

Cost of Mental Illness in County Jails

- Counties spend **two to three times** as much on adults with mental health issues as those without. This is due to:
 - Longer length of stay
 - Higher recidivism rates
 - Amount of care, including both officers' time and medication
 - Medication costs for inmates is shouldered by the County.
- Nationally, one-third of all county jail populations have mental health issues.
 - This equates to roughly 2 million people each year.
 - Of this jail population with mental health issues, 75% have co-occurring substance abuse.
