



1. If you begin with a PROVISIONAL PATENT, push on speedily during its nine or ten months' period; produce a first-class embodiment; obtain wide and favourable publicity, and, in suitable cases, get right on the market. Include EXHIBITING at Agricultural Shows, etc. Every step in Patent matters is important in order to attain success and reduce risk. The whole cost of a PROVISIONAL Patent is £5/5/-, if the invention is simple. See Tip No. 6 as to the great field a Provisional

invention is simple. See Tip No. 6 as to the great field a Provisional legally covers.

2. Secure Patent Rights in full for new and immediately marketable articles of everyday utility; always give simple inventions preference—even if you do want to patent complex mechanisms also. It is often when on the market a necessary step to Register one or more TRADE MARKS. Some Trade Marks are worth each the best part of a Million Pounds (abroad). As a DESIGN Registration costs little, obtain advice thereon. Fifteen years for about £10/10/-; or five years for about £5/5/- (one class).

A DESIGN covers a newly-invented, useful or ornamental shape or pattern of an article or articles. According to the materials used, the Designs are classified. In a few classes the cost is even less than that stated above.

stated above.

It is wise to Register COPYRIGHT (and costs almost nothing—except sometimes in U.S. America). Copyrights remain very long in force—

in some cases nearly 100 years.

3. DON'T agree to part with any share in your Invention before deciding upon the terms (which should be written). Have the Agreement prepared by a competent Patent Attorney. Don't sell "for a song" an Invention—or part of it—especially in its undeveloped stage. Do not hald out for an immense sum hold out for an immense sum.

 SCRAP, modify, or remake your models or samples so long as you can improve. Extra expense and extra patience in that direction will yield larger or speedier profit in the end. Defer Patenting, if so advised, expertly, until you get the article tip-top.
 Take care to obtain further Patents (in addition to the first) if that will cover improvements produced, which are valuable enough to be monopolised, the whole becoming one property. Just as two farms are worth more than one, so, frequently, two Patents result in greater profit than one worth more th profit than one.

profit than one.

6. PATENTS abroad should—in some cases only—be obtained. If wisely marketed, they may pay handsomely. They may be applied for in the UNITED STATES, CANADA, BRITAIN, IRELAND, NEW ZEALAND, INDIA, SOUTH AFRICAN UNION, FRANCE and GERMANY, according to prospects; other Countries as the Argentine, Japan, Belgium, Italy, Mexico, Sweden, Russia, Poland, Czecho-Slovakia, etc., may also pay. A great help to obtaining Empire and Foreign Patents is the INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION. It should be availed of in many cases. It allows twelve months in which to apply for a Complete Patent for an Invention on which Patent has been applied for in (say) AUSTRALIA. There are about forty countries abroad granting that privilege. A free Invention on which Patent has been applied for in (say) AUSTRALIA. There are about forty countries abroad granting that privilege. A free list of these forty countries is available on application to G. G. TURRI & CO. The twelve months begins when the Patent Application is lodged in the first country (say Australia), even if it be only Provisionally. Only a few countries abroad allow Provisional Patents as such. In effect, the Convention means they all grant the equal of a Provisional, without any formality whatever, absolutely free for a year, based on the Australian. If the full Patent is not applied for abroad within the year then the Convention rights lapse.

7. In most cases it is wise to instruct the Patent Attorneys to search various records, and to advise as to Prior Patents, etc.; search should cover all past Commonwealth Patents at least (from 1904). One good time to search is before or after applying Provisionally, before applying for COMPLETE Patent.

FRIDAY, 18th SEPTEMBER, 1936

Members of the Society, on presentation of their badges, will be admitted to the Grounds and Grand Stands free. Members also receive two ladies' tickets to admit ladies to the Ground and Grand Stands each day of the Show.

The public will be admitted on Thursday, 17th September (Judging Day), on payment of 2/-, and on the remaining days of the Show, till Saturday, 26th September (inclusive), from 9 a.m., on payment of 2/-. Admission to Public Grand Stand, 3/- extra; to the "Chirnside" and "Cliff" Stands, 2/- extra, and "Gibsonia" and "Cumming" Stands, 1/- extra. Children under 14 will be admitted to the grounds on a payment of 6d., and to all Grandstands at half-price.

Entrance Tickets may be obtained at the gates, and combined rail and Show Tickets will be sold at Flinders Street, Tourists' Bureau, Collins Street, and first-class combined rail and entrance tickets to all suburban railway stations, including Frankston, Lilydale, Belgrave, Sunbury and Geelong.

Champion Horses and Cattle will be distinguished by a red, white and blue sash, and Sheep and Swine, by a red, white and blue rosette. Reserve Champion Horses and Cattle will be distinguished by a purple sash, and Sheep and Swine by a purple rosette.

Any prize awarded to a mare exhibited as being in foal may be withheld until the production of a certificate that she has produced a foal after the exhibition and previous to the 1st January next ensuing.

All Stallions over 2 years of age must be registered under the

Horse Breeding Act, 1928.

All Mares 3 years old or over entered in Sections 1 to 8 inclusive (except Farm and Lorry Horses in Section 3), must have obtained a certificate of soundness from a Government Veterinary Officer.

