
APHIDIUS

Aphidius are small wasps (0.08-0.12 in long) that parasitize aphids. They lay many eggs and complete their life cycle quickly. Some species are host-specific, so care must be taken to select the right species for the aphid present. Many species occur in the Northeast and enter greenhouses naturally.
