Hyland Guard™ Mountain Pine *Pinus uncinata* 'GuarDak'


Species – Typical Resembling *Pinus mugo* with single forming a broad upright or oval form.

30 to 40' by 10 to 20'

Hyland Guard™ is upright columnar form (left), typical species (right)

- A unique upright narrow pyramidal evergreen conifer that will reach a mature height that is taller than the currently available upright Mugo pine (*Pinus mugo*) cultivars. It originated from a population of *Pinus uncinata* collected from the Hrubý Jeseník mountain range of Eastern Sudetes in the northern Moravia region near the village of Rejvíz of the Czech Republic.
- Excellent choice for a taller vertical evergreen accent.
- Resistant to needle-burn.
- Seed was obtained in 1972, 50 years ago!

North Pole® Arborvitae
Thuja occidentalis 'Art Boe' USPP 22,174

- Columnar selection of 'Wintergreen'
 - 15 by 5'
 - More narrow form than Emerald Green.
- Excellent hardiness and retains its dark green winter foliage color
 - Zone 3
- Selected by Art Boe of Faribault, MN
- Resistant to winter burn
- Tolernant of wet soil,
- Not tolerant of drought or deer

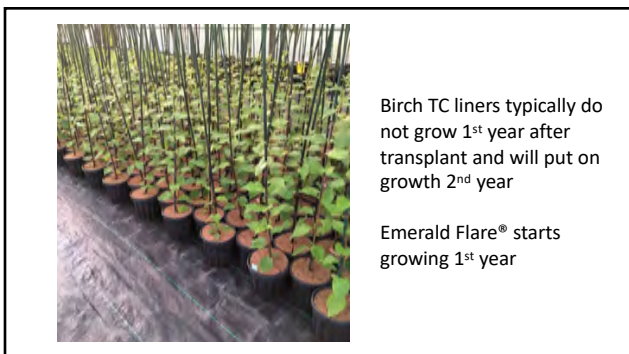

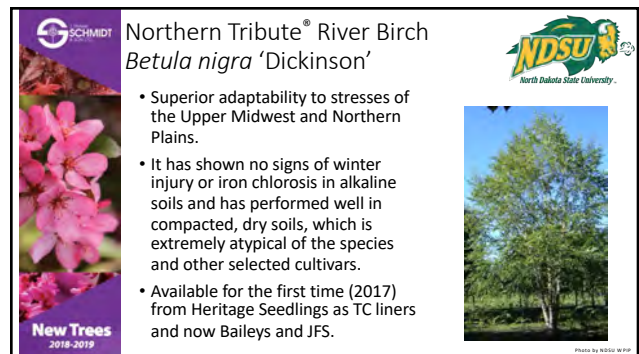

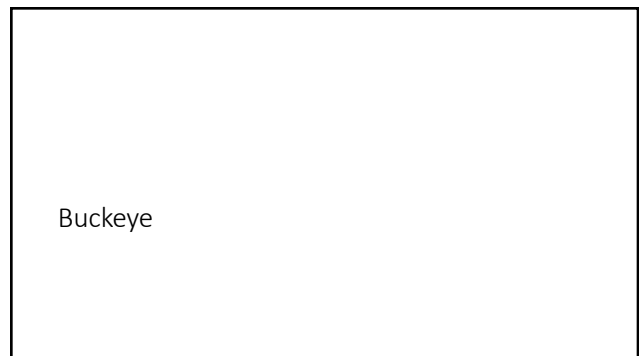

Lavaburst® Buckeye
Aesculus glabra 'LavaDak'

- First buckeye selection based on form.
 - Narrow upright northern hardy Ohio buckeye selection.
- Mature size: 8 x 3.5 m (26 x 12')
- Shorter internode growth than typical for the species.
- Foliage shows greater resistance to leaf scorch.
- Available 2023 - Heritage Seedlings and Liners

- Medium size tree
- 35 x 35'
- Typical rounded buckeye form.
- Part shade tolerant

Skinny Latte™ Coffeetree
Gymnocladus dioicus 'Morton'

- Native
- Zone 4
- 50' by 18'
- Seedless (male)
- Stiffly upright structural branches ascend vertically to form a remarkably narrow canopy and unique winter silhouette.
- Originating from a seedling acquired by the Morton Arboretum in 1958
- Unique selection is an introduction of Chicagoland Grows®.

