GENERAL PERMISSION GRANTED BY THE TREASURY FOR THE PURPOSES OF SECTION 22 (1) (d) OF THE EXCHANGE CONTROL ACT, 1947, 10 & 11 GEO. 6. C. 14.

Whereas by paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of section 22 of the Exchange Control Act, 1947, (hereinafter called "the Act") the exportation from the United Kingdom of gold is prohibited except with the permission of the Treasury:

And whereas by subsection (1) of section 37 of the Act any permission granted by the Treasury under the Act may be either General or Special:

Now, therefore, the Treasury, in pursuance of sections 22 and 37 of the Act, do hereby grant permission for the exportation from the United Kingdom of any gold, being gold the exportation of which is authorised by an individual licence granted by the Board of Trade for the purposes of any Order for the time being in force by them in pursuance of section 1 of the Import, Export and Customs Powers (Defence) Act, 1939 (2 & 3 Geo. 6. c. 69).

This Permission shall come into operation on the 12th day of February, 1951.
