ACCOMMODATION REVIEW (ST. IGNATIUS CATHOLIC SCHOOL AND ST. PAUL CATHOLIC SCHOOL) – ENROLMENT PROJECTIONS REPORT

BACKGROUND:

At the Regular Board Meeting on April 27, 2004 the following motion was approved:

Motion: O-063-2004 (Linda Ward and Ross Daly) That the St. Clair Catholic District School Board approve the administrative recommendation to commence a Student Accommodation Review in September 2004 of the St. Ignatius (Bothwell), St. Paul (Thamesville) and St. Michael (Turnerville) Schools.

At the Regular Board Meeting of June 22, 2004 the following motion was approved:

Motion: O-095-2004 (Linda Ward and Mike Neuts) That the St. Clair Catholic District School Board, based on community response, remove St. Michael, Turnerville from the consolidation process that will begin September 2004.

A map of the boundary areas for St. Ignatius Catholic School, Bothwell and St. Paul Catholic School, Thamesville is attached for your reference (pages 4 and 5). The travel distance between these two schools is 14.0 km.

The St. Ignatius Catholic School boundary includes the Town of Bothwell and a portion of Zone Township. Students from the Township of Dawn-Euphemia also attend St. Ignatius Catholic School. The St. Paul Catholic School boundary includes the Town of Thamesville as well as portions of Camden, Zone and Howard Townships.

This report represents the first in a series of administrative reports related to the consolidation of St. Ignatius Catholic School in Bothwell and St. Paul Catholic School in Thamesville. This report has been prepared and is being presented to the Trustees in keeping with Board policy 7.4 which requires that when reviewing a school for potential consolidation or closure “*a report and analysis of the current year, prior 5 years and projected minimum 5 years enrolment of the school, including other Catholic schools in the local area that may be affected*” must be presented to the Board during the consultation period (pages 6 and 7).

The following definitions are provided for reference and clarification throughout all reports:

FTE is the **full-time equivalent enrolment**, which is the count of students based on the percentage of time they attend school. A pupil enrolled in junior kindergarten or kindergarten is therefore counted as .5. Ministry grant calculations and the assignment of staff to schools are based on the FTE enrolment.

Student Progression Rate is the ratio of students enrolled in the current grade to enrolment in the previous grade.

The following three statistical reports have been included to validate the population projections for future junior kindergarten enrolment:

1. School Board Population Report – Chatham-Kent Municipality (Appendix 1)

This report is from the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation and was last updated September 16, 2004. A steady decline is notable in the number of children in each school-age group with no apparent stabilization, which suggests a continued decline in enrolment.

2. Ontario Population Projections – Municipality of Chatham-Kent (Appendix 2)

These projections are developed by the Ministry of Finance using data from the 1996 Census; updated in July 1999 using the postcensal estimate. The forecast scenario provided is the medium or *reference scenario* which is considered “most likely” and is recommended for long-term planning purposes. This scenario combines a slightly increasing fertility level, a moderate decline in mortality and a quasi-constant migration level.

The age group 0-4 for the Municipality of Chatham-Kent continues to drop each year until 2005, when it starts to increase slightly again. Although the 0-4 age group begins to increase in 2005, the elementary school age group (5-14) continues to decline until 2014.

3. Record of Baptisms (Appendix 3)

A record of baptisms per year has been included for St. Ignatius Parish, Bothwell and St. Paul Parish, Thamesville for the years 1991-2003. We have also included the number of junior kindergarten registrations at Bothwell and Thamesville Catholic schools for corresponding birth years. On average, the junior kindergarten registration is about 52% of the number of baptisms in Bothwell, and 73% of the number of baptisms in Thamesville.

Using the average percentage of students who were baptized that will attend Catholic school in Bothwell and Thamesville, the data suggests that the enrolment for junior kindergarten will decline over the next three years.

In order to provide plausible enrolment forecasts, we have used a three-year average for the junior kindergarten enrolment projections. Although the supporting data suggests that the enrolment will decline, when studying schools for consolidation, numbers are projected using the high-range scenario to ensure available capacity.