Snow Crystal™ Crabapple
Malus 'JFS KW218MX'

- Zone 4
- 15' x 12'
- Distinctively compact, pyramidal form
- Bright white flowers smother the branches of this densely branched, symmetrical tree in spring.
- Yellow to golden orange fruits take the four-season show into the winter months

Greenstone® Elm
Ulmus davidiana 'JFS KW2UD'

- Zone 4
- 60 x 40'
- DED tolerant
- Doing very well at NDSU Research Arboretum
- Vigorous grower has proven to be the top performer among trees grown from seed collected at the northern edge of its native range in China.
- Its strong branches with open angles develop into an upright vase shape resembling that of the classic American elm.



Symatree™ Maple
Acer saccharinum 'JFS H1'

- A standout seedling, grown from seed collected from a witch's broom,
- Selected by Dr. William Hoch of the University of Wisconsin
- Uniquely compact growth habit and excellent branch structure that forms a remarkably symmetrical, upright oval tree.
- Neither flowers nor seeds have been observed during 20 years of observation

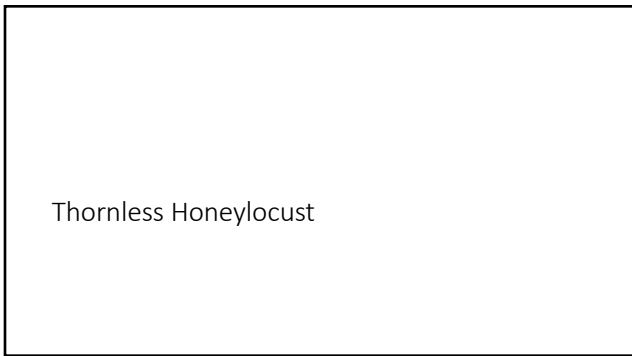

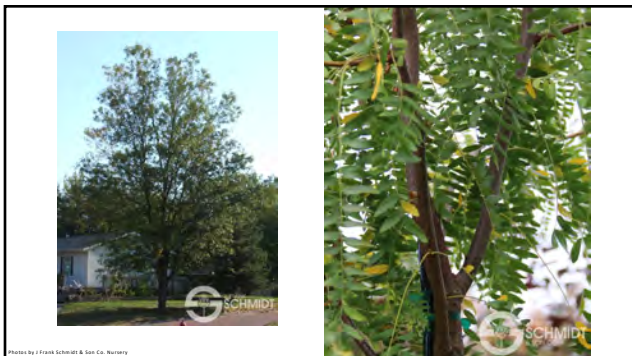

Gleditsia triacanthos 'JFS GMorgenson1'

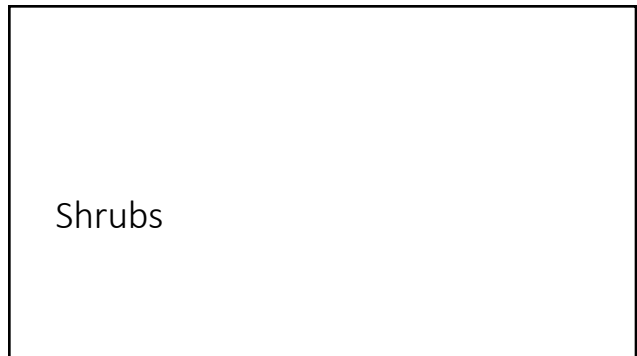
- Zone 4
- 45 by 25'
- Narrowly upright growth habit
 - Storm resistant
 - Great fit for street tree plantings where branches must be pruned up for traffic clearance.
- Found in South Dakota by plantsman Greg Morgenson, the parent has never been observed to have suffered ice or snow damage.
- Seedless, although JFS will not claim of its being seedless under all growing conditions.

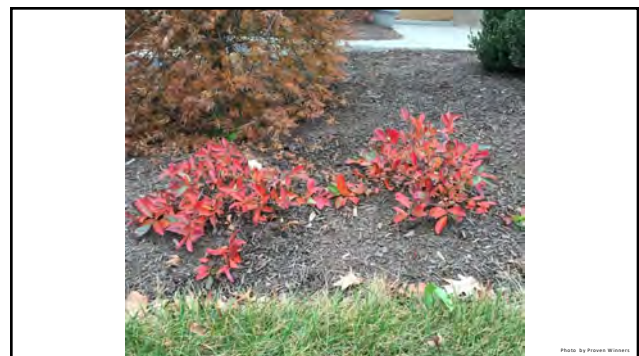

- Not Ground Hog
- Native
- 3 to 5' by 2 to 3'
- Glossy green foliage and white flowers in spring
- Red fall foliage with dark purple berries in fall
- Deer resistant
- Rain garden friendly (dry and wet)

