

Checklist for COHABITATION with an EU National (Except Belgian)

If you are a national of a third country outside the European Economic Area (EEA) and you are travelling to declare cohabitation with a (non-Belgian) European Union/EEA National

It is essential that your file contains the following:

You must lodge the original documents, plus two (2) photocopies of these documents. The originals will be returned to you.

Passport + copy

A valid passport:

- should have been issued within the previous 10 years;
- should be valid at least 3 months after the intended date of departure from the Schengen territory or, in the case of several visits, after the last intended date of departure;
- should contain at least 2 empty pages when applying for the visa.

Please provide one copy of the passport (the empty pages don't need to be copied)

Copy of ID

One copy of your Turkish identity card or of your residence permit (for foreigners).

Application form

Two (2) application forms fully filled in, signed (two times: at the point nr 37 AND on the last page!) and dated by the applicant.

This form is available free of charge from consulates. You complete it in French, Dutch, German or, you do not have a command of any of the national languages, ideally in English.

Any person appearing in your travel document must complete a separate application form. Minor children must submit an application form signed by a person with parental authority or by a legal guardian;

Photo

Three (3) recent (no more than 6-months old) passport size photographs (35x45) in color, preferably biometric type with white background, should be affixed to the application form.

Language Preference Form

The applicant has the opportunity to choose one of the Belgian three national languages in which the application will be treated.

If you choose to complete the application in English, please choose "no preference".

Proof of the permanent and stable character of the relationship (*1)

A history of the relationship and **proof of the permanent and stable character** of the relationship.

Age

Proof that both parties are aged over 21 (or over 18 if they cohabited for at least one year before the arrival in Belgium of the person applicant wants to join).

Celibacy

Proof that both parties are single.

Applicant

A **notarized** and **legalized** certificate of celibacy together with a translation OR

A **notarized** and **legalized** certificate of divorce together with a translation.

Future cohabitant in Belgium

Proof that the partner you are going to live with in Belgium is not married.

Proof of a valid travel insurance policy

The insurance must be valid throughout all of the Schengen countries and must cover the whole duration of the stay or transit. The minimum cover is EUR 30,000.

The insurance must cover the cost of repatriation on medical grounds, urgent medical treatment and/or urgent hospital treatment or costs incurred in the event of your death while in the Schengen area.

Applicant's Solvency

The documents indicating that you have <u>sufficient personal means of subsistence</u>, both for the duration of your stay on the SCHENGEN territory and for the transit to a third country in which your admission is guaranteed, **or** a <u>commitment that charge will be taken</u> (Annex 3 bis);

Copy of ID Card/residence permit of the person to be joined in Belgium

Solvency of the person to be joined and Health insurance

If the party being joined is residing in Belgium as a citizen of the European Union with sufficient resources of their own to be able to ensure that they do not become a burden on the Belgian social aid system during their stay and acceptable health insurance covering all risks (e.g. annuitant or person working outside the borders of Belgium), proof of such sufficient resources and of the holding of health insurance.

(*1) Proof of the permanent and stable character of the relationship:

- Have a child between the partners or
- Have lived together for at least 1 year in Belgium or another country or
- Know each other at least since 2 years (regular contact + 3 meetings of a total duration of 45 days).

The documents drawn up abroad in a language other than Dutch, French or German are to be translated in accordance with the original by a sworn translator. The translation must be legalized as a separate document in line with the procedure laid down in the country of origin, and then by the competent Belgian consulate or Embassy.

Applicants, who cannot enclose all documents from the list, should consider adding alternatives or making an explanation about the reason for not handing them in.

The applicant acknowledges that he has provided the documents here above marked as submitted and that he has been informed that some other documents might be requested by the Belgian Embassy / Consulate General.

Please note that our Consulate may in justified individual cases, request additional documents during the examination of an application which are not mentioned in the above harmonized list. The applicant is hereby informed that submitting the above-mentioned documents does not guarantee automatic issuance of a visa.