A 4% progression rate has been applied to the enrolment projections for students moving from junior kindergarten to kindergarten. This is based on the average progression rate for the Board for students moving from junior kindergarten to kindergarten.

Enrolment for other grades is projected with no progression rates applied.

Currently there are a number of students attending each of the schools in the study area that are not in accordance with school boundaries. For purposes of enrolment projection, these students have been counted at the school they are currently attending.

The enrolment projections indicate that over the next five years enrolment at St. Ignatius Catholic School will decline from the current 62.5 FTE in 2004 to 55.5 FTE in 2009. At the same time, enrolment at St. Paul Catholic School is projected to increase from the current 99.5 in 2004 to 117.5 in 2009. The combined enrolment of these two schools is projected to increase by 11.0 FTE over this five-year period from a total of 162.0 FTE in 2004 to 173.0 FTE in 2009.

A number of other enrolment related issues will be addressed in future reports that will have a direct impact on the accommodation needs for these two school communities. They include:

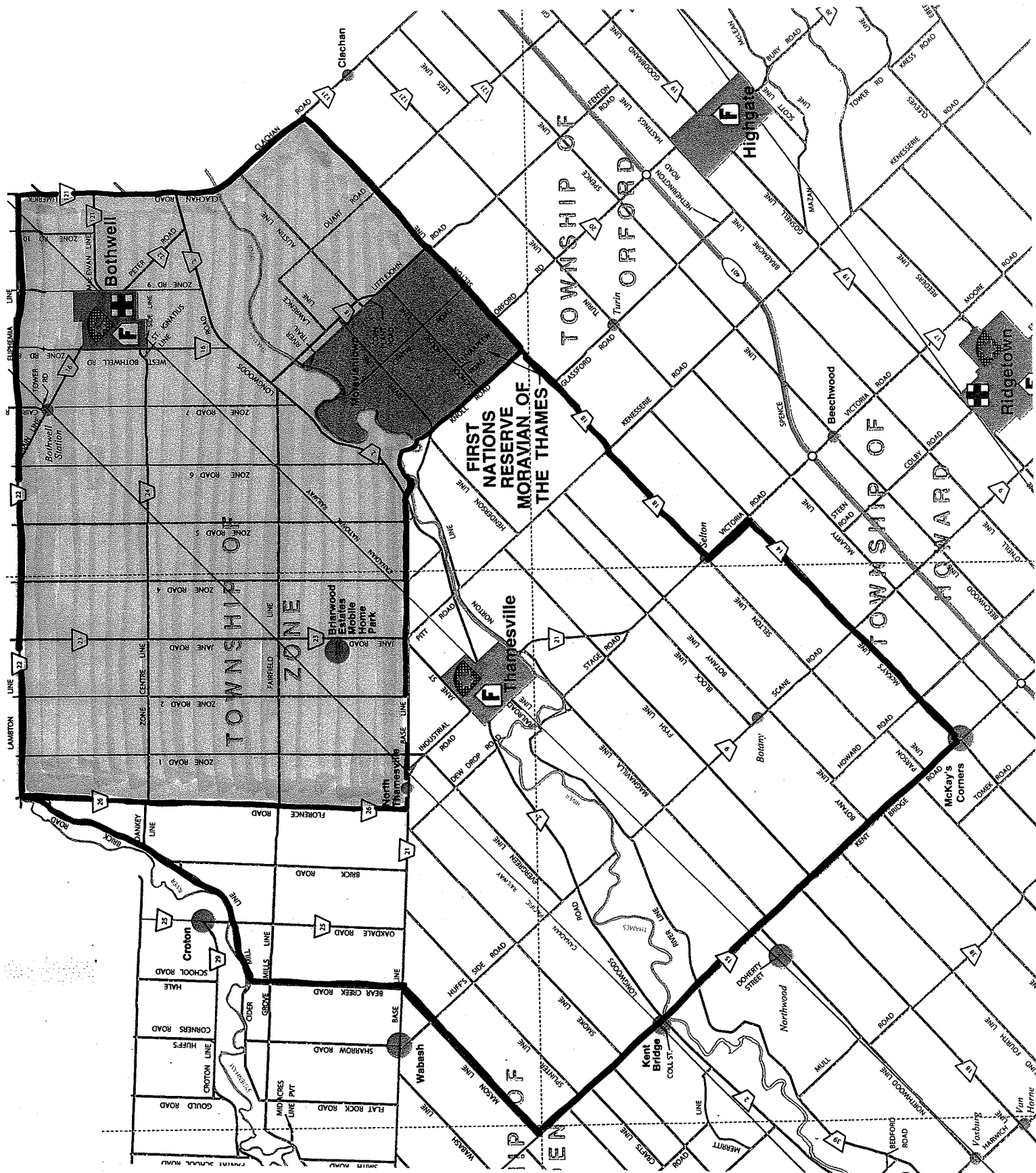
- Implementation of the Ministry's primary class-size initiative of 20:1
- Potential adjustments to school boundaries
- Facility requirements for the new school community
- Financial impact of consolidating two schools into a single facility

