Be careful out there!

Whenever employees need respirators to perform their work, employers have the responsibility to implement a respiratory protection program.

Respiratory Use Guidelines:

Hazard Assessment: Perform an assessment of the hazards to determine respirator type. There are three basic classifications of respiratory hazards: oxygen-deficient air, particulate contaminants and gas and vapor contaminants.

- Medical Surveillance: Employees must never be assigned to any operations requiring respiratory protection until they receive a physical from WorkMed and deemed physically able to wear a respirator.
- Training: For proper use of any respiratory protection device, it is essential that the user be properly instructed in its selection, use and maintenance. Contact the Safety Manager for training.
- Fit Testing: Fit testing on your respirator type is required initially and <u>annually</u> thereafter.
