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INTRODUCTION

The present Catalogue attempts to list all Recent Cephalopoda contained in the collections of the Royal Scottish Museum, together with a small number listed in the museum registers which cannot now be traced. The idea for this Catalogue arose in the course of an extensive revision of the cephalopod collections, when it was realised that much of the data in the old card index and catalogues was inadequate, that many specimens had been misidentified or not identified at all, and that a number of specimens mentioned in various publications had in fact never been registered.

The origin of the collections of the Natural History Department begins with the specimens accumulated by Edinburgh University into a museum for teaching purposes. An inventory of this material was drawn up in 1812 and additions were recorded annually thereafter. This marks the start of an uninterrupted series of registers continuing to the present day. Up till 1854 all this material was entirely in the charge of the University, though it was known as the Natural History Museum of Edinburgh and limited access to it could be obtained by the public. In 1855 this museum, housed in the Old College, together with the Industrial Museum of Scotland established the previous year, were transferred to the responsibility of the Department of Science and Art. Subsequently they were to come under the aegis of the Privy Council of the Committee on Education and were formally united in 1864 as the Edinburgh Museum of Science and Art. Since 1904 the museum has been known by its present name.

In 1865 transfer of the Natural History collections into the new building commenced and the doors were opened to the public in 1866. No record seems to have been kept of any specimens which were retained by the University for teaching purposes and it seems likely that much of the older material which had deteriorated was destroyed at this time. No consistent system of identifying individual specimens by the use of the register number had been operated, and these factors will account for some of the earliest material listed in the registers not now being evident in the collections. Even after this time the collections were regarded as being primarily for teaching and display rather than scientific reference purposes, and specimens withdrawn from the collections for exhibition tended to lose their individual data, and thus may continue to exist in the collections but cannot now be associated with their register number.

Although a "cuttlefish" is listed as early as 1824, there were few cephalopods, apart from the shells of *Nautilus* and *Argonauta*, added to the collections in the nineteenth century. In 1907 after the arrival in the museum of James Ritchie there seems to have been a deliberate policy of collecting cephalopods. Both Ritchie, and later A.C. Stephen, were particularly interested in the large Ommastrephidae and the giant squid *Architeuthis*, of which the collections contain a number of examples. Unfortunately much of the information on these important specimens has had to be patched together from careful detective work among the archives, as the data with the specimens was rudimentary.

Perhaps the most important series of cephalopods in the museum is that gathered together by A.C. Stephen from the material collected by the Fisheries Board for Scotland. This was not registered until 1958, although much of it was the basis of data published by Stephen in 1944. Much of the data with these specimens has been carefully checked back against the original ships' notebooks and other manuscripts housed in the Aberdeen Marine Laboratory, and in this way a number of errors in the museum registers and on specimen labels have been corrected. Another important though small collection is that of the Scottish National Antarctic Expedition, of which the cephalopods were recorded by Hoyle in 1912.

In the present Catalogue all specimens acquired by the museum up till the end of 1981 are listed in systematic sequence. The number given before the generic name is the biocode used in the museum for cataloguing purposes. Within any species the sequence of specimens is broadly geographical, arranged from north to south and from west to east, and the localities have been standardized in a descending hierarchical sequence, e.g. North Atlantic: North Sea: Firth of Forth: Isle of May. The latitude and longitude have been added in all cases where the locality data are sufficiently precise. The register number of each lot is given and if quoted elsewhere should always be prefixed by the museum code RSMNH. In the registers each collection acquired is numbered serially within the year, so the first registered in 1960 is numbered 1960.1 or, from 1977, in the form 1977001. Individual entries within the collection are separated from this number by a period, as 1960.1.24 or 1977001.24. In a few large collections where individual lots may be catalogued in any sequence over a long period of time a system of numbering has been

used for Mollusca embodying part of the biocode. Thus the number 1961.61.97318 is used for the eighteenth *Argonauta* registered from the A.E. Salisbury collection.

Specimens obtained during scientific investigations of the Aberdeen Marine Laboratory or its forerunners are labelled with Haul Numbers, which are station numbers assigned at sea. At first, simple numbers were used, but these were later modified to include a year code, e.g. 25/1094, and more recently the research vessel involved was also indicated, e.g. C78/681.

The authors gratefully acknowledge the help generously given by staff of the Aberdeen Marine Laboratory, and thank them for making available the unpublished original data relating to the scientific investigations.

REGISTERED SPECIMENS NOT FOUND

In addition to the specimens catalogued above there are a number of entries in the museum registers which cannot be matched with material now present in the collections. For the sake of completeness these are listed here. Some of the earliest are of a date prior to the transfer of the Edinburgh University museum collections and may therefore not have formed part of those collections which became the foundation of the Department of Natural History of the Royal Scottish Museum. Others are of a date when the collections were regarded as an educational rather than a reference tool, and may simply have been discarded if their condition had deteriorated or, more likely, may have become dissociated from their documentation when placed on display. Some of these apparently missing specimens may therefore be included under those subsequently registered which are noted in the above catalogue as having been found in the collections apparently unregistered. The arrangement of the present list is chronological within each species. In the absence of the material on which the identifications were based, the original taxonomy of the species has been maintained.

The Cephalopoda acquired by A.C. Stephen form the bulk of the collections of British material, and were mostly obtained by him during Scientific Investigations on FRS "Explorer" 1922-35. These specimens, together with material collected by Scott, Pearcey, Robson, and others during earlier investigations of the Fisheries Board for Scotland (1901-20), comprise the collection registered 1958.45. This collection was the basis of Stephen's paper on the Cephalopoda of Scottish and adjacent waters (1944). Many of the specimens referred to by Robson (1909, 1922), collected during the "Goldseeker" investigations, do not appear to have come to the Royal Scottish Museum, however, and indeed specimens obtained during the period when "Goldseeker" was operational seem to have been taken on cruises in fishing boats on short-term hire to the Board. Ships' notebooks and other archival materials concerning Stephen's work are housed in the Aberdeen Marine Laboratory, and have proved invaluable in checking the data available in the Royal Scottish Museum, revealing numerous minor errors. These data have now been rationalized with the assumption that, where there had been inconsistencies, the Haul numbers with the specimens were correct. A number of specimens, including some referred to by Stephen in his 1944 paper, were not registered, and have since been registered as 1978033.

Stephen's correspondence and related archival material relating to specimens of *Architeuthis* and *Ommastrephes* was valuable for adequately cataloguing that part of the collection as many specimens were unregistered and furnished with meagre data. See: Royal Scottish Museum.