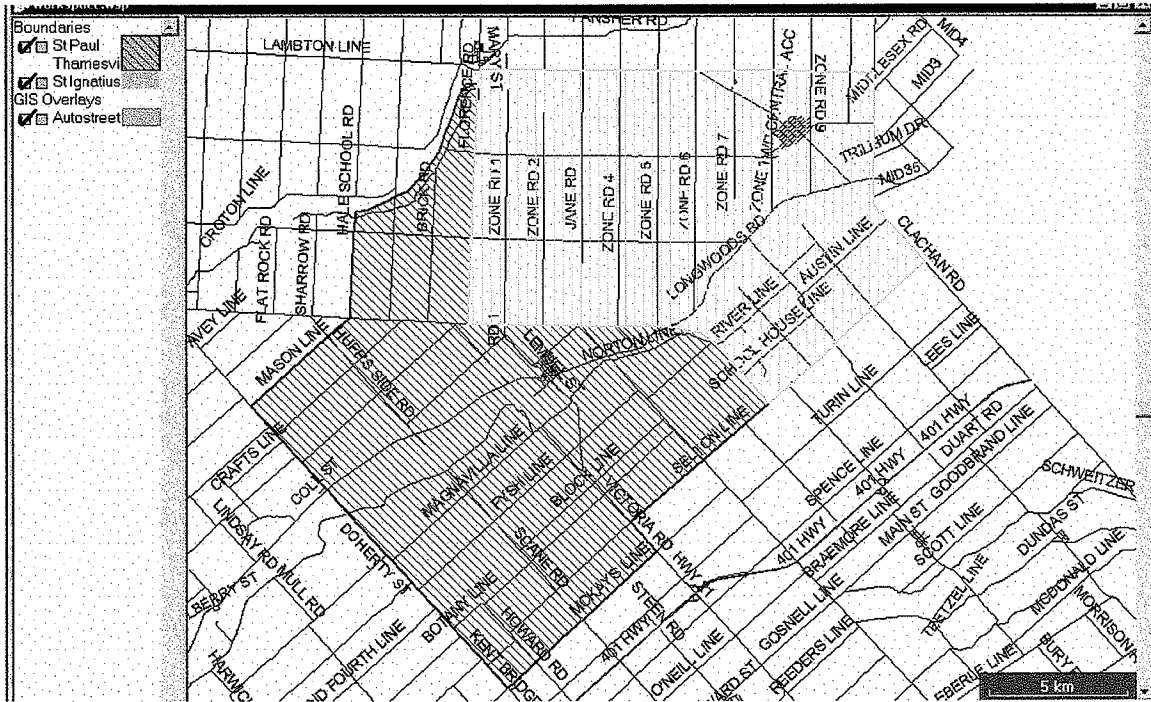
RECOMMENDATION:
