




- To reserve a guided tour for groups of 70 or fewer, please call (601) 359-3114 or email tours@house.ms.gov.


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MISSISSIPPI'S LEGISLATIVE PROCESS

SENATE BILL NO. 2024

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-105-305, MIS ISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE COUNTY BOARDS OF SUPERVISORS THE DISCRETION TO DETERMINE THE INTERVAL OF TIME FOR PROVIDING NOTICE TO FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS OF THE OPENING OF THE BIDDING PROCESS FOR SERVING AS DEPOSITORIES OF COUNTY FUNDS; TO CLARIFY THAT THE SELECTION OF DEPOSITORIES IS TO BE BASED UPON ALL RY EVANT FACTORS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1. Section 27-105-3 5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

amended as follows: 27-105-305. The board of supervisors at the regular December 11 1997 meeting, and annually thereafter or, in the discretion of the board of supervisors, * * * thereafter at such other interval of time as determined by the board of supervisors, but no less frequently than every four (4) years, shall give notice to all financial institutions in its county whose accounts are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (or any successor thereto), by publication, that bids will be received from
