A colt by the Unbridled out of Words of War (Lord at War {Arg}) brought a final bid of \$2.7 million to top

the second session of Fasig-Tipton's 2003 Saratoga Yearling Sales at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion vesterday, Consigned by Stone Farm and Stonerside Stable, with Stone Farm as agent, the bay was purchased by Padua Stables. Words of War, a multiple stakes winner of \$683,832, is the dam of E Dubai (Mr. Prospector), a MGSW of \$800,800, and Listed winner No Matter What (Nureyev), a \$425,000 KEEJUL yearling who captured the GI Del Mar Oaks. The underbidder was

B. Wayne Hughes. Satish Sanan shook hands with Hughes when the bidding ended, commenting, "You're tough." Hughes replied, "Not as tough as you." Asked about the colt, Sanan said, "He's a good one. Everything about him was good. This was one of the ones we wanted. We were going to get this colt. We thought he would bring about \$3 million, so there was gas left in the tank. We hope he is another Vindication. If he stays sound, he'll be the horse." He remarked that he hasn't yet decided on a trainer, but added, "We'll get him a home." Arthur Hancock, who bred yesterday's session topper, said, "[Tuesday] night, the highest price was \$1.1 million, so we weren't sure [what to expect]. You go in there and hope for the best. He is a lovely colt. I made the statement that this colt is right up there with Risen Star and Fusaichi Pegasus. He's got the attitude, the air, the pedigree and the physique of a real good horse. He does everything right. I believe he is going to be a real good horse. Now he's in good hands." Hancock bred Fusaichi Pegasus, who is making a splash with his first crop of yearlings. "We've got a couple of weanlings on the farm by him that look great," he said. "I think he's going to make a top stallion."

Hip 107 initially appeared to be an RNA, but after leaving the ring, was listed as purchased for \$1.9 million by trainer Patrick Biancone, who was acting as agent for three or four partners that included the colt's breeder, Virginia Payson. According to Terence Collier, Fasig-Tipton's director of marketing, the colt was purchased privately after departing from the ring. The halfbrother to 2002 juvenile champion Vindication was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency on behalf of Payson Stud Inc. "I thought the horse could bring \$2.5 to \$3 million," Duncan Taylor said, "but I think we did a disservice to Mrs. Payson. We got too high...because we had every person that you would want in the business on the horse. I think he is as good a looking as an A.P. Indy gets, and he's a 3/4 brother to a champion, so I think we just misjudged it." He added, "Mrs. Payson and Mr. Biancone had been talking earlier. I don't think the money he had together in his partnership could really come close to getting the horse, but we thought that didn't make a difference. Obviously we were wrong. Patrick talked to Mrs. Payson and they put a deal together. It happened so quickly...and Mrs. Payson did retain part of the horse."

Another Home Run for Fu Peg...

First-crop sire Fusaichi Pegasus had another big seller yesterday, with his colt out of a half-sister to champion Silverbulletday bringing \$900,000. "He has been pretty special from Day 1," said consignor Rick Littrell. "Not knowing how many Fu Pegs there would be at Keeneland in September, we thought we would beat the rush. We thought he would handle the trip from Kentucky--he has a great mind and he's very athletic."

Added buyer Jeanne Vance, "We were very happy to get him. He's just gorgeous, absolutely wonderful, and of course he's from a fine family. You just couldn't fault him." The colt will be sent to trainer Bill Mott.

Trainer John Ward Jr., who picked out Fusaichi Pegasus and broke the cantankerous colt, has been impressed by the offspring he has seen so far. "We have only seen four or five of them, but they look good," he said. "Only time will tell what crosses do best with him." He added that while the yearlings he has seen to date do not resemble their sire, "We've only seen the tip of the iceberg so far with him."

The chestnut, named Firebaby, has been through the ring once before, bringing \$215,000 at the 2003 Keeneland January Sale. The buyer was Josham Farms Ltd. "She's a very pretty filly with a lot of quality," Denali's Craig Bandorfoff, the consignor in January and again tonight, said. "She's very correct. She was a pretty filly [in January] and she's still a pretty filly. All she has done is grown up a little and filled out and lost her winter coat."

