# Training to Strengthen Civil Society Capacity on the United Nations Convention against Corruption (UNCAC) and its Review Mechanism

#### Brasilia, Brazil, 6 November 2012

Partnering with the civil society in the fight against corruption is crucial in preventing and fighting this global scourge. This application form targets Civil Society Organizations (CSO) working on good governance and transparency that wishes to be trained on UNCAC and its review mechanism. If your organization corresponds to the following criteria and requires financial support to develop knowledge and skills on ways to actively work with governments and the private sector on anti-corruption activities, please fill out this application form providing you meet the below requirements.

### 1) Criteria for CSO selection:

- CSO from Central or South America based in a country to be reviewed in the third or fourth year; preferably attending the 15<sup>th</sup> International Anti-Corruption Conference in Brasilia (on 7-10 November).
- 2) Experience of CSOs in conducting monitoring, legal analysis, report drafting, working with the private sector, advocacy, and the organization's potential to make useful contributions to the review process and follow up activities;
- 3) Members of the UNCAC Coalition;
- 4) Knowledge of Spanish or English.
- \* Other elements such as geographical balance across the continent, diverse ideological and professional backgrounds of the CSO, gender, ethnic and social diversity will also be considered in the final selection.
- 2) Only Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) can apply. CSOs are defined as not-for-profit organizations including Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs), community groups, trade unions, indigenous groups, charitable organizations, faith-based organizations, professional associations and foundations. Business is not included in this category.
- 3) In principle, please note that only one representative per CSO will receive funding to participate in the training. Exception may be made on a case by case basis.
