

Tiny Cryptantha (Cryptantha minima)

Borage Family (Boraginaceae)
National Status: THREATENED
Provincial Status: THREATENED



Identification

- Annual up to 20 cm tall (often much shorter) and bristly on all parts
- Few basal leaves, 5-15 mm long and spatula-shaped
- · Leaf-like bracts under each flower
- · Whitish line (nerve) on sepals
- · Tiny, white flowers with a yellow centre
- Seeds are 4 nutlets in a cluster (3 small and rough, 1 large and smooth)



Habitat

• Dry, sandy prairie, such as valley/coulee slopes or uplands



Look-alike species

- Kelsey's Cryptanthe (Cryptantha kelseyana)
- Clustered Oreocarya (Cryptantha celosioides)
- Fendler's Cryptanthe (Cryptantha fendleri)
- Snake River Cat's-eye (Cryptantha spiculifera)



Info & Distribution

- · Blooms May-June
- Known sites occur near the South Saskatchewan River where it flows into Saskatchewan





Threats

- Cultivation
- · Oil and gas activities
- · Sand and gravel removal
- · Lack of grazing and/or fire
- Invasion by alien species
- Altered natural processes (water cycle)



Best Management Practices

- Native prairie conservation
- · Invasive species monitoring and control
- · Continued grazing of prairie
- Continued monitoring and adaptive management
- Maintenance or enhancement of sand prairie habitat
- Control of woody encroachment