Hip 154, c, Mr. Greeley--Brighter Than Gold, by Light Idea Consigned by Blackburn Farm (Michael T. Barnett), agent Bred by Sabine Stable (KY).

The bidding for Brighter Than Gold reached only \$15,000 at the 1998 Keeneland November Sale and the mare, in foal to Mr. Greeley, was RNA'ed. She found herself in the ring again for the OBS Winter Sale, this time attracting a bid of \$40,000 from Sabine Stable. The foal she was carrying turned out to be none other than Nonsuch Bay, who, after selling for \$75,000 as an OBSMAR juvenile, went on to win the 2002 Gl Mother Goose S. and GII Nassau County Breeders' Cup S. After running third in the GI Go For Wand H. at Saratoga July 27, the four-year-old's earnings now stand at \$567,688. Brighter Than Gold was back at Keeneland November last fall, going to B. Wayne Hughes for \$260,000 while in foal to Hennessy.

The first to sell brought \$800,000 at Fasig-Tipton in July; there were two sold on opening night at Saratoga, with a filly bringing \$700,000 and a colt attracting a final bid of \$500,000; and another brought \$900,000 last night. The 2000 Kentucky Derby winner stood for \$150,000 in his first season at stud.

<u>Hip 217</u>, f, <u>Forest Wildcat</u>--Hold to Fashion, by Hold Your Peace Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent XCI Bred by Blair E. Minnich (PA).

This yearling should attract some attention after the exploits of her half-brother Peace Rules (Jules) over the weekend. Peace Rules, himself a modest \$35,000 OBSMAR purchase, took the field from gate to wire to win the \$1 million GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park, bringing his career earnings to \$1,859,990. But even before the colt was revealed to be one of the best of his generation, his dam, who went to a sextet of moderate stallions during her first seven years in the breeding shed, was given a chance to upgrade the pedigree, going to Forest Wildcat in 2001. The stallion stood for \$25,000 that season, but commanded a fee of \$60,000 this year. He has 17 stakes winners from his first four crops.

TRF HITS A HOME RUN

The Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation's annual gala in Saratoga Springs, NY, held Monday evening under a tent on the grounds of the Saratoga Golf & Polo Club, was highlighted by a pair of live auctions, first of selected stallion season options and, second, a collection of "unique experiences," which collectively raised over \$500,000 for the charity. A season option to leading handicapper Mineshaft, donated by Lane's End Farm, brought the top-priced bid of \$70,000 from Mike Freeman, while Team Valor purchased an option to breed to Coolmore's top freshman sire Fasliyev for \$25,000. An option to breed to WinStar Farm's Distorted Humor, sire of Kentucky Derby winner Funny Cide, was purchased for \$30,000 by Satish Sanan's Padua Stables. A late entry to the auction was the option to breed to Eclipse Award winner Vindication, graciously donated on the spot by the Padua Stables.

"We made an impromptu decision to donate the season," he explained. "I tried to call [Hill 'n' Dale Farm's John Sikura], but I couldn't get him on the phone. But John's a great guy and we knew that he'd support the decision." Sanan also successfully bid to have a horse of his choice painted by renowned equine artist Leslie Priggen. "I bought that because I thought that I could for Vindication to be painted and give it to John to hang in his office." Sanan and his family are ardent supporters of the TRF and its mission. "My family is very passionate about horses and my wife is sensitive to the way that horses are treated after they're done racing," Sanan said. "When you take something out of the game, you like to give something back." Among the experiences, the top price of \$32,000 was paid by Kurt Butenhoff for a trip to next year's Dubai World Cup. Following the bidding, the crowd was invited to the dance floor and was treated to a surprise performance by Johnny Flamengo, a.k.a. David Cassidy. TRF President John Stuart said of the evening, "I think it's clear that there is a growing awareness of the good story of the TRF for racing when it could be a bad story."


