of any
 “ Regulations made under paragraph (c)
 “ of Section 8 of the Pensions Act be
 “ deemed to have been paid in respect of
 “ any period of unemployment except
 “ unemployment owing to incapacity for
 “ work due to some specific disease or
 “ bodily or mental disablement,” and

(b) the following words shall be added at the end of para-
 graph (2) :—

“ or sub-section (4) of Section 38 of the Pensions
 “ Act.”

7. All cards in respect of persons insured under the Insurance Act and in respect of exempt persons for the purposes of the Insurance Act, the Pensions Act, the principal Regulations and these Regulations (other than arrears cards for the purposes of the Insurance Act) shall be in the forms set out in the Schedule to these Regulations or in such forms substantially to the like effect as may from time to time be approved by the Ministry, and the Schedule to these Regulations shall be substituted for so much of the Third Schedule to the principal Regulations as relates to cards other than arrears cards.

NOTICE TO INSURED PERSON.

(1) This Card must be handed to your Employer at the proper time to be stamped. It must be sent with your Record Card to your Society immediately after , 19 , and in no case later than , 19 . If you are not a member of a Society, you should send the Card to the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, Belfast. An addressed envelope for this purpose can be obtained at any Post Office in Northern Ireland.

(2) Failure to surrender this card promptly may result in a serious loss of benefits.

NOTICE TO EMPLOYER.

(3) A combined Health and Pensions Insurance Stamp for 1s. 4d. must be affixed for each week (commencing on a Monday) during the whole or any part of which the Insured Person is employed.

(4) 1s. 6d. Stamps may be affixed to this Card in respect of employment in Great Britain.

(5) The Card must be stamped not later than the time when wages are being paid, and the Stamp must then be cancelled at the time of affixing by writing the date of affixing in ink or stamping it with a metallic die across the face of the Stamp. The Card, properly stamped to date, must be returned to the Insured Person at the following times:—

(a) On the termination of his employment, or if the employee leaves without notice, within 14 days; (b) on the , 19 , or within 6 days thereafter; (c) within 48 hours after receiving a request to that effect from the Insured Person.

(6) If the Insured Person is 18 years of age or over, and his remuneration does not include board and lodging, and does not exceed 4s. for a full working day, the weekly amounts to be paid are as follows:—

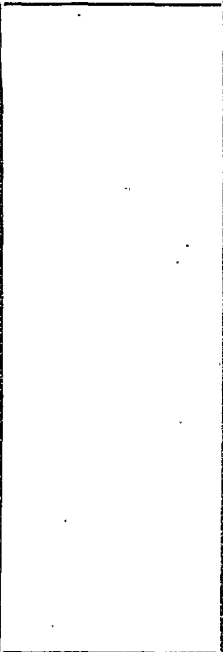

If the Employee is between the ages of 16 and 18 the full amount of 8d. may be deducted, whatever his remuneration.

(7) Where the Employer fails to pay the contribution and to deduct the Insured Person's share of it at the proper time, he loses his right of deducting any part of the contribution.

(8) This Card is the property of the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland. It must not be bought, sold, transferred, or taken in pawn.

A Member of a Society requiring a new Card should apply to his Society.



If this Card should be lost by the Insured Person, anyone who finds it should drop it into a Post Office letter box. If the Card is sent through the Post, it must be put in an envelope, and postage must be prepaid unless the Card is sent to the Ministry of Labour.

(5) In the event of the death of the Insured Person, this Card must be returned to his Society or to the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, Belfast.

If this Card is sent through the post it must be put in an envelope, and postage must be prepaid unless the Card is sent to the Ministry of Labour.

(6) When 52 contributions have been paid in respect of an Outworker in the 52 weeks beginning _____, 19 , a certificate to that effect can be obtained from his Approved Society or, if he is not a member of a Society, from the Ministry of Labour, and no further contributions will then be payable in respect of him during that period.

(5) The Employer must also stamp the Card to date and return it to the Exempt Person at the following times:—(a) on the termination of the employment; (b) on the expiration of the period of currency of the Card, or not later than 6 days thereafter; (c) within 48 hours after receiving a request to that effect from the Exempt Person.

A person finding a lost Card should drop it into a Post Office letter box.

If this Card is sent through the post it must be put in an envelope, and postage must be prepaid unless the Card is sent to the Ministry.

(2) The employer must insert the name of the employee and the date of the week for which the contribution is due, and affix in the space below a single **Combined Health and Pensions Insurance Stamp** of the value representing the joint contribution of himself and the employee. He must then cancel the stamp by writing across it in ink the date of affixing, or by stamping the date on it with a metallic die. The card must be given to the employee as soon as it has been stamped.