- Native
- 3 to 54' by 3 to 4'
- Heaviest bloomer
- Heaviest fruit set
- Deer resistant
- Rain garden friendly (dry and wet)



Berry White Panicle Hydrangea
Hydrangea paniculata 'Renba' PP28,509

- 6 to 7' by 4 to 5'
- Zone 3
- Full sun to part shade
- Strong, upright stems and large cone-shaped flower panicles that stay upright.
- Starts out white in July then progresses to dark pink.
- Coloring occurs from the bottom and progresses to the top of the panicle
- First Editions

Little Lime Punch™ Panicle Hydrangea
Hydrangea paniculata 'SMNHPH'

- Zone 3
- Full sun/part shade
- 3 to 5' by 3 to 5'
- Similar to Little Lime® hydrangea with its useful, compact stature and emerging lime-green blooms, but it differs as the flowers age to pink.

Puffer Fish™ Panicle Hydrangea
Hydrangea paniculata 'NCHP1'

- Zone 3
- 3 to 5 by 3 to 5'
- Think of Puffer Fish™ panicle hydrangea (*H. paniculata*) as a larger, more puffed-up Bobo®, with fluffy white blooms that engulf the entire plant, nearly obscuring the foliage.
- The flowers open and mature to a pure white.
- As the blooms age, they turn lime green and, for a bit of surprise, a fresh sprig of white flowers emerges from the tip of the panicle

Pinktini™ Preston Lilac
Syringa × prestoniae 'Jeffin'

- More compact, tidier version of the classic 'Miss Canada' (10 x 8') lilac.
- Rich pink flowers bloom in late spring
- Introduced by Jeffries Nursery (Manitoba)
- Zone 2
- 4 to 5' tall and w to 4' wide
- New for 2020



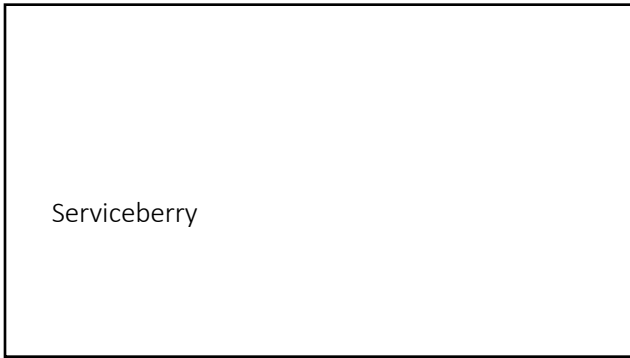

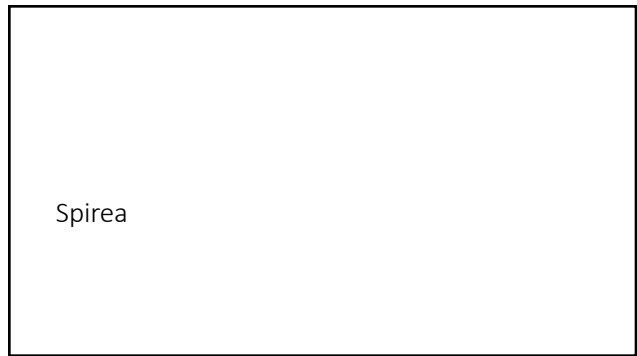
Standing Ovation™ Serviceberry

- Narrowly upright form of this North
- Good fit for tight spaces and a good candidate for hedging.
- Ediscaping
 - profuse crop of small white flowers
 - small, edible, tasty fruits - if the birds don't beat you to it.
- Red to orange fall color

Double Play® Candy Corn® Spirea
Spiraea japonica 'NCSX1' PP #28,313

- Zone 4
- 2' by 3'
- Part shade tolerant
- New growth emerges bright candy apple red.
- As it matures, it turns pineapple yellow, and the new growth continues to emerge bright orange all season.
- Dark purple flowers in late spring/early summer,

Pink Sparkler™ Birchleaf Spirea
Spiraea betulifolia 'COURISPI01' PP27,933

- 4' by 4'
- Zone 3
- Full sun, part shade
- Blooms large round pink flower-heads at the tips of its stems in early spring.
- Reblooms in fall with smaller blushing flowers that appear all up and down the stems at the leaf axis.
- Burgundy fall foliage.
