The Gala begins at **6:00 p.m.** on **March 5** in the **Randall L Jones Theatre** at SUU. Tickets not required.

Denise Purvis, Assistant Professor of Dance at Southern Utah University, is extremely supportive of this program. She explains, "This is an opportunity for high school dance programs throughout Utah to share their work with their peers and the community of Cedar City." These students come from Davis High School to Tuacahn High School and many in between. The UDEO High School Dance Festival affords them the chance to view work that they would not otherwise be able to experience.
