Dear Kiwanians:

I am going to tell you something, and I shall expect you to believe it--the price of lumber has not gone up in the same proportion as the prices of other building materials, such as steel and cement. In these days of altitudinous prices, that seems staggering, but it's true.

The price of lumber is just now about on a par with the price in 1913. Of course the war in 1914 knocked the price flat, and the recovery has been slow, so very slow. But old Doctor Car Shortage is now handling the patient, and they do say that the patient will be "up" soon. If any of you want to take advantage while he's still on his back, you'd better hasten.

Now if all this information I'm handing you is not supported by the law and the evidence, I'll call a witness to give expert testimony, and the first and only witness will be Edward Harmon Wean, of The Elliott-Wean Lumber Co. (All this by way of introduction.)

There's a farm up in Michigan which is pointed out by tourists as the place where E. H. Wean was born a number of Indian summers ago. He came to Toledo during the panic of '93, but that doesn't indicate that E. H. W. is at all panicky. No, on the other hand, he is never rattled, or fussed or excited about anything. If the Kaiser's battle fleet should suddenly steam up the old Maumee, if the Nicholas Building should start down Madison on stilts, if the sun should rise in the west, you'd never see a change of expression on the face of Ed Wean. He never gets excited, scared or angry. And if all men possessed such equilibrium, there'd be no panics in these free and untrammelled United States,-- financial or otherwise.

He is married and has two daughters in High School. He is a big man, as big mentally as he is physically, and you can judge for yourself how big that is when I say he weighs just forty-six thousand ounces avoirdupois. You know how many ounces there are in a pound--figure it out for yourself.