A Government Veterinary Officer will stamp all Entry Tickets for Stallions and Mares, "Pass to the Ring." These stamped tickets must

be produced to the Steward before entering the arena.

Stallions and Mares will be examined by Government Veterinary Surgeons on the Show Grounds on Wednesday, 16th September, commencing at 10 a.m.

Where height is stipulated, horses and ponies must be measured, and an exhibit over or under the specified measurement may be transferred to its correct class. The official measurer will be in attendance on the Grounds on Wednesday, 16th September, at 10 a.m., and on Thursday, 17th September, at 8 a.m., and horses and ponies must be there to obtain their certificates before going into the ring.

The upper portion of the door of Horse Boxes outside the Pavilions must remain open during the hours the Show is open to the public. The Exhibitor will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.

Horses are not permitted to enter the Judging Ring if fitted with bearing reins.

Any exhibitor who shall, without due cause, fail to parade any animal before the Judge when required so to do by the Steward of the Section, shall be liable to a fine of one pound.

Several feed stalls are available for Exhibitors. Charge, 12/6 during the currency of the Show. Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the Horse Pavilions. The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to General Regulations 14 and 15. These will be strictly enforced.



The breeding year for all Cattle (including Fats) dates from 1st July in each year.

Nurse Cows are not to be entered for competition, but pens will be provided, at 2/6 each, if application is made at time of entry.

Cow or Heifer entered as "in milk" can be transferred to the "in calf" class, if she has not calved prior to judging day, or vice versa. Cows or Heifers entered in the "in calf" classes must be stripped

out prior to entering the judging ring.

Judges have the right to order any cow competing for Champion-

ships to be milked dry before finally awarding the prizes.

In all sections feed sheds are available for exhibitors. 12/6 during the currency of the Show. Feed-mixing bins may be hired for 2/6 each. Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the Cattle Pavilions.

Cows and Heifers in Milk must be in the yards on Wednesday, 16th September, and be fully milked out prior to 5 p.m., at which hour they will be stripped out in the presence of the Stewards, or whom they may appoint. They will be judged first on Thursday morning. The owner or his representative must be in attendance when females are being

Entries of milking stock (Sections 16 to 24 inclusive) will only be accepted subject to the following regulations regarding the disposal of milk.

In order that the Society can comply with the provisions of the Dairy Supervision Act, exhibitors are not permitted to dispose of milk prior to and during the currency of the Show, either by sale or gift, other than to the Society's agent, who is situated at the Milk Room (beside the No. 1 Cattle Pavilion). All milk will be purchased according to butter fat value, based upon a complete test of the bulked milk. and returns forwarded to exhibitors after the Show. No milk will be paid for unless approved milk utensils are used and hygienic methods are adopted.

Entries limited to three in each class (except where otherwise specified) from any one exhibitor.

Only one exhibitor will be recognised as an owner from any one holding, and any exhibitor who enters, or permits the entry of any of his stock, in the name of any other exhibitor, shall be disqualified.

Any exhibitor who shall without due cause fail to parade any animal before the Judge, when required so to do by the Steward of the Section, shall be liable to a fine of £1.

If, in the opinion of the Secretary any exhibit or exhibits of stock be deemed to be dangerous, the owner of such exhibit or exhibits shall immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Society's Grounds.

All male exhibits of cattle over the age of 12 months shall be rung through the nose, and when on parade or going to and from the parade shall be led by such ring. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of £2 for every infringement of this regulation.

Exhibitors of cattle are not permitted to allow persons to ride on the backs of their exhibits. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of £2 for any infringement of this regulation.

If, in the opinion of the Secretary, exhibits in this Section be deemed to be deformed, the owner or owners of such exhibit or exhibits shall, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Show Grounds.

All Cattle exhibits must be safely secured in the stalls allotted to them. Exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage caused through neglect of this regulation.

Exhibits of Cattle which, in the opinion of the Society, ARE NOT IN REASONABLE SHOW CONDITION shall be removed from the grounds and shall not be eligible to be offered for sale on the Show Grounds.

OVERALLS FOR STOCK ATTENDANTS.

Attendants leading stock, when being judged and on parade, must wear uniform coats, to be secured from the Society.



JUDGING ARRANGEMENTS.

The steers are to be weighed alive on the day previous to judging and the live weights handed to the judge. In the first place, the steers are to be judged alive (by the Red Poll judge, in the Red Poll ring). on the lines of breed characteristics and suitability for the beef trade. A maximum number of 40 points can be awarded to exhibits when alive.

The steers are to be sold by auction at the Show Grounds on behalf of exhibitor, and on Tuesday, 22nd September, they will be slaughtered in the presence of the judge (a butcher), weighed for dead weight, and judged on appearance, when dressed, for color, quality and value of meat, hide and offal. The maximum number of points which can be awarded for the dead carcase, hide and offal is 60. The live weight is also to be furnished to the carcase judge, who has power to have the carcase cut as he wishes, in order to arrive at a correct judgment. The prizes are to be awarded to the exhibits that gain most points in the two judgings, and are the property of the exhibitors who enter the steers, and not of the purchasers.

After the final awards are made, the meat must be placed on exhibition for two days at butchers' shops within a radius of six miles from Melbourne G.P.O., due notice of days and place to be given to the public.
